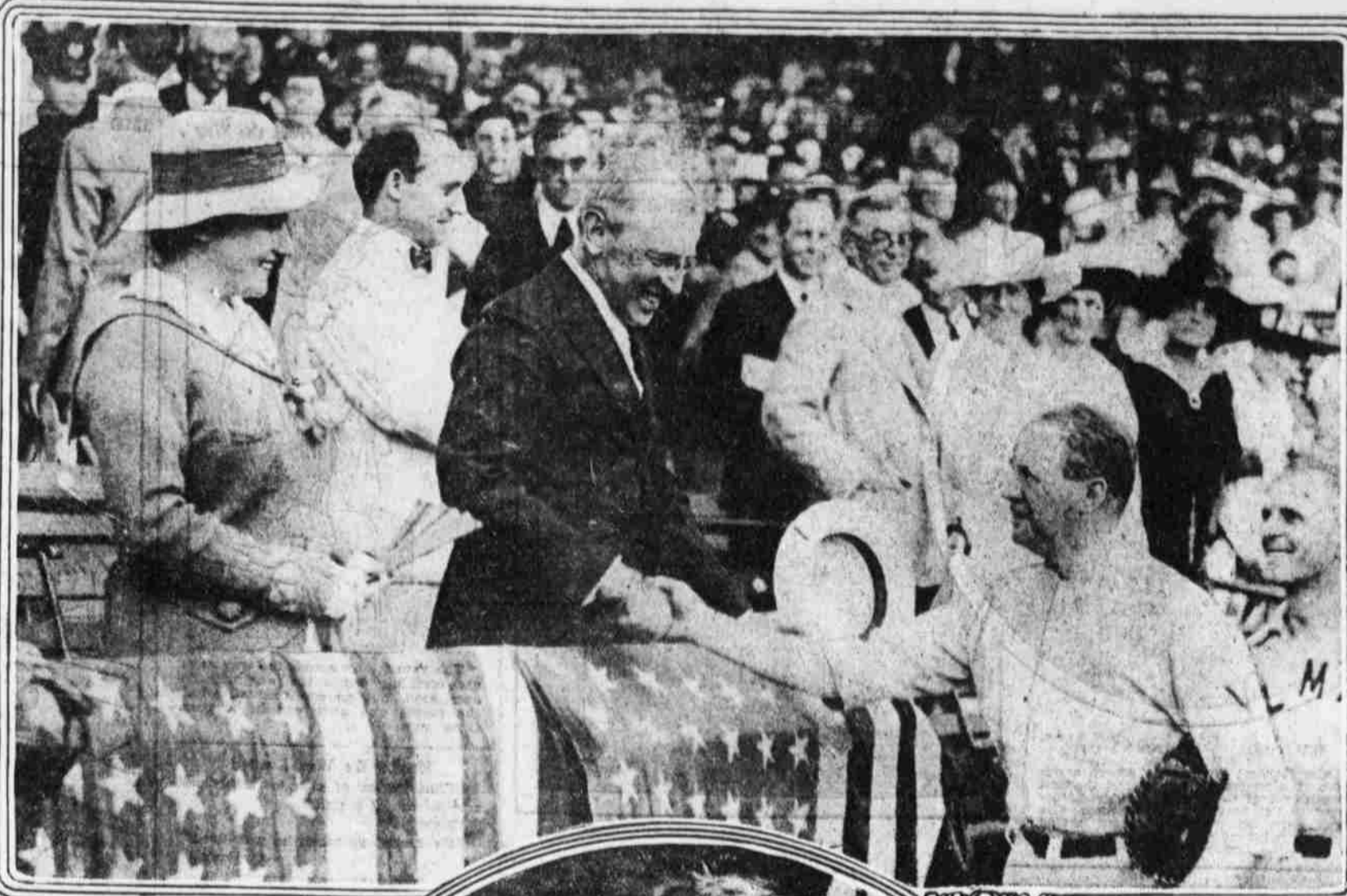
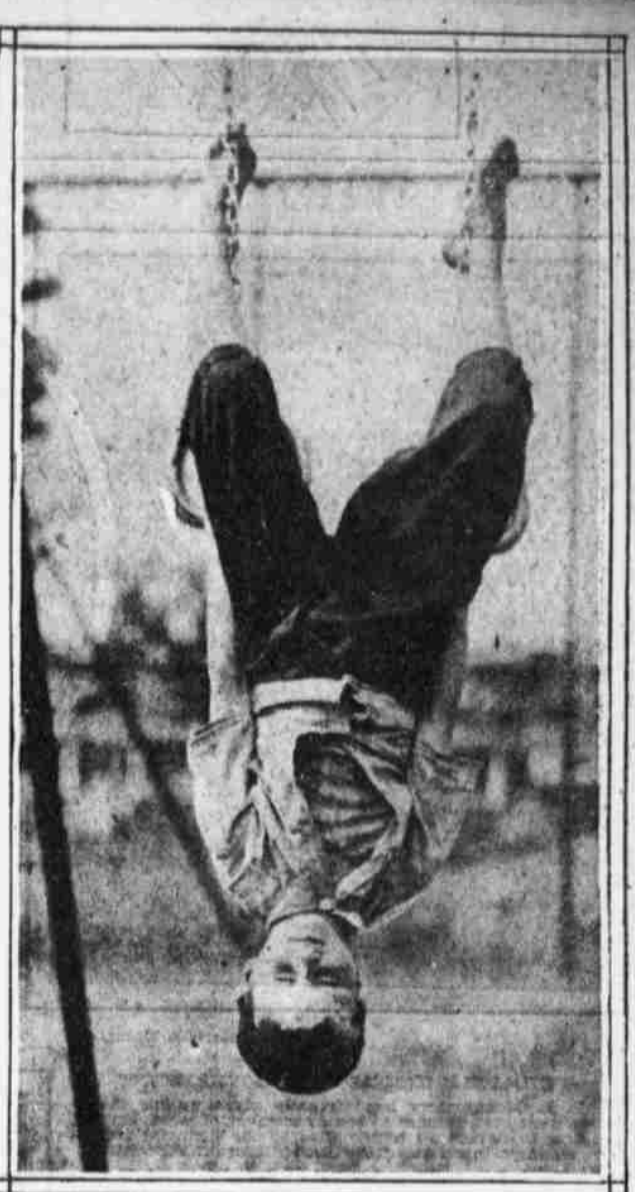




NOW SEEKING RECORD IN THE AIR

Robbed of his vacation by the press of war business, President Wilson finds relaxation now and then at the baseball park. He is shown greeting a lawmaker at the recent congressional game.



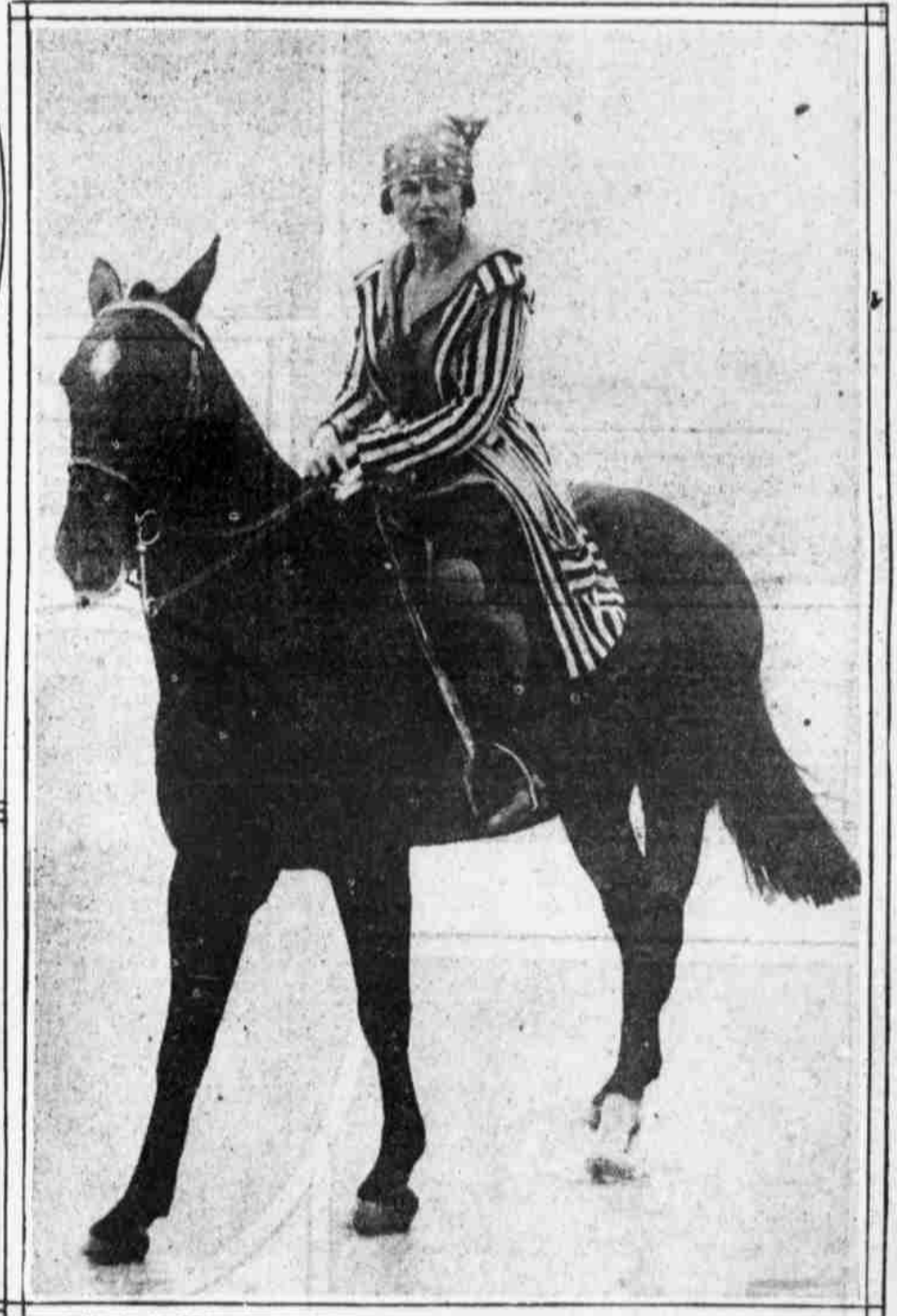
WOULD THIS MAKE YOU DIZZY?

Cards like this are being placed on Philadelphia homes from which loyal sons have gone forth to fight for freedom from autocracy.



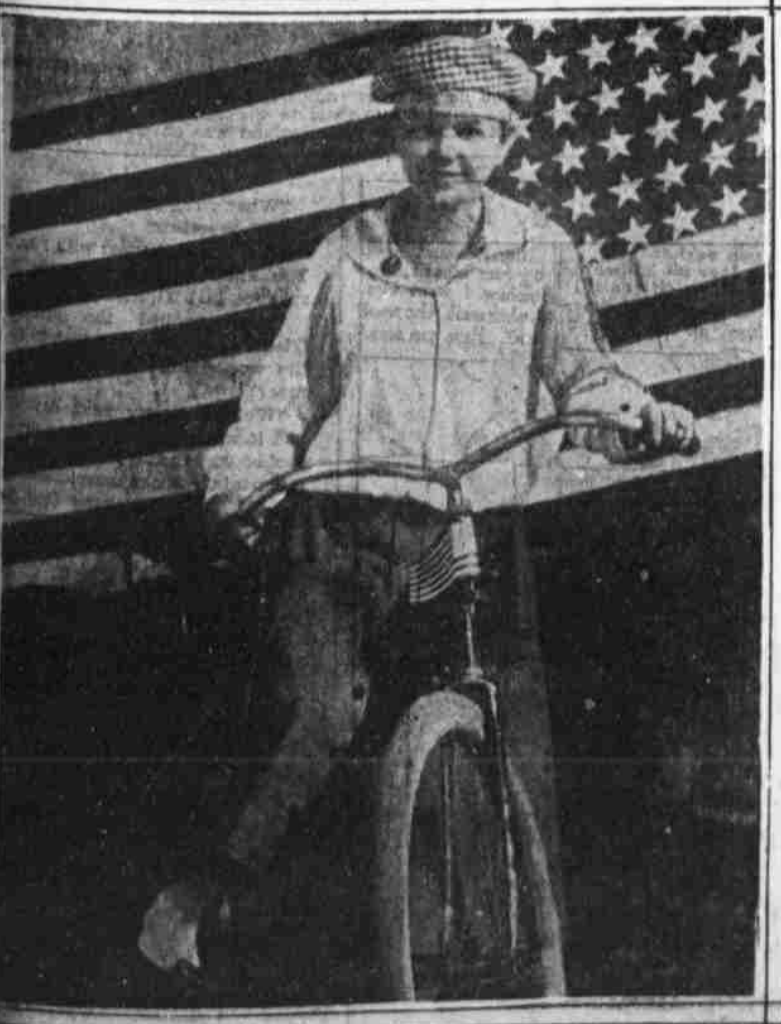
COOL AND HAPPY ON THE SANDS BY THE ROLLING WAVES
Marian Widener, of 1222 North Fifty-third street, Philadelphia, greets her friends with a joyful smile when they find her resting after a dip in the boisterous sea.



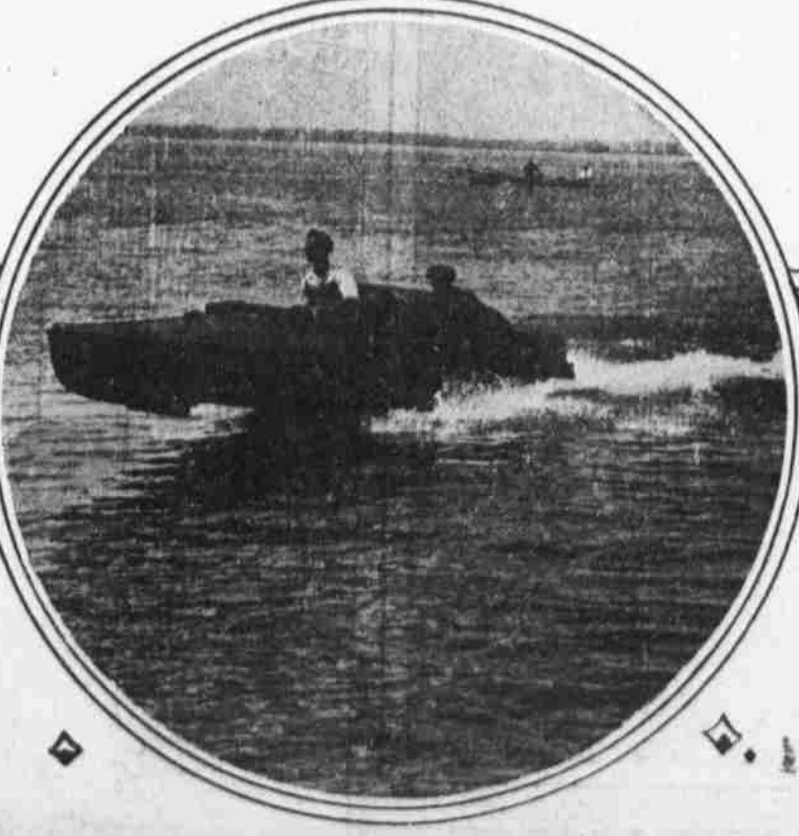
NEW SPORT GAINS FAVOR AT THE SHORE

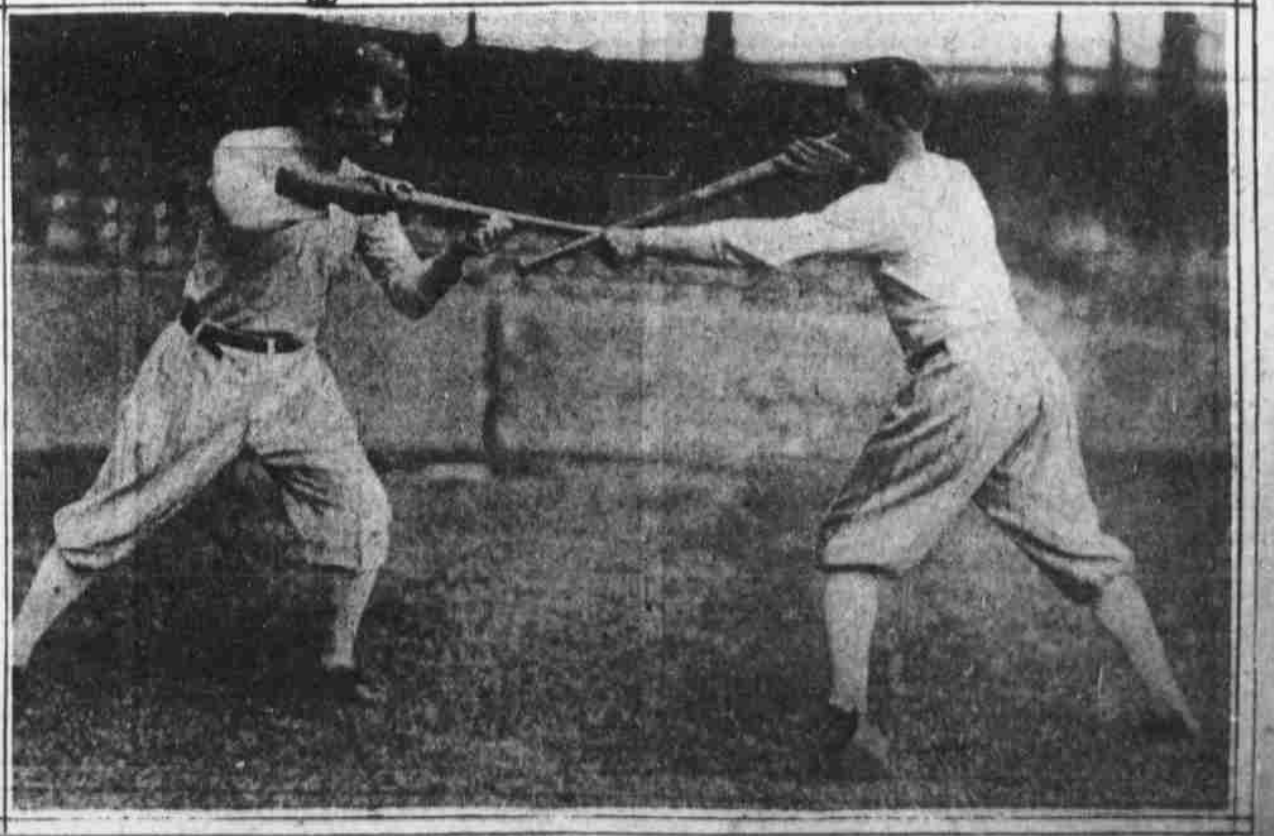
THAT OLD SWIMMIN' HOLE STILL HAS ITS CHARM
