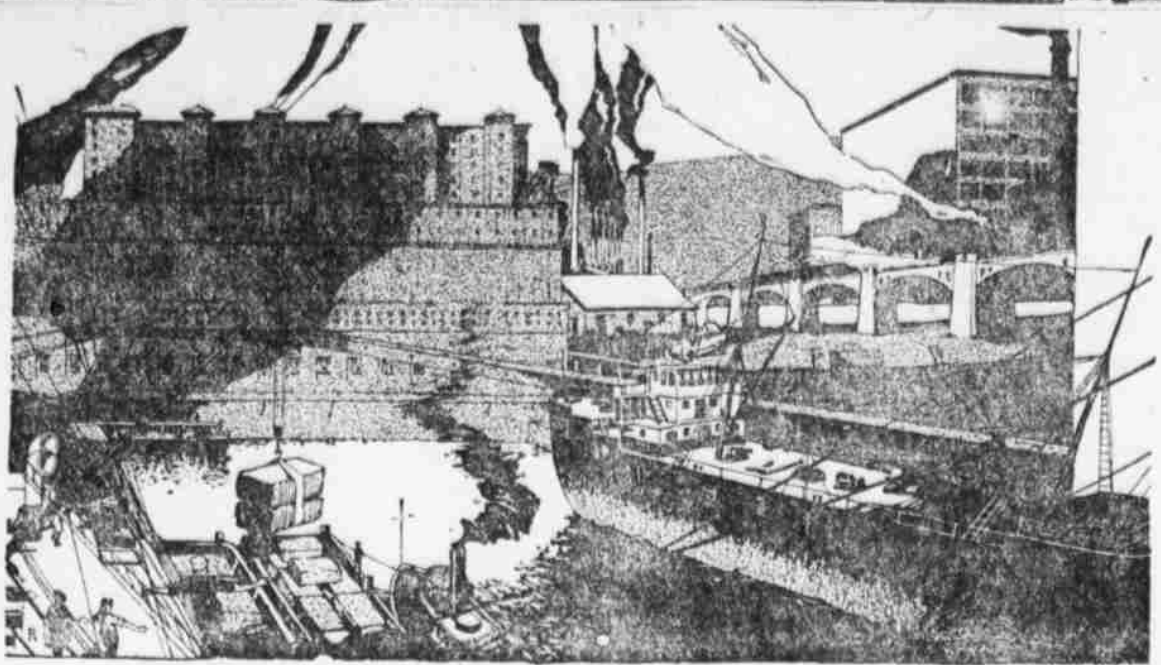


Education
