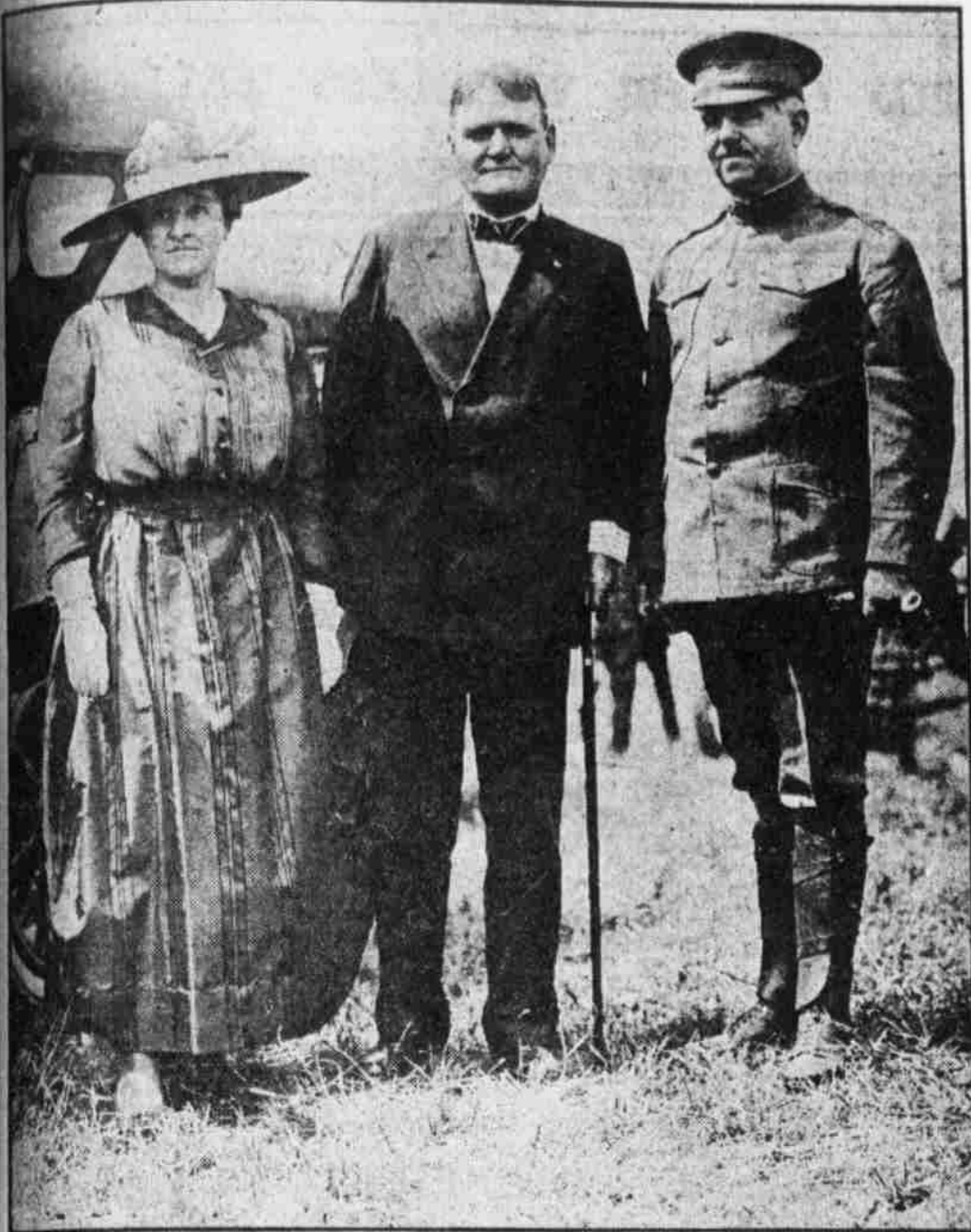
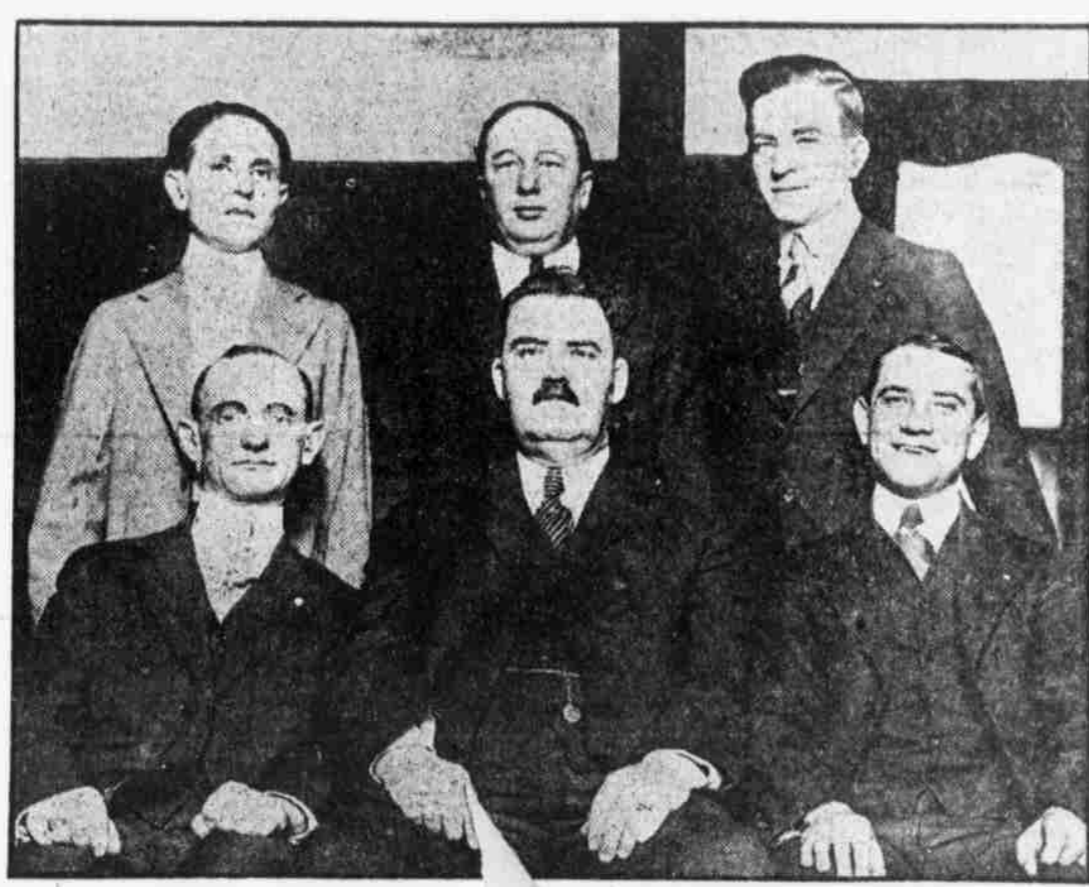


ILLUMINATING PICTORIAL SIDELIGHTS ON THE DAY'S NEWS

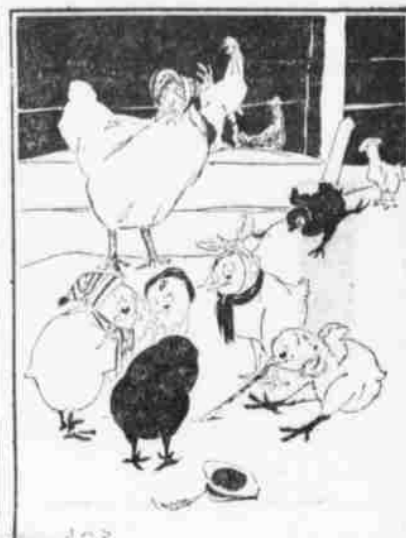
