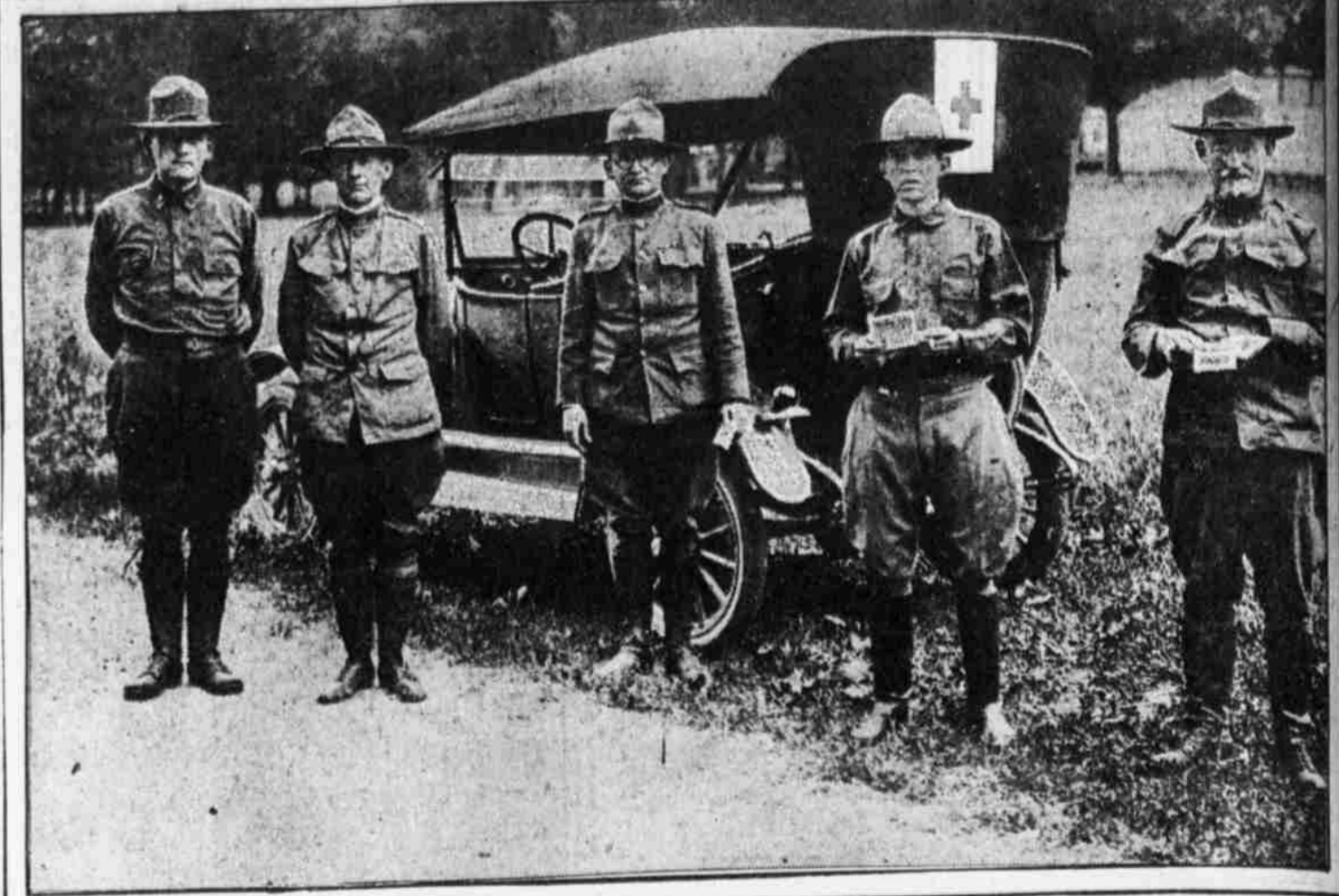


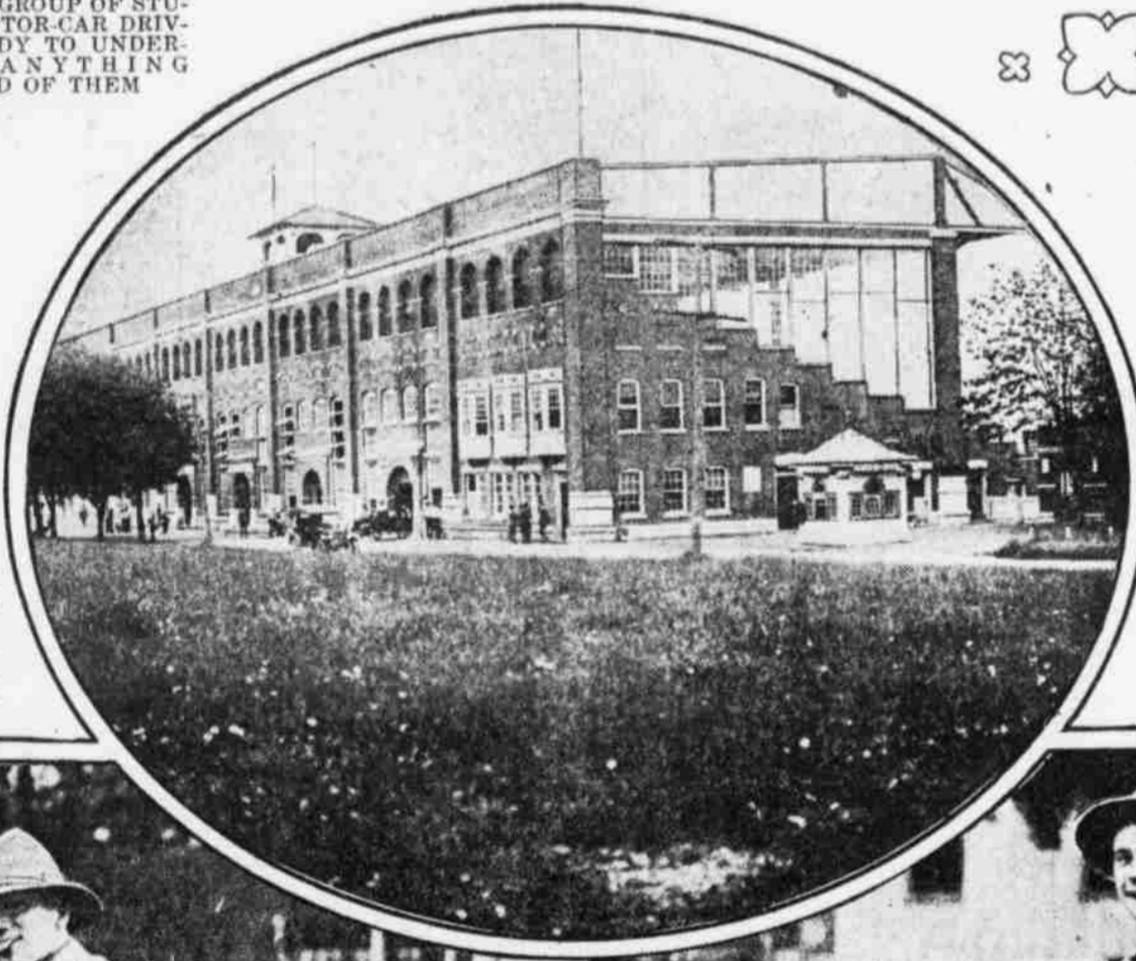

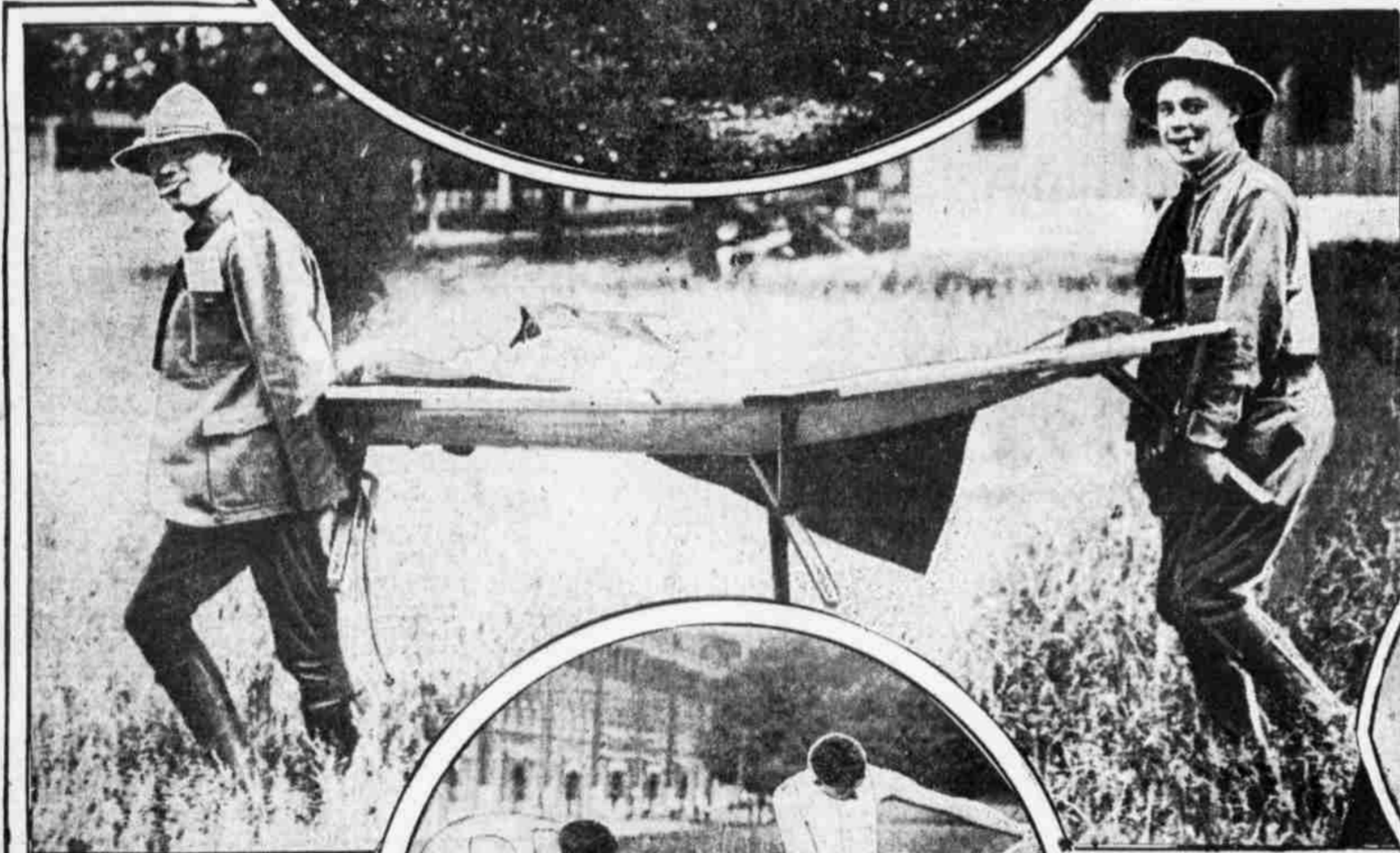
THE MEN WHO WILL WHIP THE NEW AMBULANCE UNITS INTO SHAPE

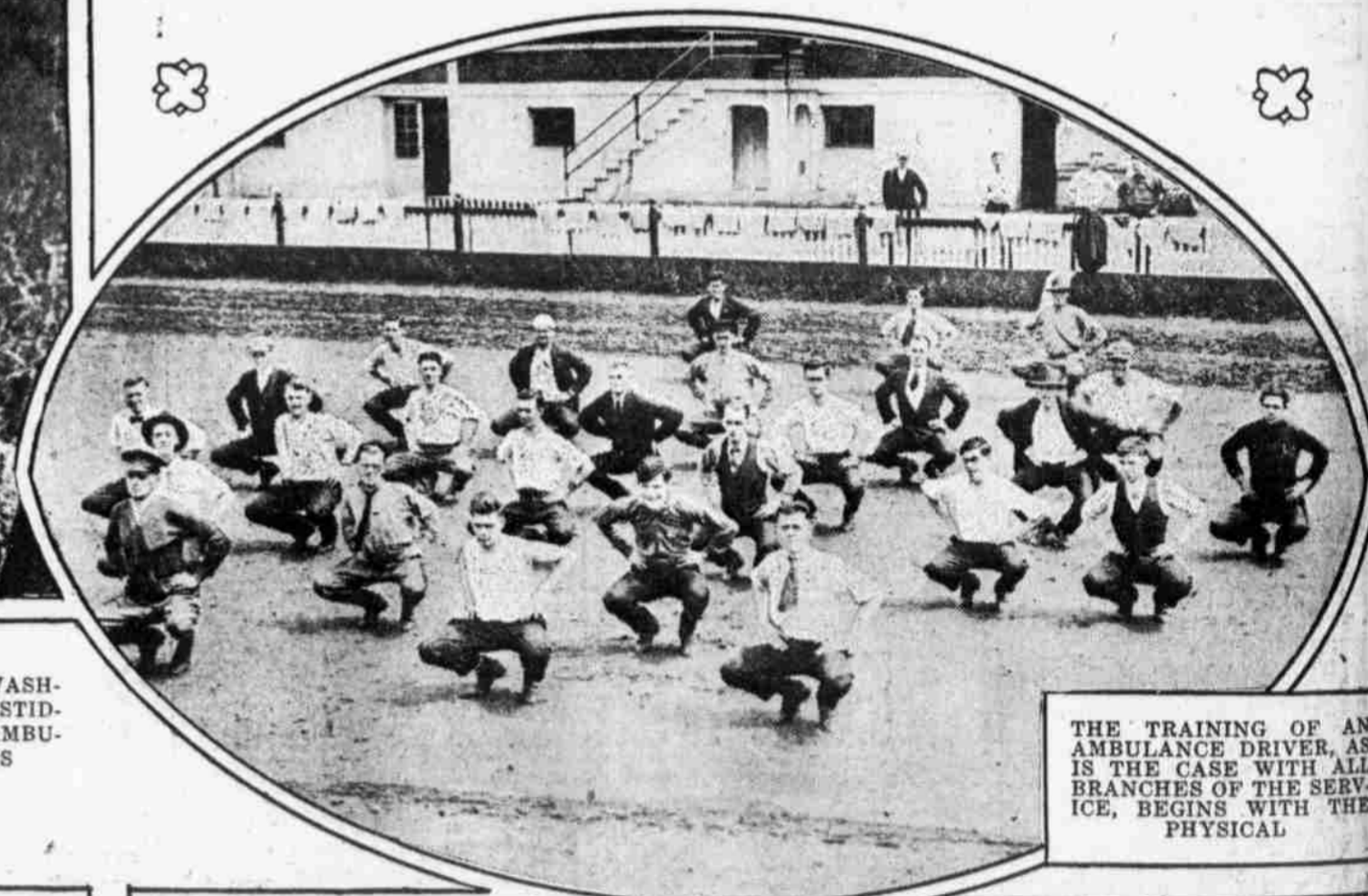
A COURSE IN RUNNING IS ESSENTIAL FOR THE FUTURE STRETCHER BEARERS



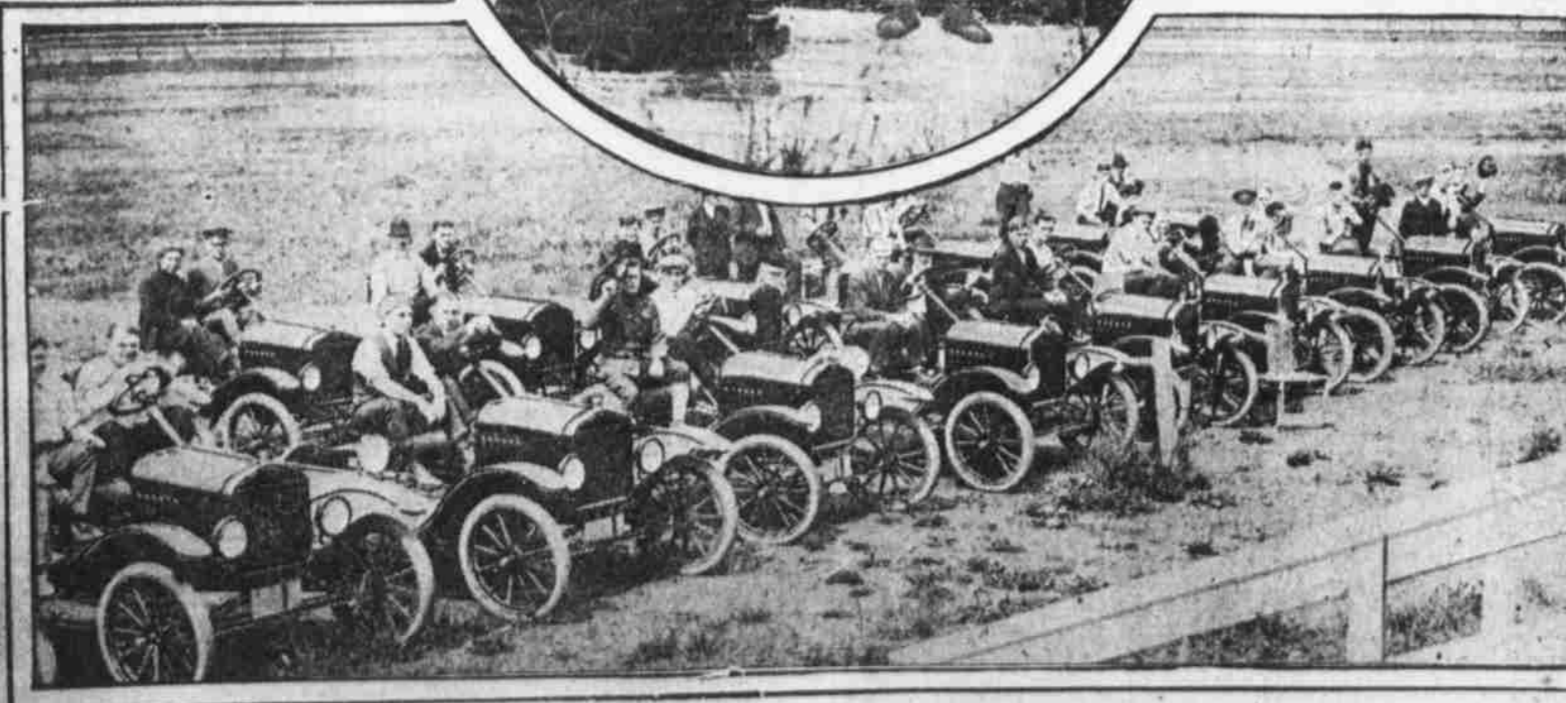
MANY OF THE YOUNG MEN WILL BE DE-TAILED TO THE HAZARDOUS DUTY OF STRETCHER BEARING



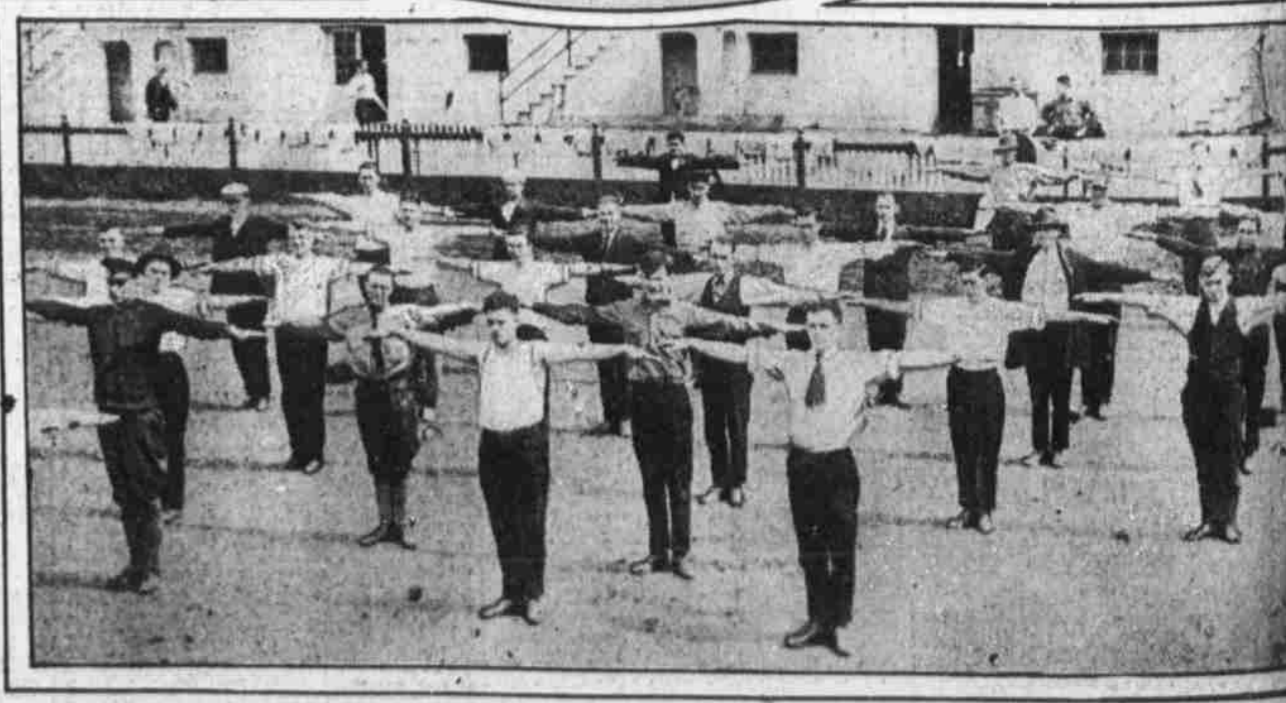
EVERY DAY IS WASH-DAY WITH THE FASTIDIOUS YOUNG AMBULANCE DRIVERS
