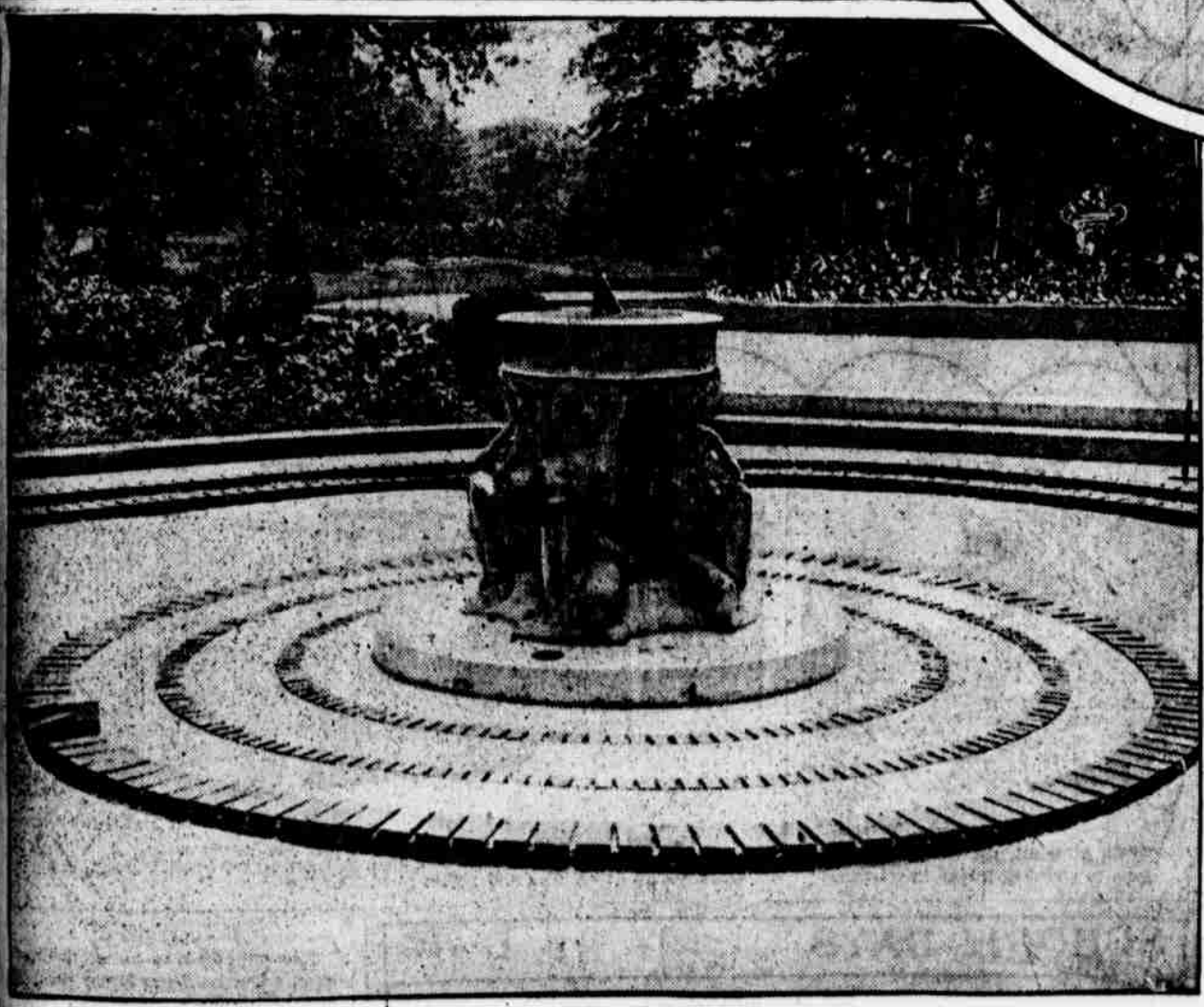
HELEN PENNYPACKER PERFORMING HER DIVE, WHICH IS 100 PER CENT PERFECTION

A new photograph of Olga Dorfner, holder of several American and world swimming records, who also is adept in the art of diving.

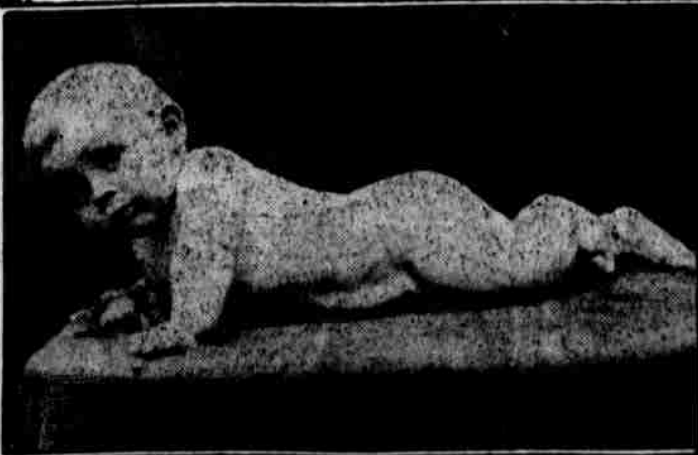
