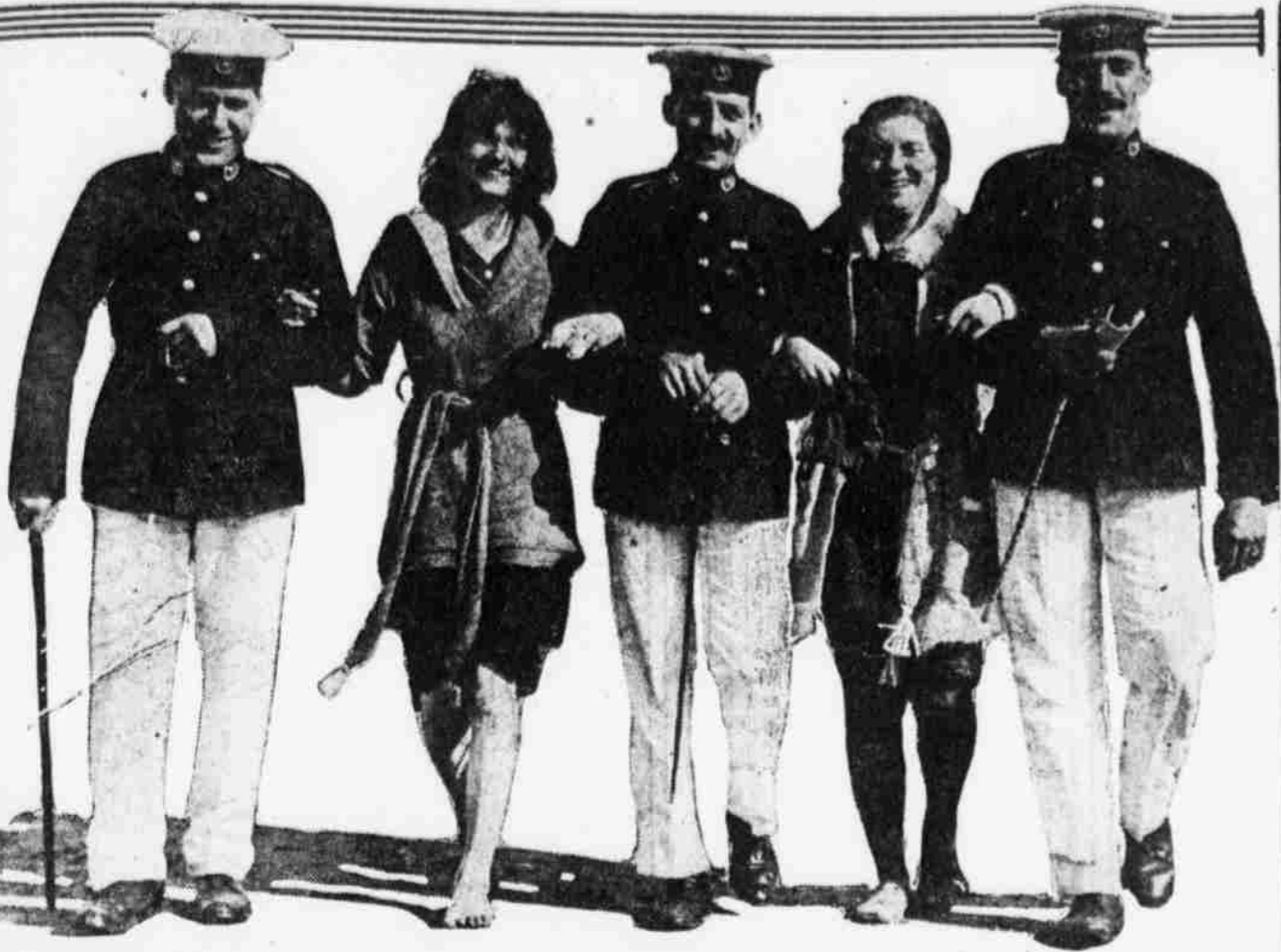
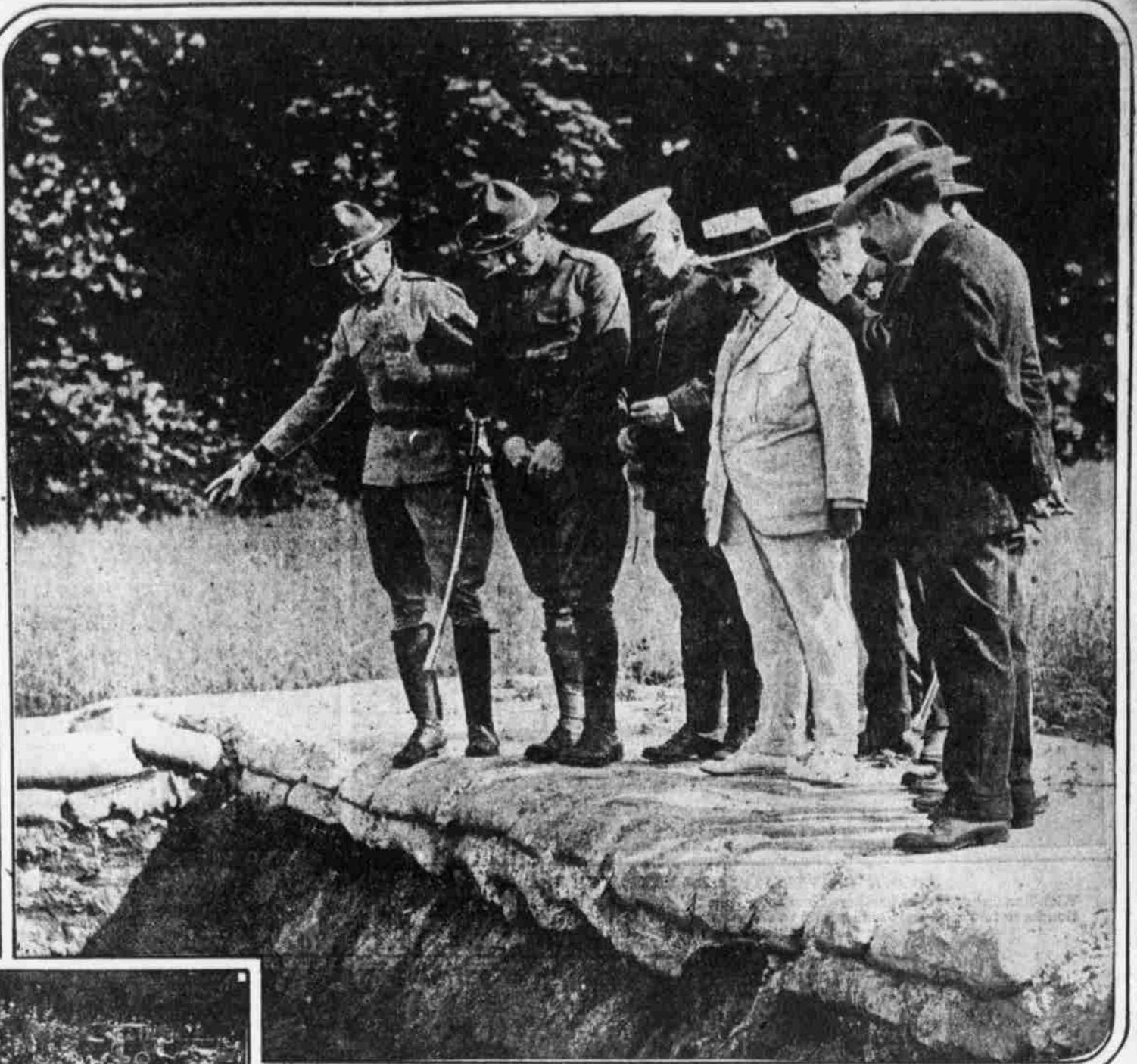

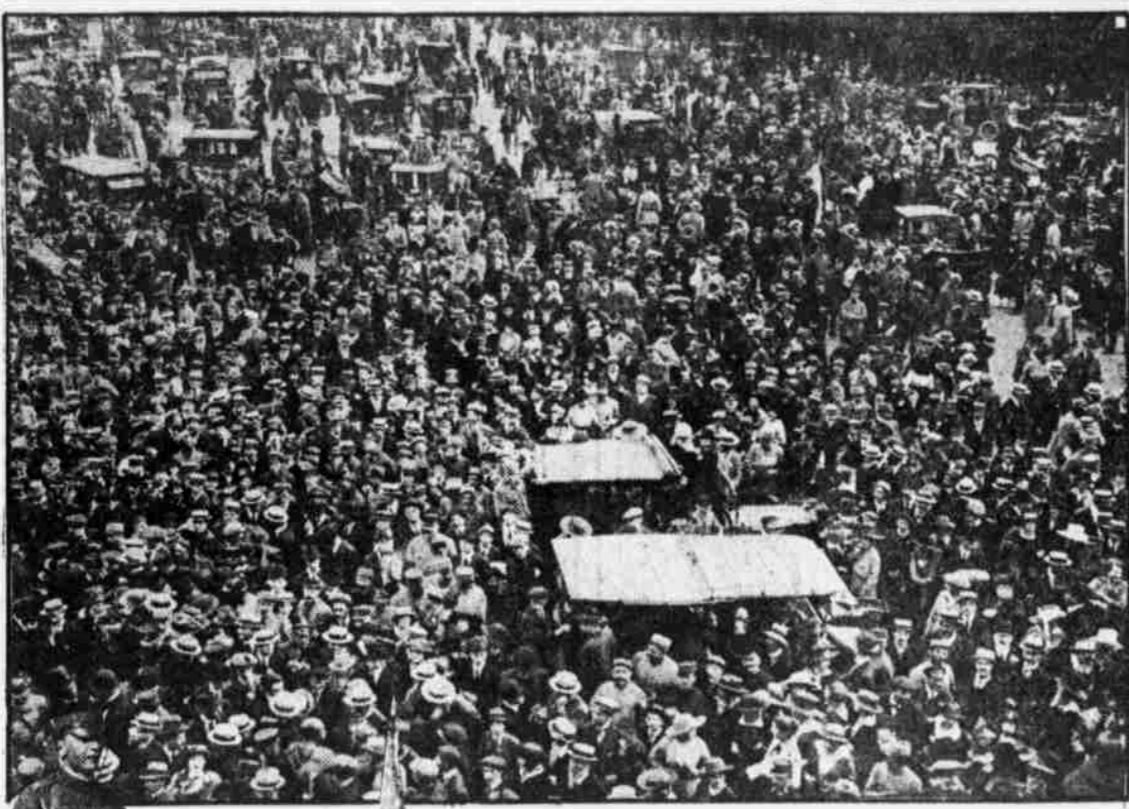
AMERICAN GIRLS ENTERTAIN BRITISH MARINES
Men from a visiting battleship find shore leave unusually agreeable when enjoyed at a beach watering place "somewhere in the United States."



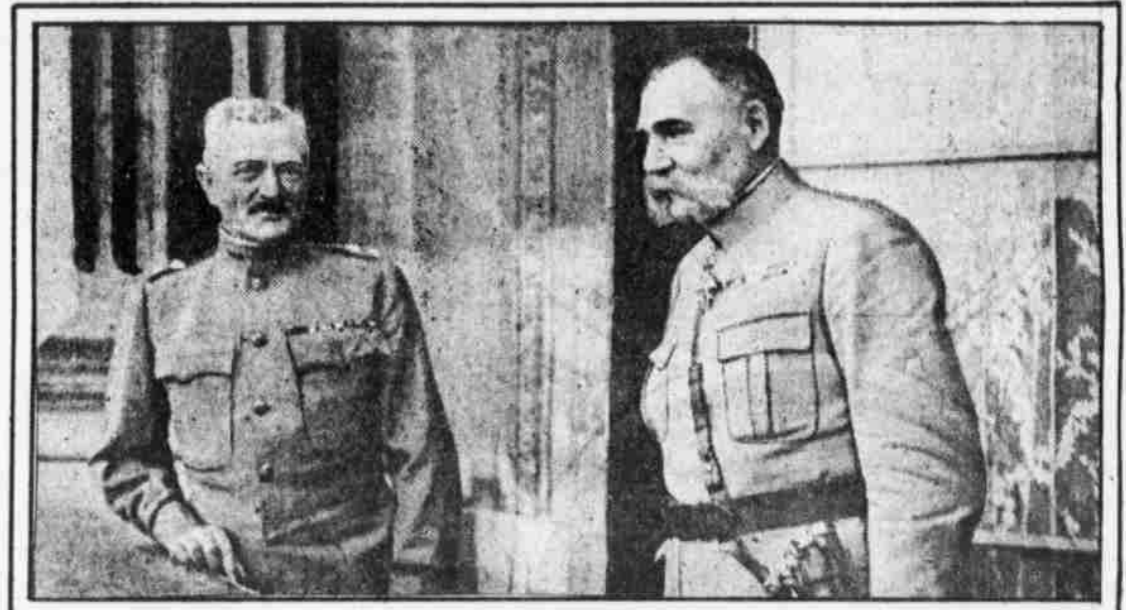
FRENCH CONSUL REVIEWS TRAINING CAMP AT LANSOWNE

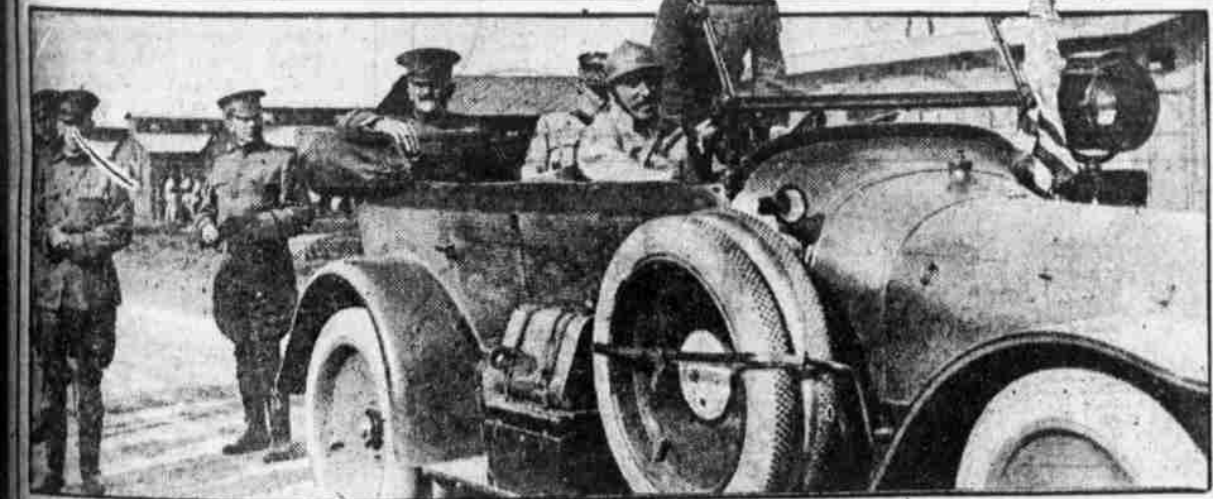
