

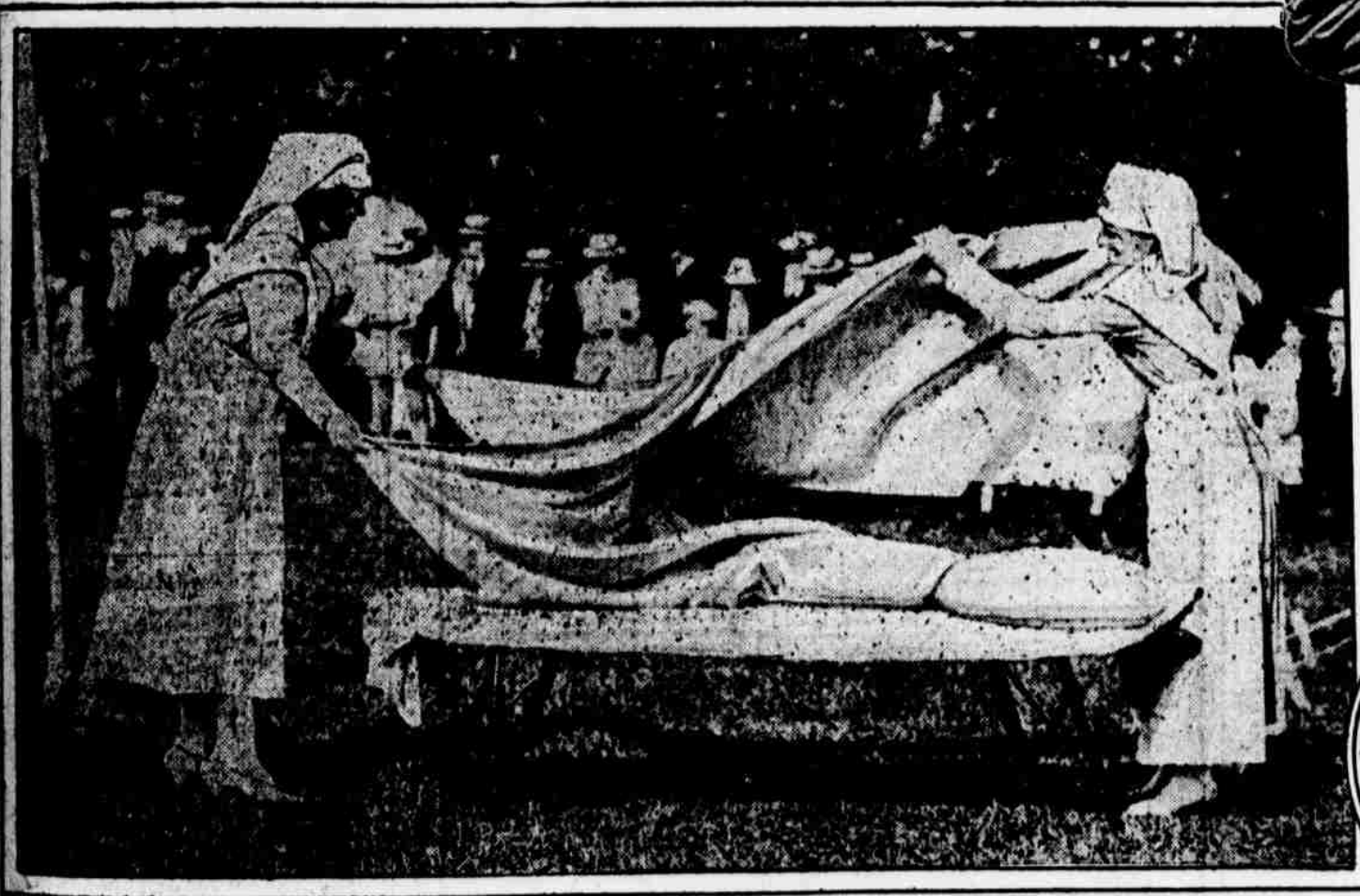

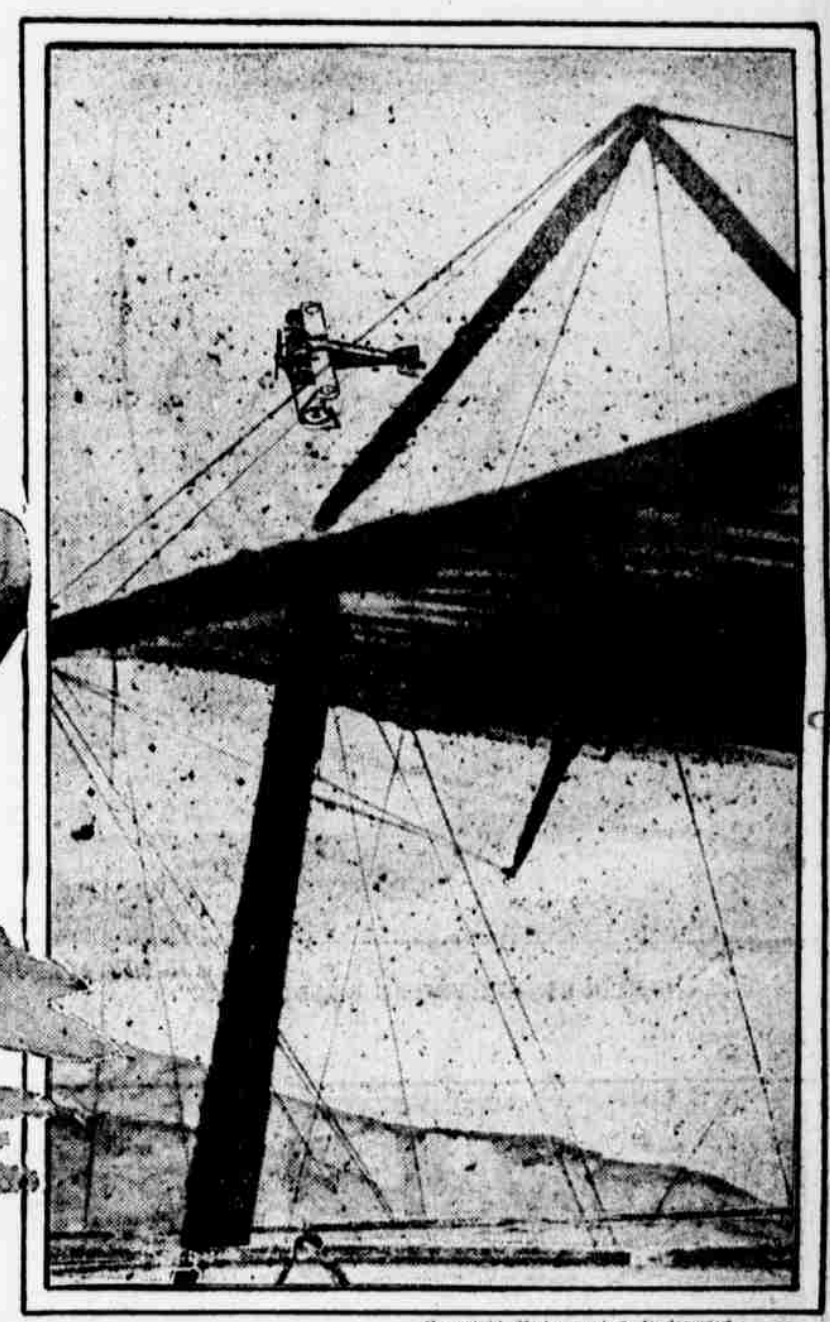
ONE FORM OF ECONOMY PRACTICED AT ALLENTOWN CAMP
By sorting out the various kinds of camp refuse and depositing each in its proper receptacle, sanitation is improved and a saving of \$1000 a month is effected.



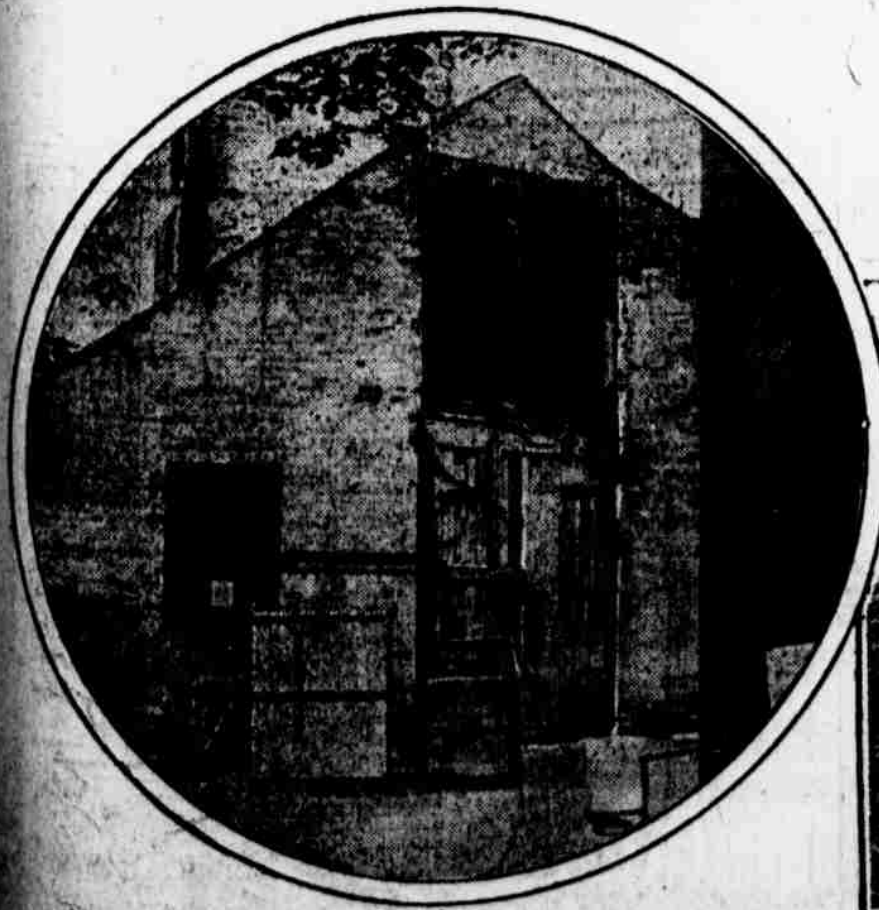
NO TIME IS WASTED UNDER RED CROSS SYSTEM
