

BETHLEHEM PACKS ITS FIRST MAYOR

Honor to Go to Archibald Johnston, Who Scores Run-away in Primary

TICE TO BE CONTROLLER Judge Stewart Re-elected Over Booth, Home Candidate, by Vote of Eight to One

BETHLEHEM, Pa., Sept. 20.—The first Mayor of Bethlehem will be Archibald Johnston, who at the primary election held in the combined boroughs yesterday, received, unofficially, seventy-six per cent of the total vote cast.

In the councilmanic contest, James E. Mathews and Thomas Howard both are destined to be members of the city's Council, each having received more than fifty-one per cent of the total votes.

For City Controller, Victor E. Tice received 145 votes, Edward D. Mills, 74, Curtis E. Hart, 57, and Edward J. O'Connell, 47. The present Judge of the Courts of Northampton, led by 8 to 1 over Bethlehem's home candidate, Attorney George H. Booth.
