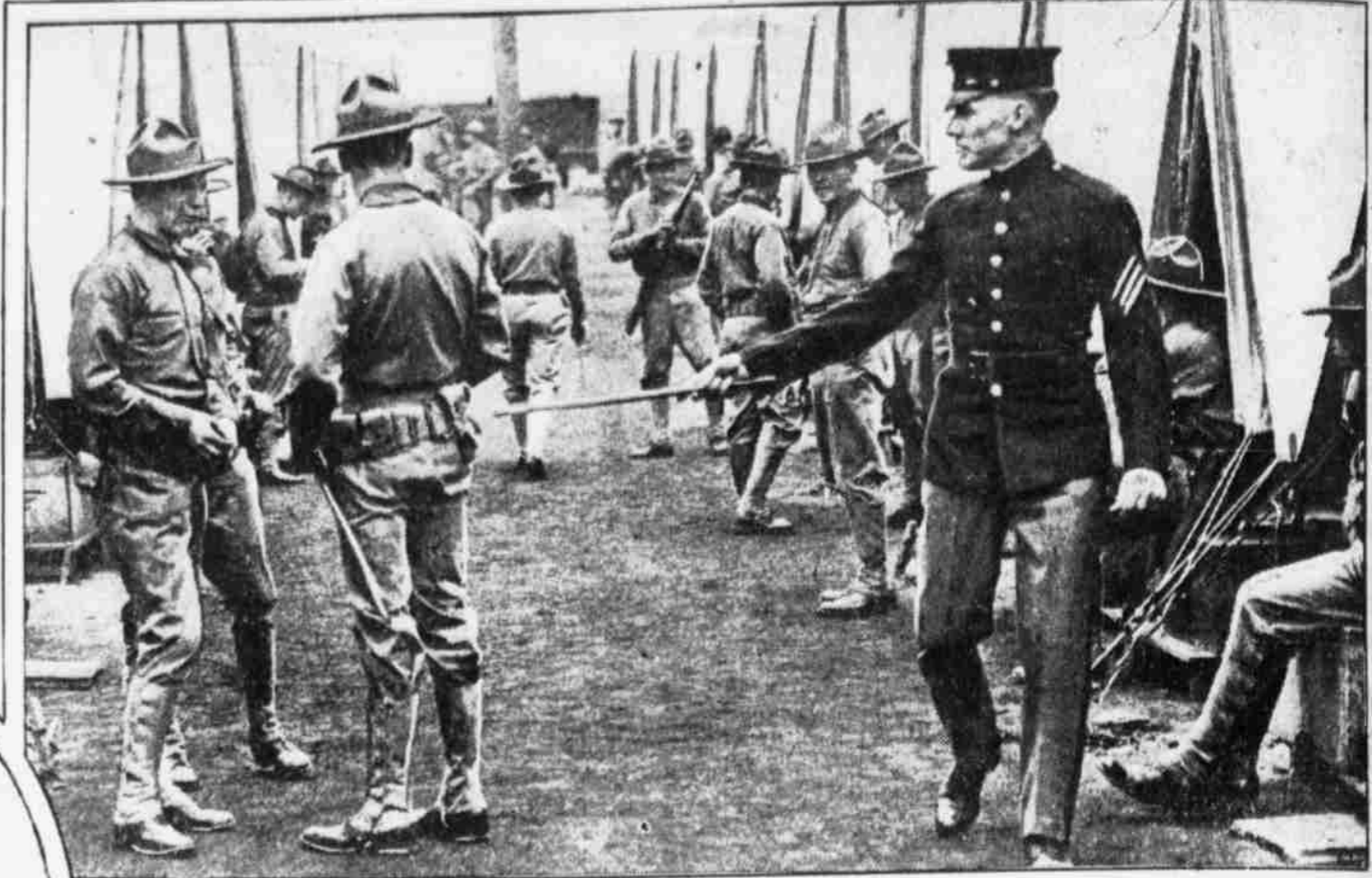

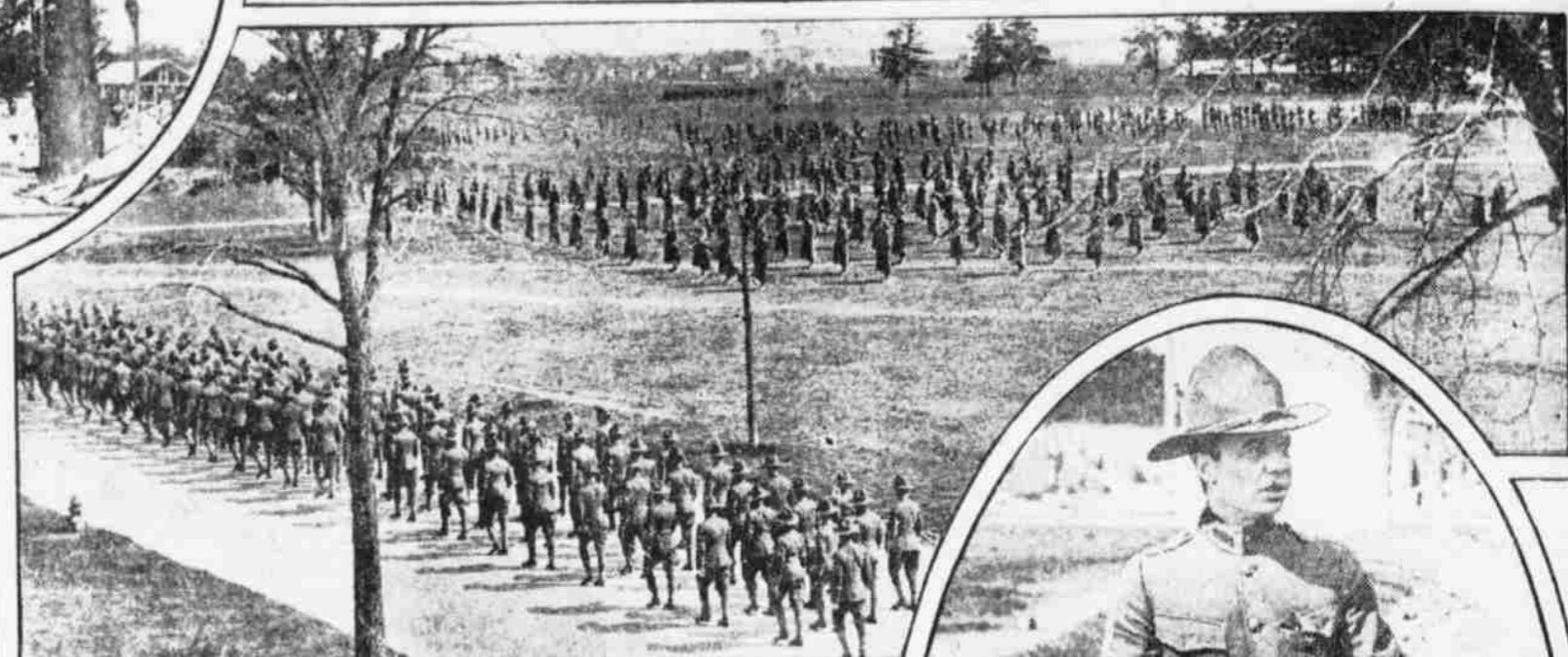

Marine corps recruits receiving their first lesson in individual field cooking at Port Royal, S. C.



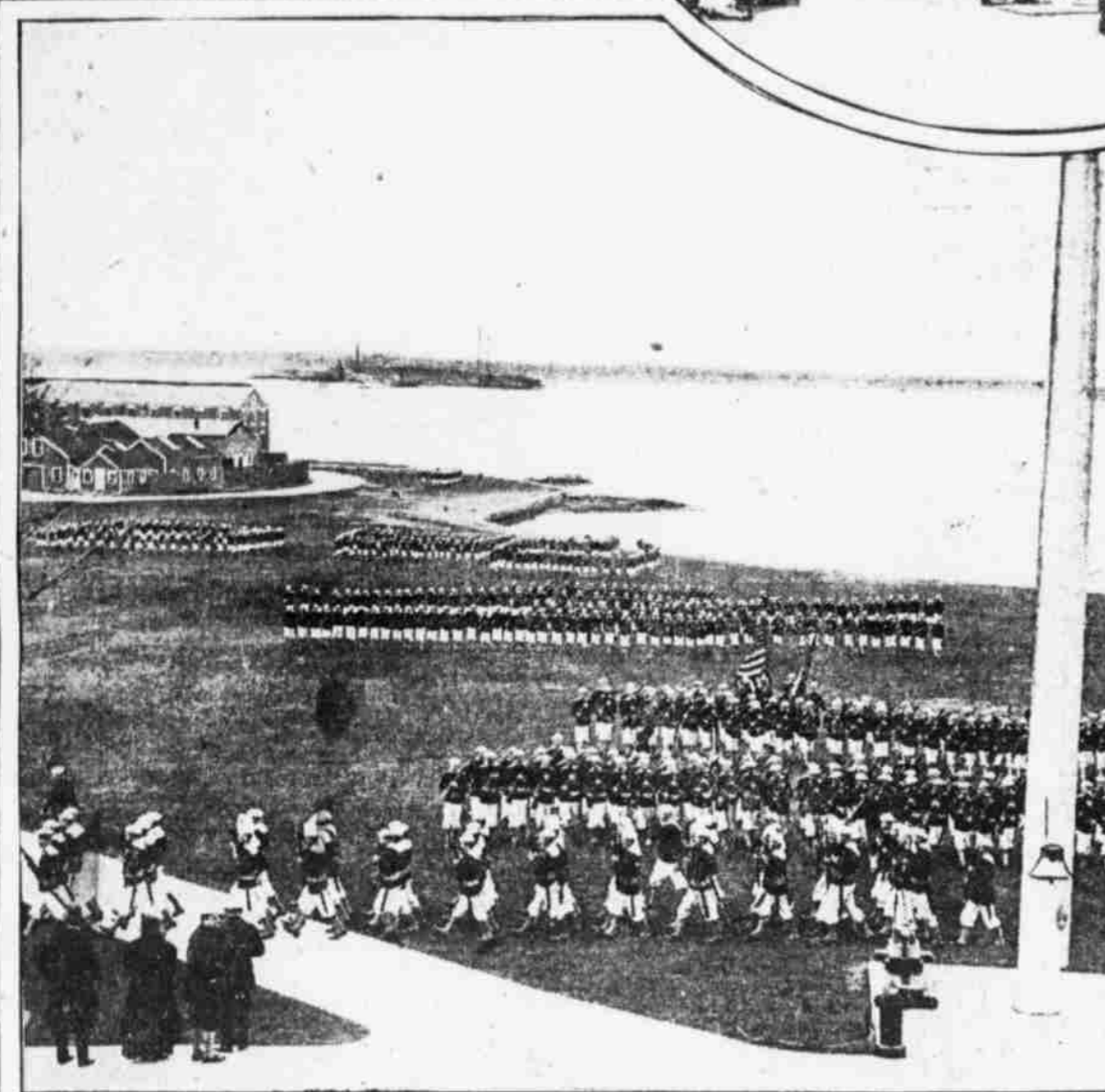

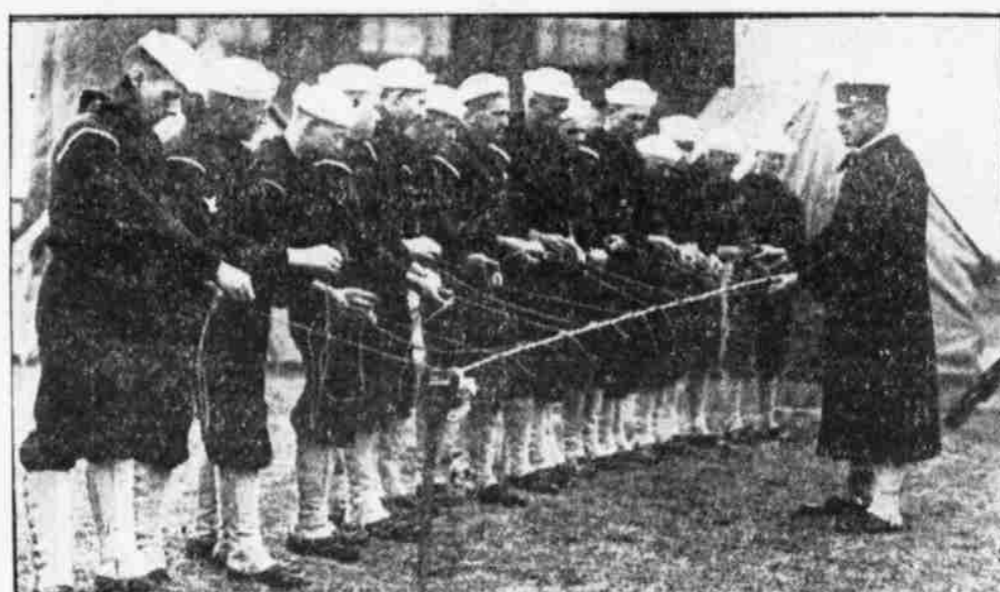
