

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS START RED CROSS WORK

Boys Make Labor-Saving Bandage Machines and Girls Surgical Dressings

High school pupils joined actively today in Red Cross activities. Boys of the Northeast High School began work in the school machine shop on 1500 power machines for rolling bandages. The machines will be installed in sectional Red Cross headquarters in the city. The girls of the William Penn, Kensington and West Philadelphia High schools start this afternoon making hundreds of hospital garments and sets of surgical dressings. Both the manufacture of bandage machines and the girls' work on dressings are parts of a plan worked out by the Philadelphia School Mobilization Section of Mayor Smith's Home Defense Committee.

Girls of all three high schools will give several hours a day after school to the making of hospital garments and surgical dressings. Their work is under the direction of Dr. Charles C. Hely, principal of the West Philadelphia High School.

The power machines to be built by the Northeast High School students turn out the two bandages in the time it takes to make one by hand. They can be attached to ordinary sewing machines by removing the top of the machine and substituting the bandage machine.

Besides installing the machines when they are completed in the Red Cross headquarters, officials will place one machine with each Red Cross unit called into service.

H. S. WILLIAMSON, OF LANCASTER, DEAD

Prominent Citizen Victim of Heart Disease—Gave Park to City

LANCASTER, Pa., May 21.—Henry S. Williamson, sixty-four years old, one of Lancaster's leading business men, died suddenly yesterday of heart disease. He was a director of the People's Trust Company and the Hamilton Watch Company, trustee of Franklin and Marshall College, the Shippen School and the Stevens Industrial School and Millersville State Normal School. He was the founder of the Lancaster Playgroup Association, donor of Williamson Park of seventy acres to the city and of the athletic field of a dozen acres to Franklin and Marshall College. He was a member of the Isalah Williamson, founder of the Williamson School.

TO USE PHILADELPHIAN'S YACHT FOR RECRUITING
