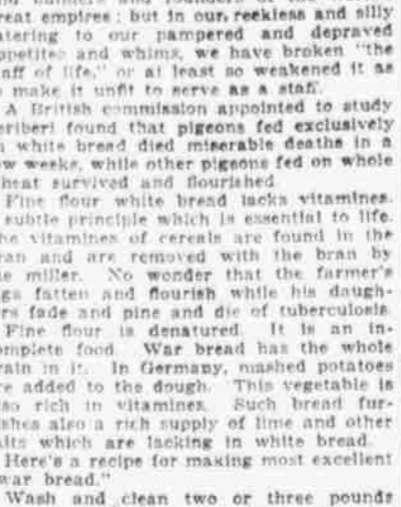

Many Midsummer Hats Are Fashioned of Silk

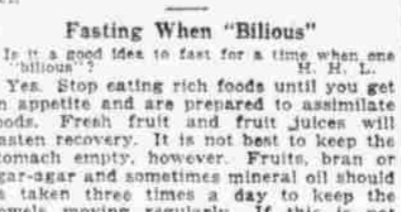
