

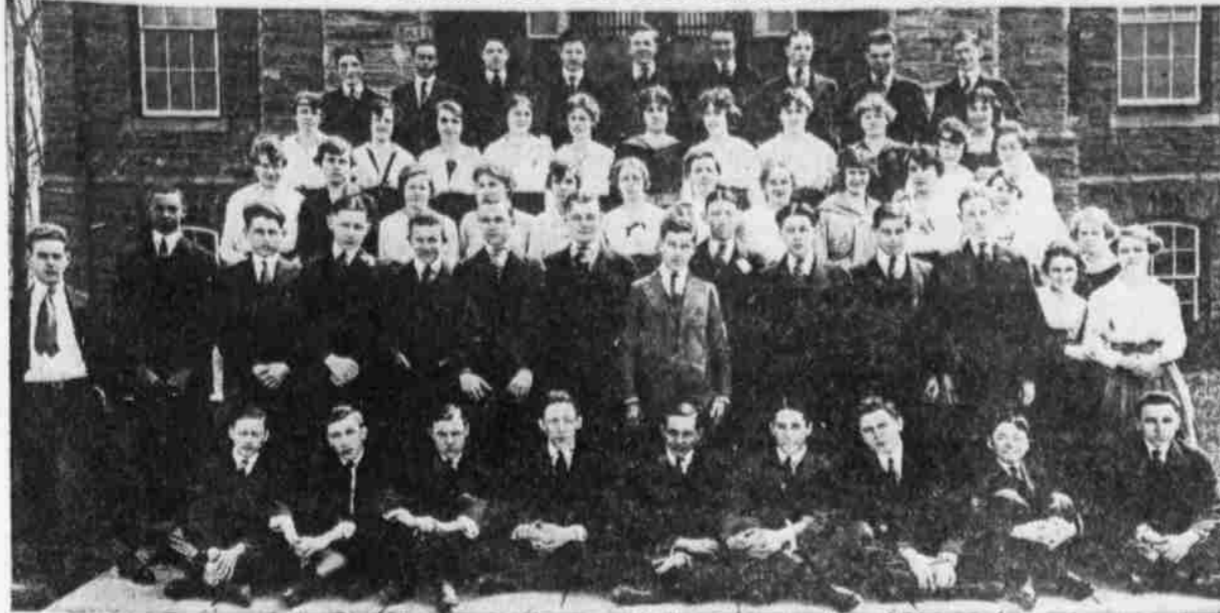
124 RECEIVE DIPLOMAS FROM NORTHEAST HIGH

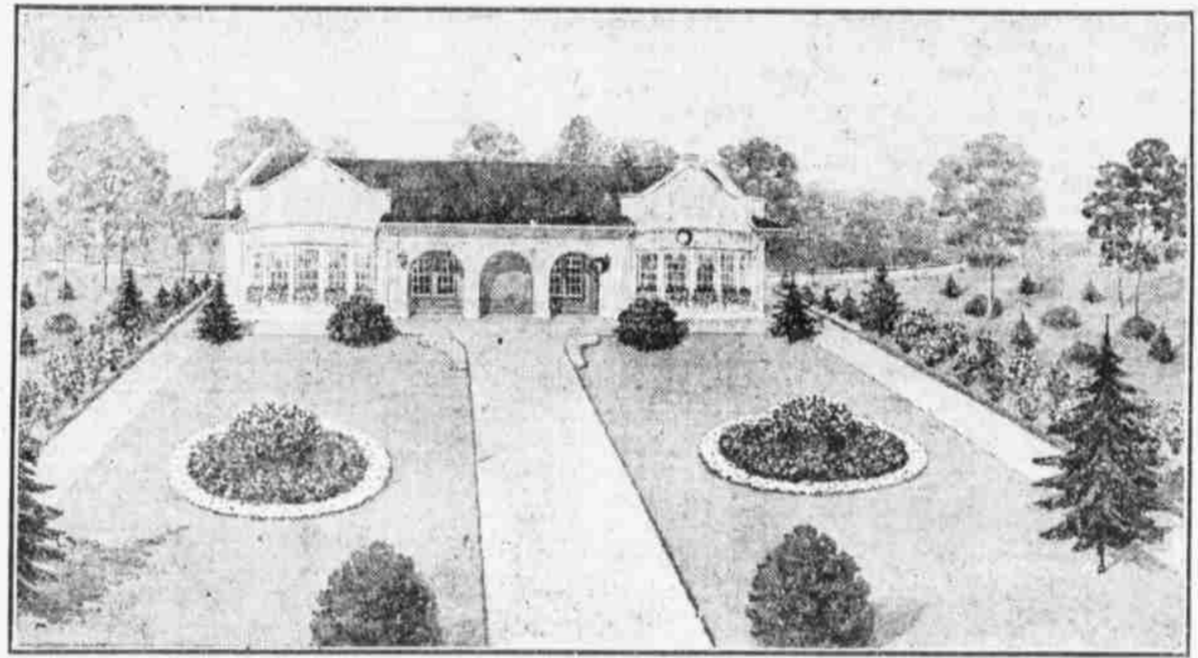
