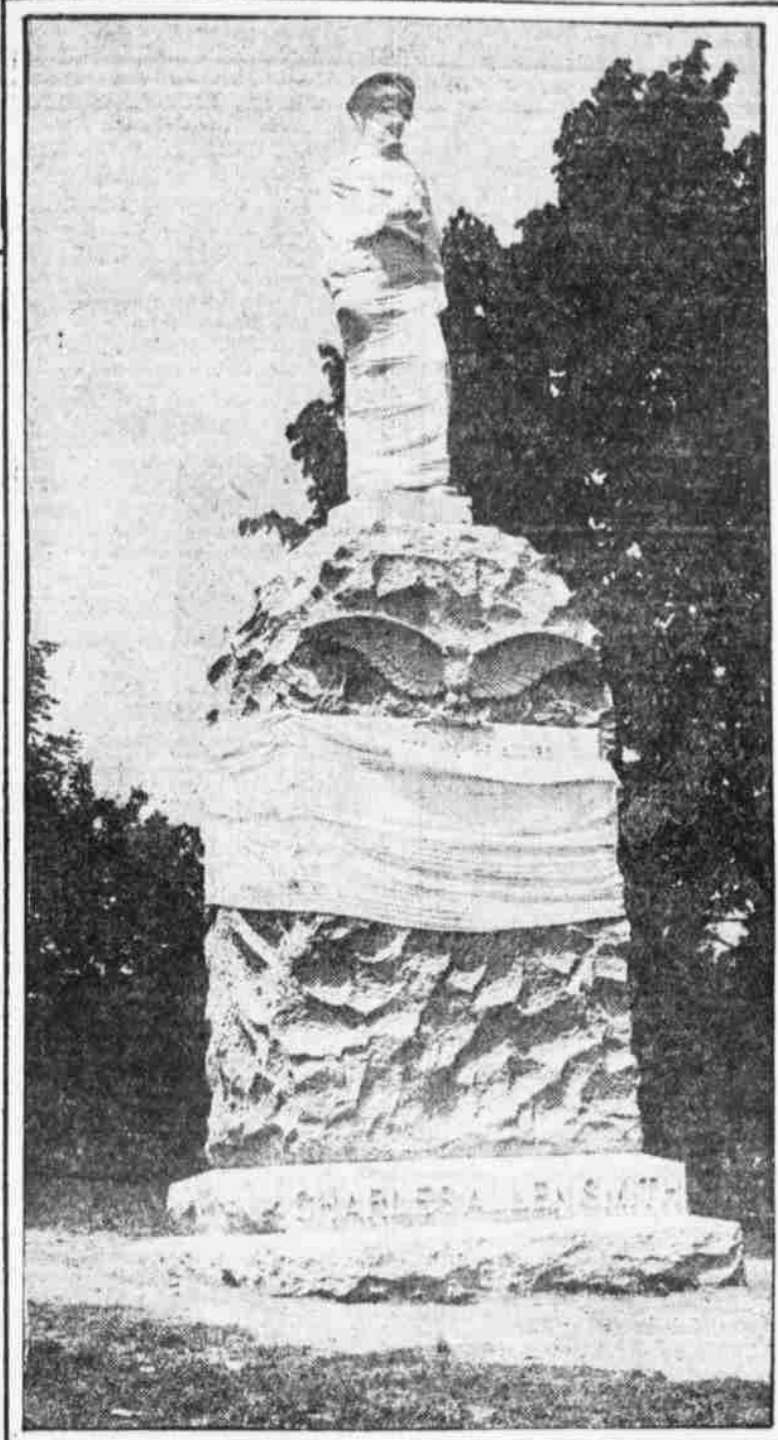
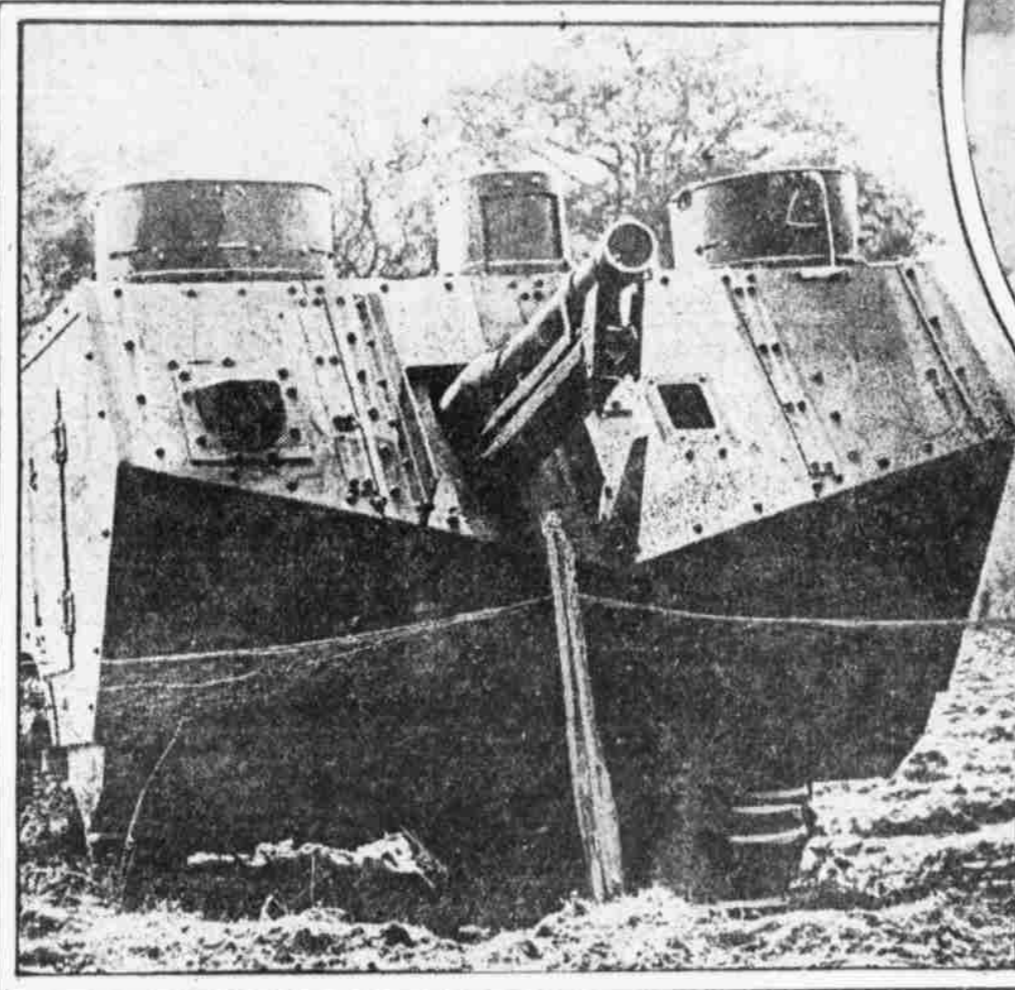

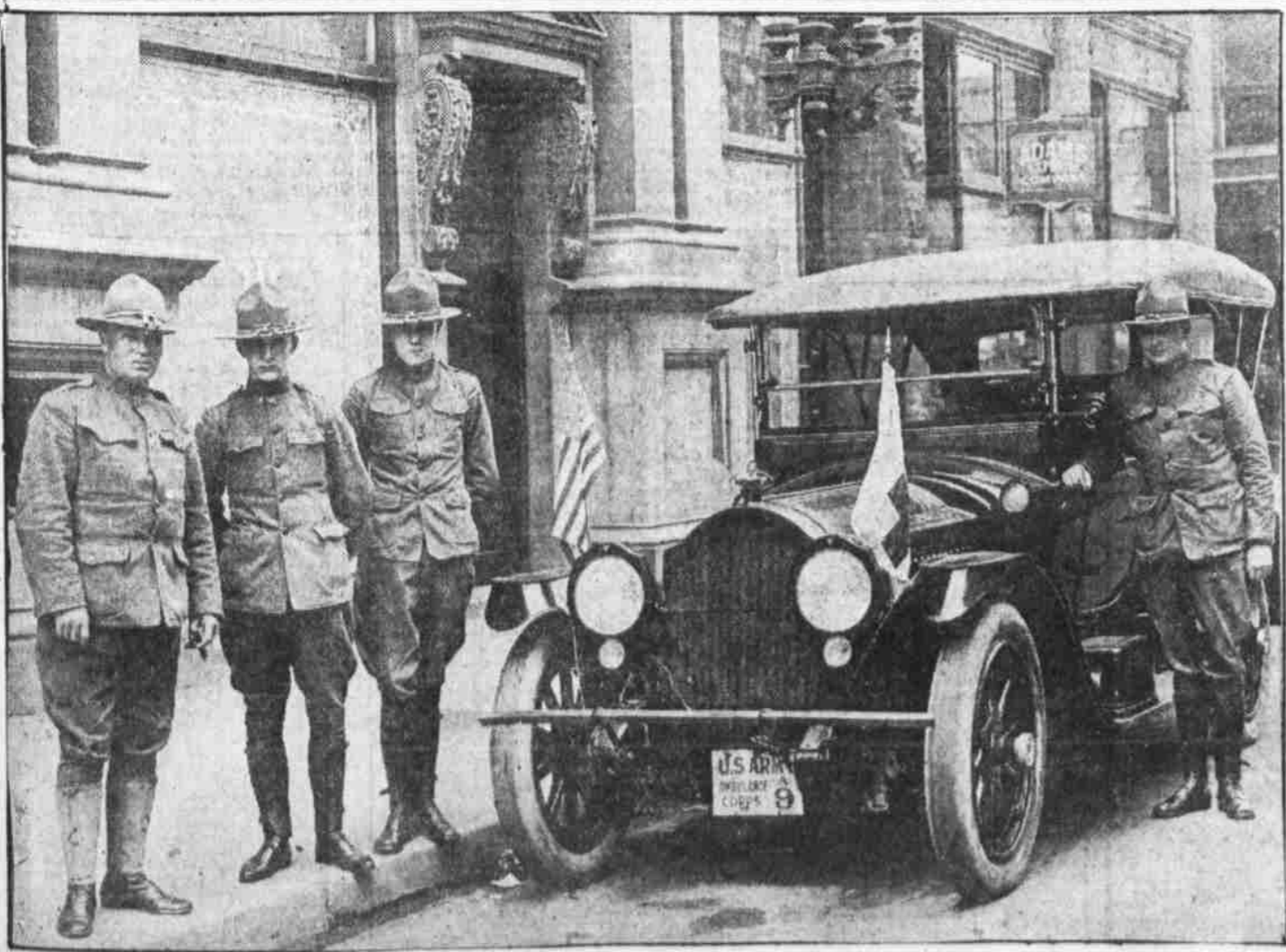
NEW FORMIDABLE "LAND MONITOR" USED BY THE FRENCH
