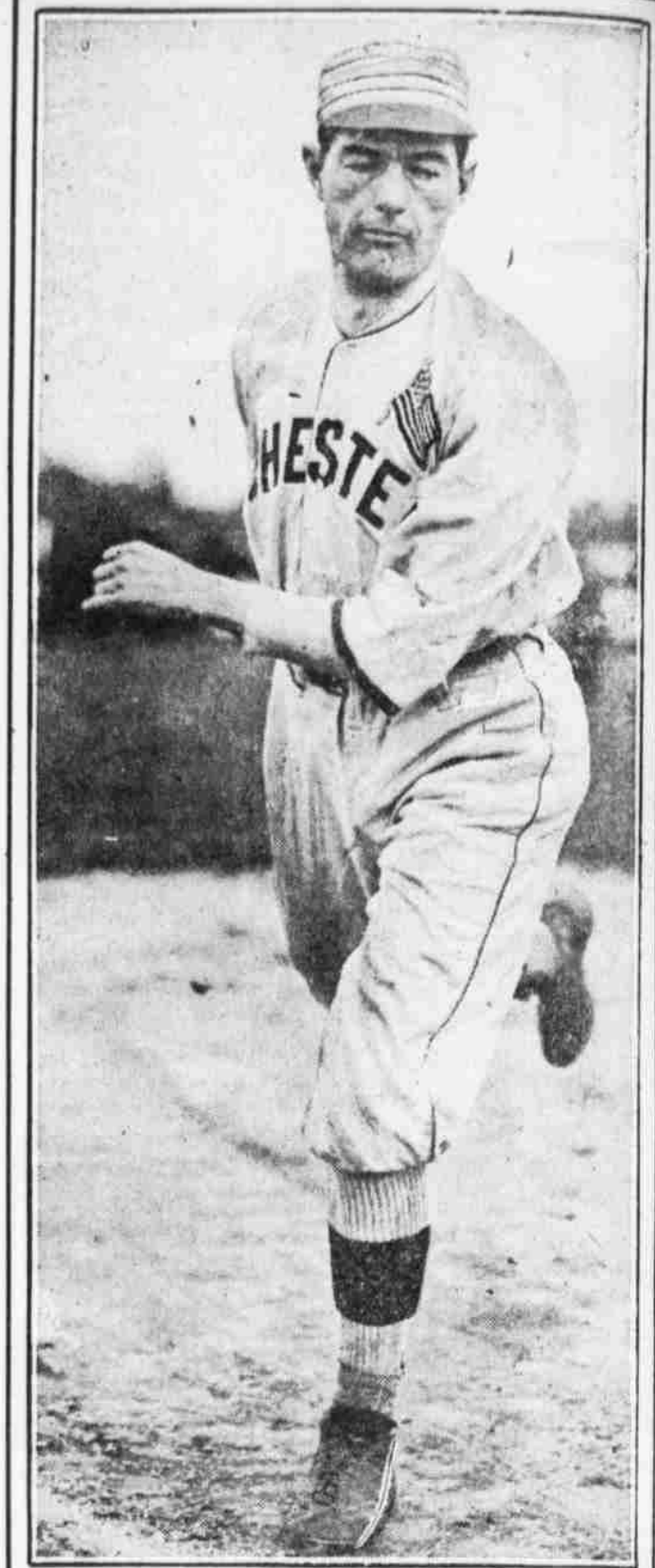
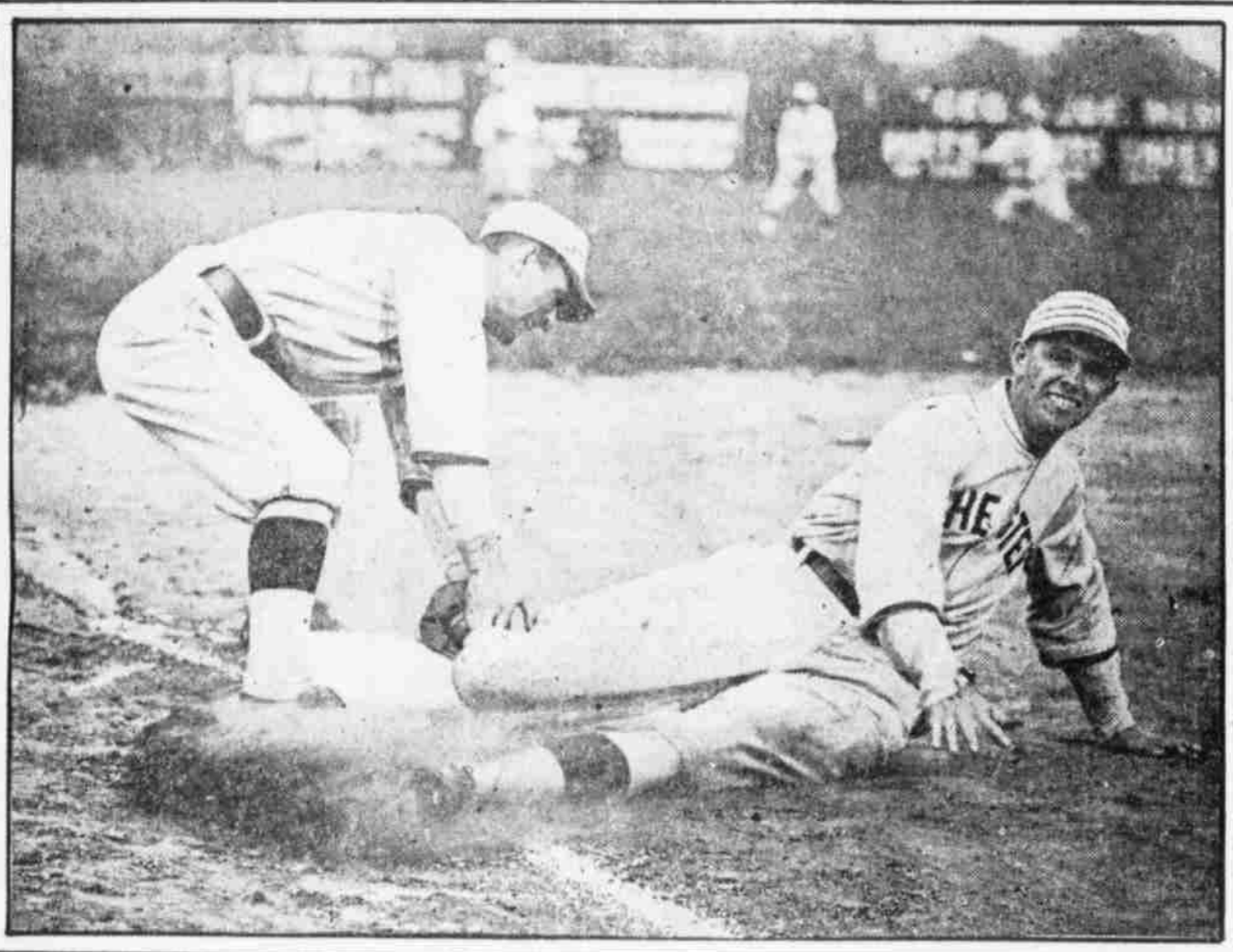




THE ONLY BASEBALL CLUB THAT CHESTER RECOGNIZES AS CHAMPION

 First Baseman Ogden is showing Chester fans the same deerlike agility that made him a favorite in Media when he played in that place.



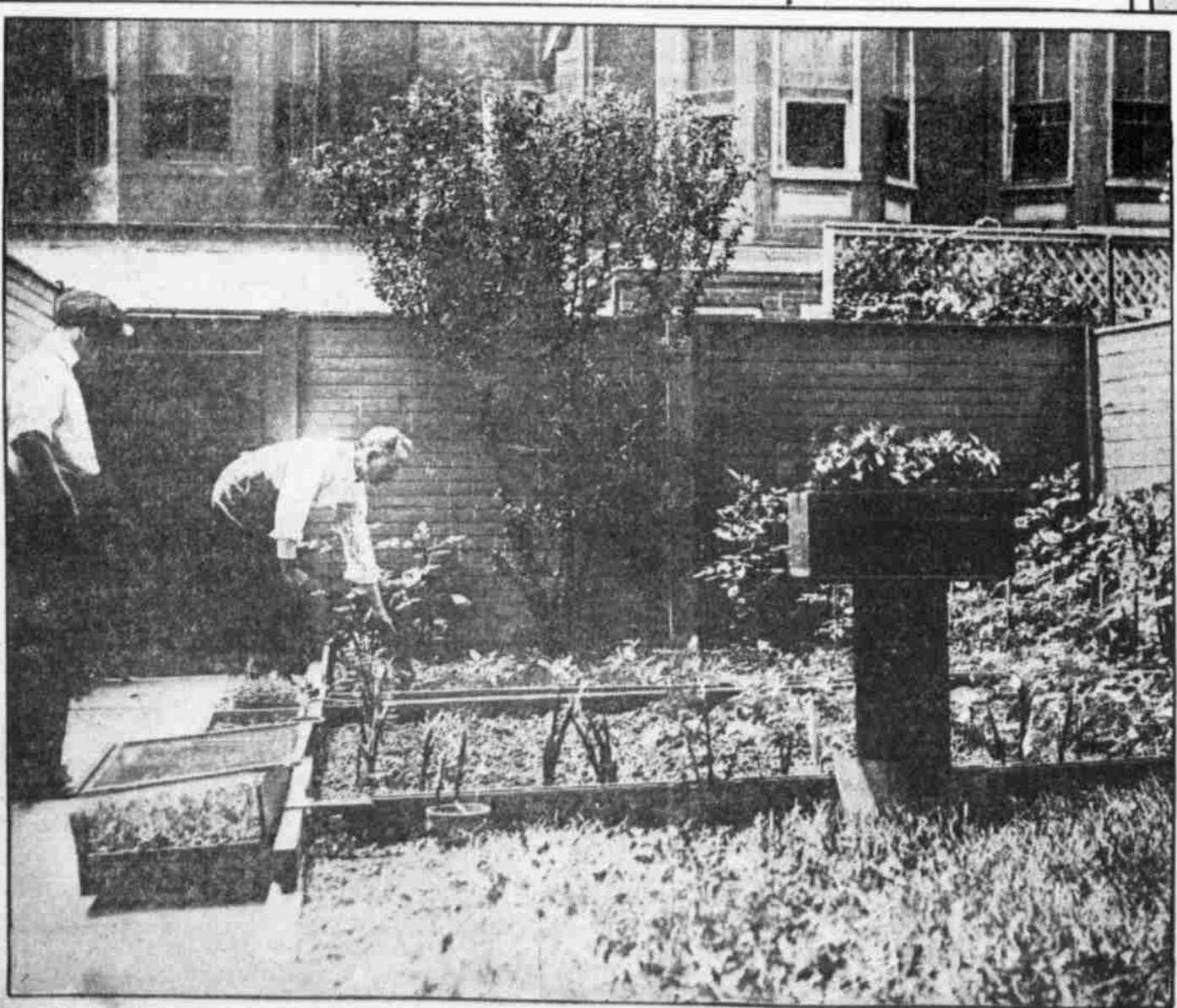
TY COBB METHODS WIN GAMES OUTSIDE OF THE BIG LEAGUE
