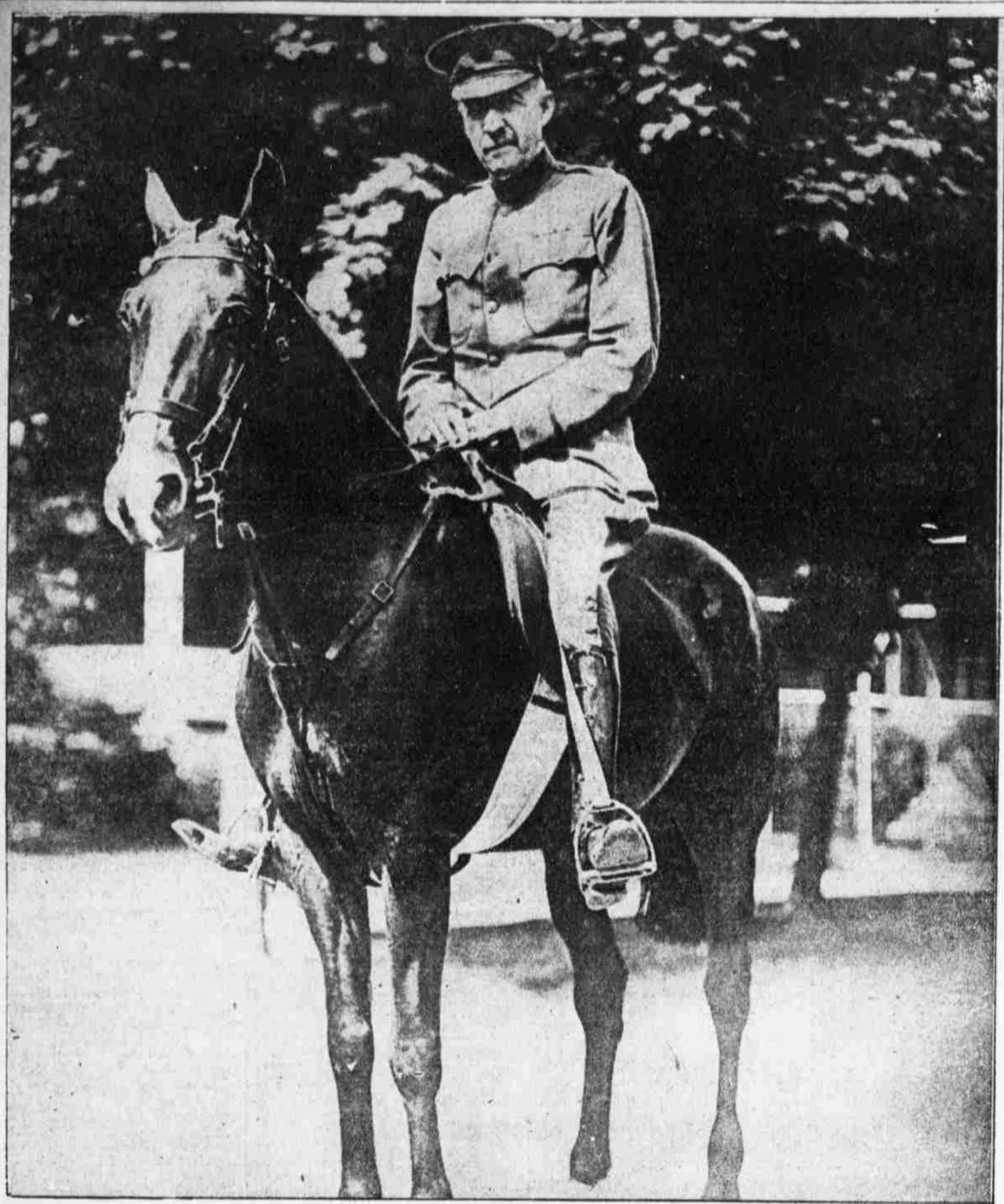
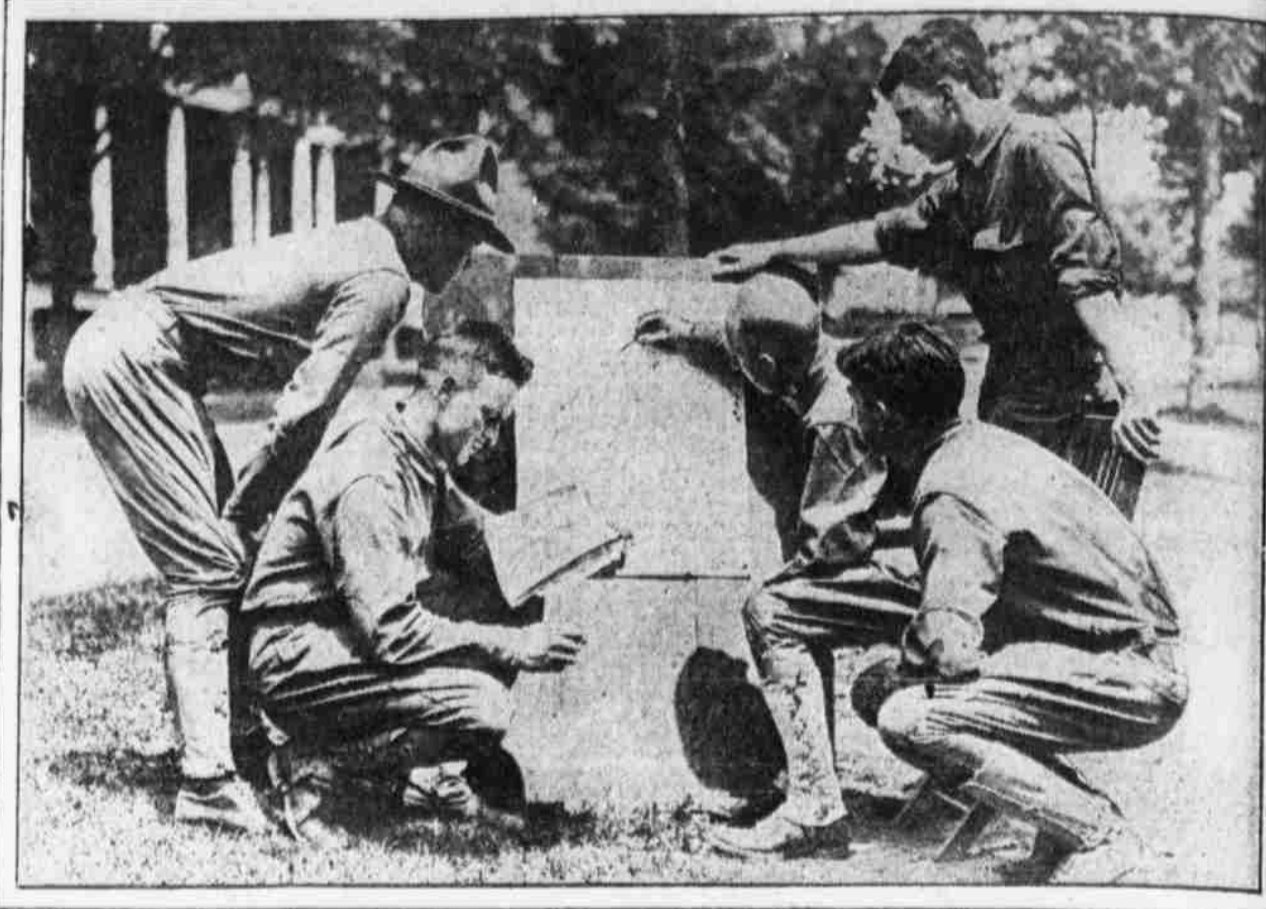


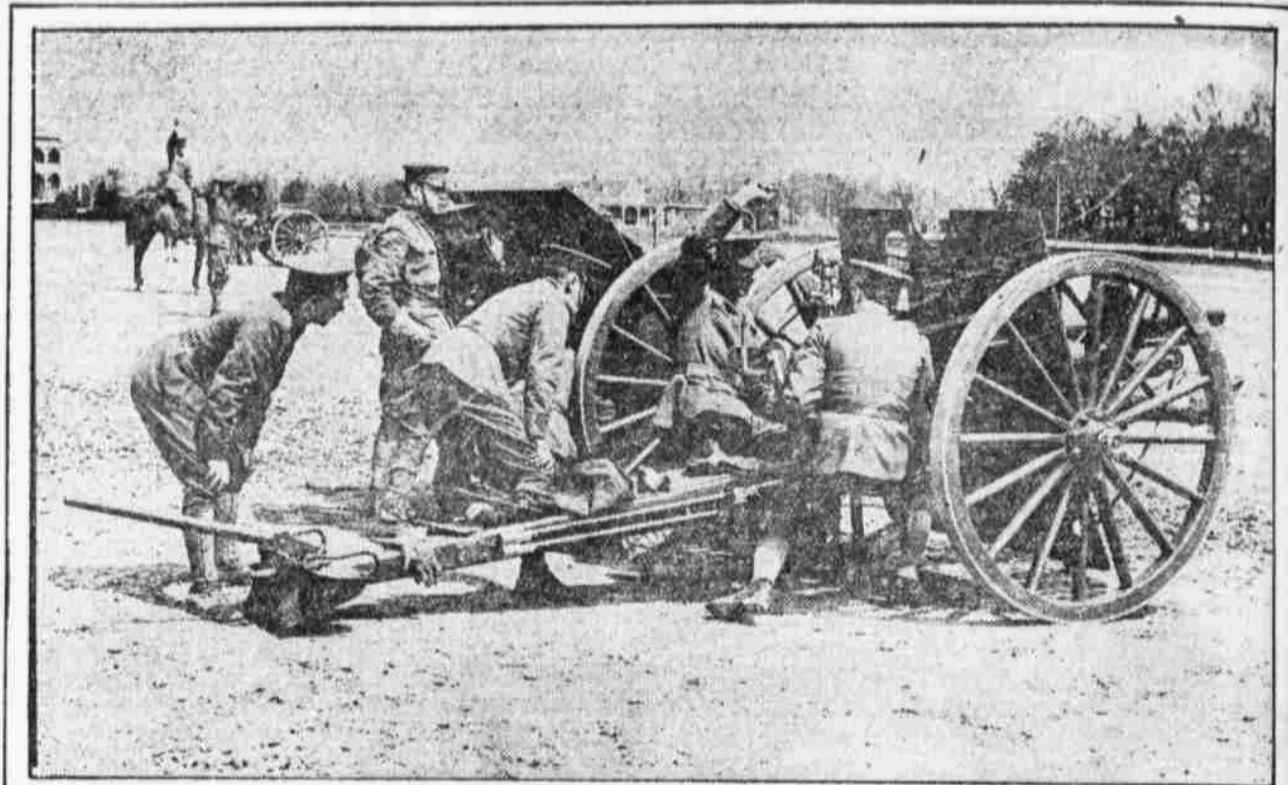
NEW JERSEY AND DELAWARE VOLUNTEER OFFICERS AT FORT MYER TRAINING CAMP

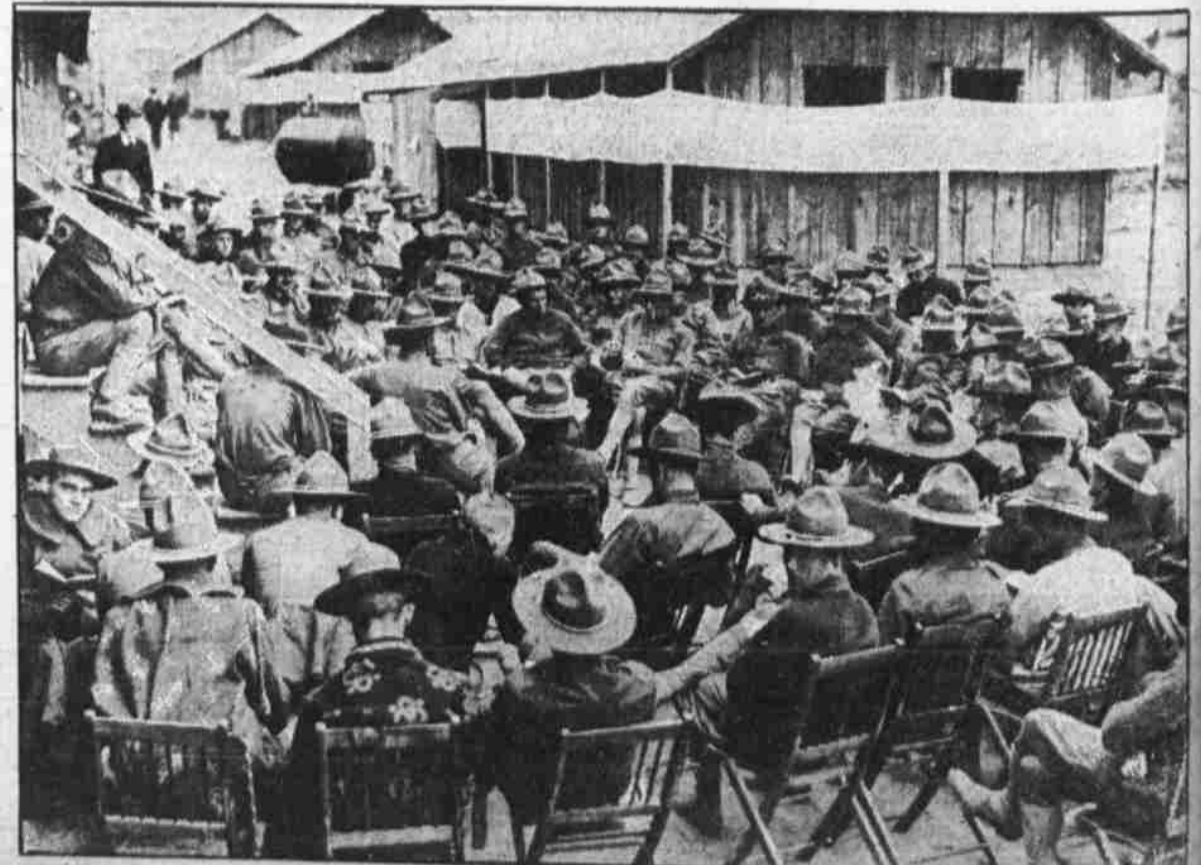
