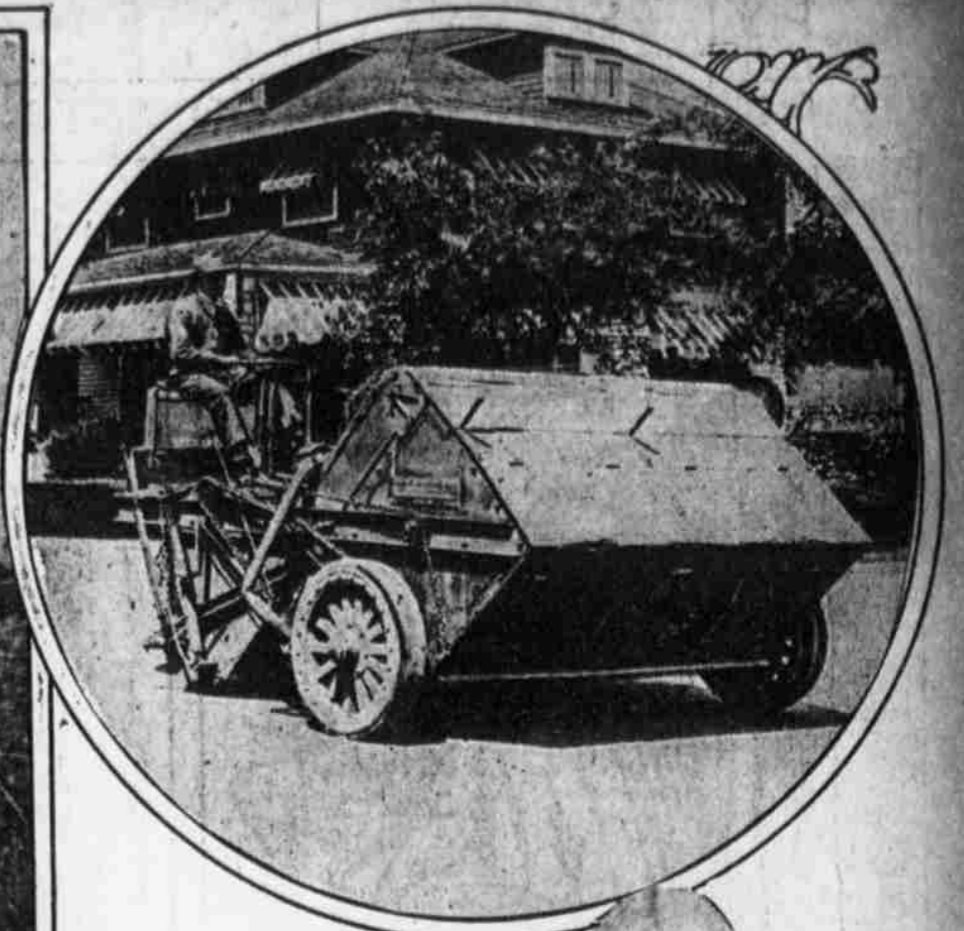


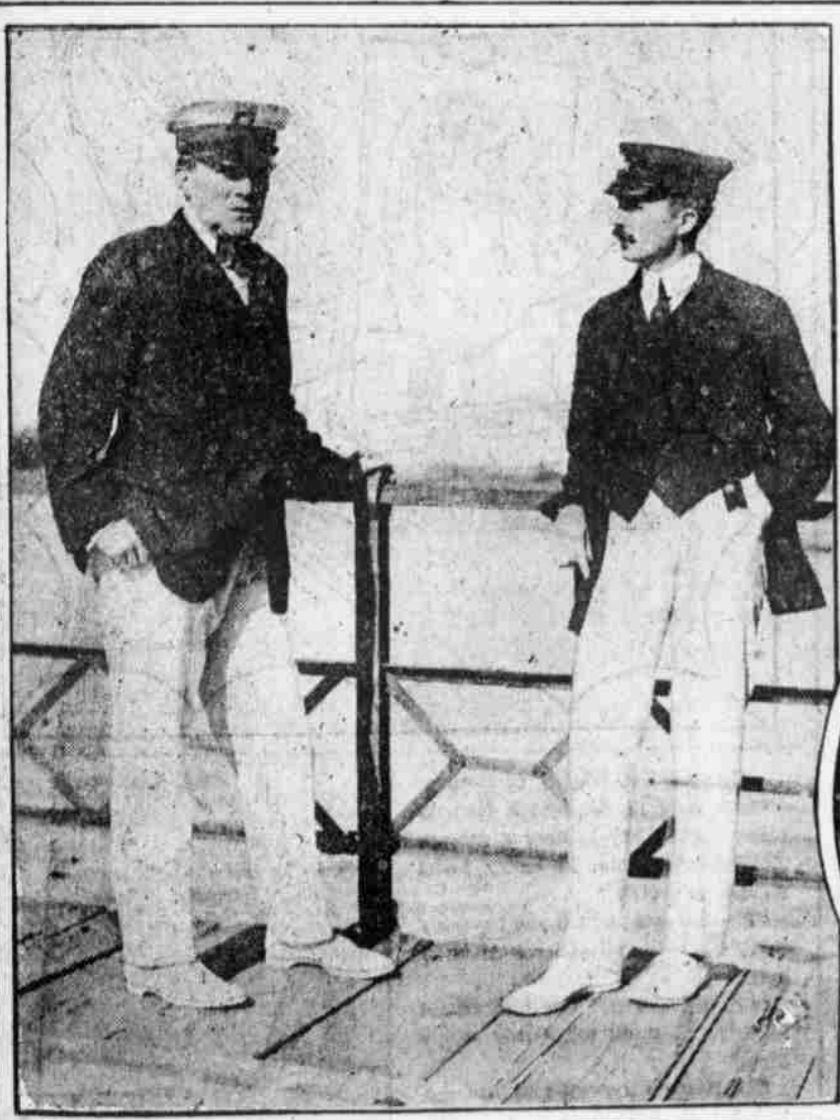

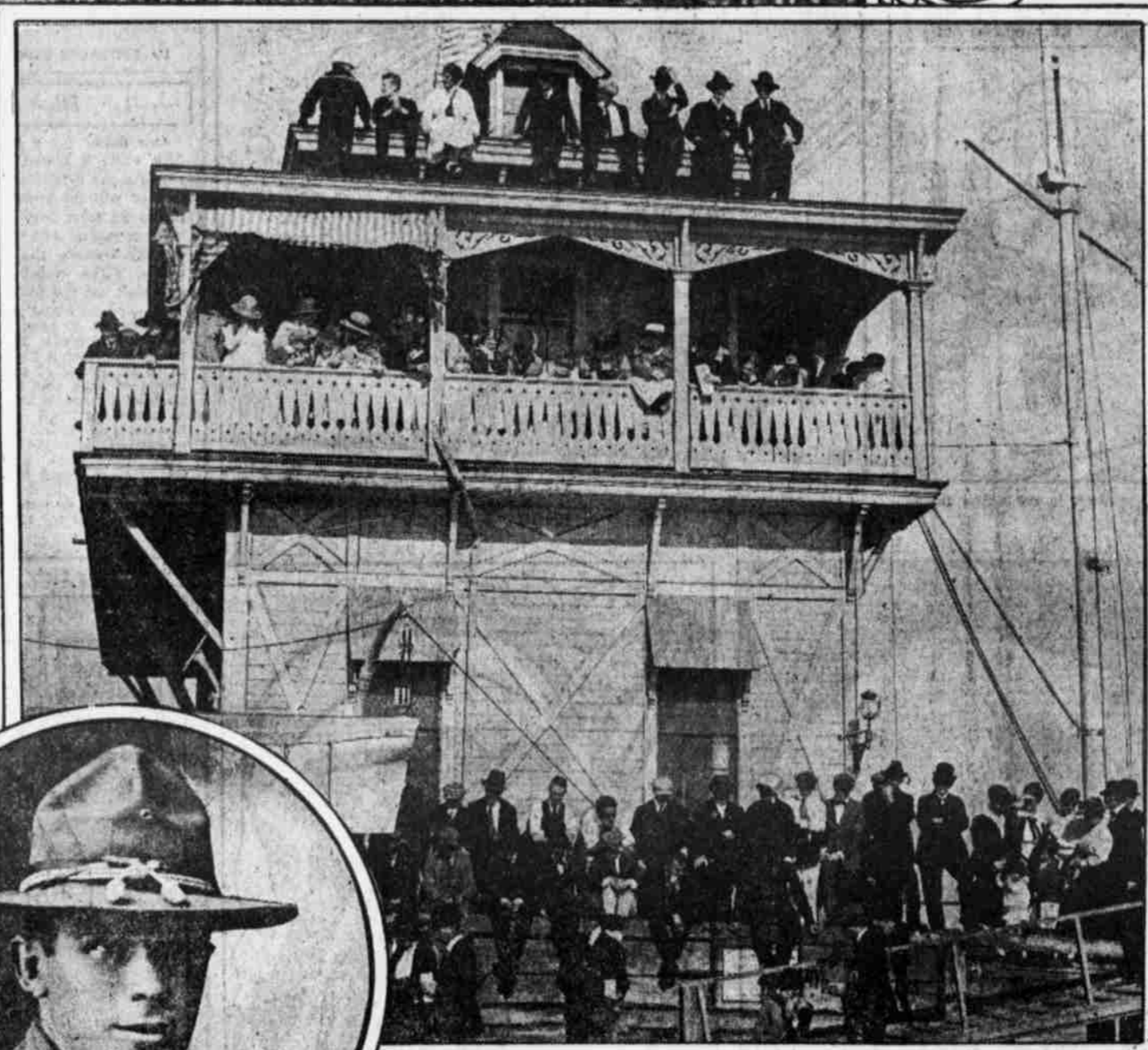
THAT WHIRRING OVERHEAD—IS IT A BOCHE MACHINE?

The clubhouse of the Riverton Swimming and Yacht Club is a center of many social and aquatic entertainments.



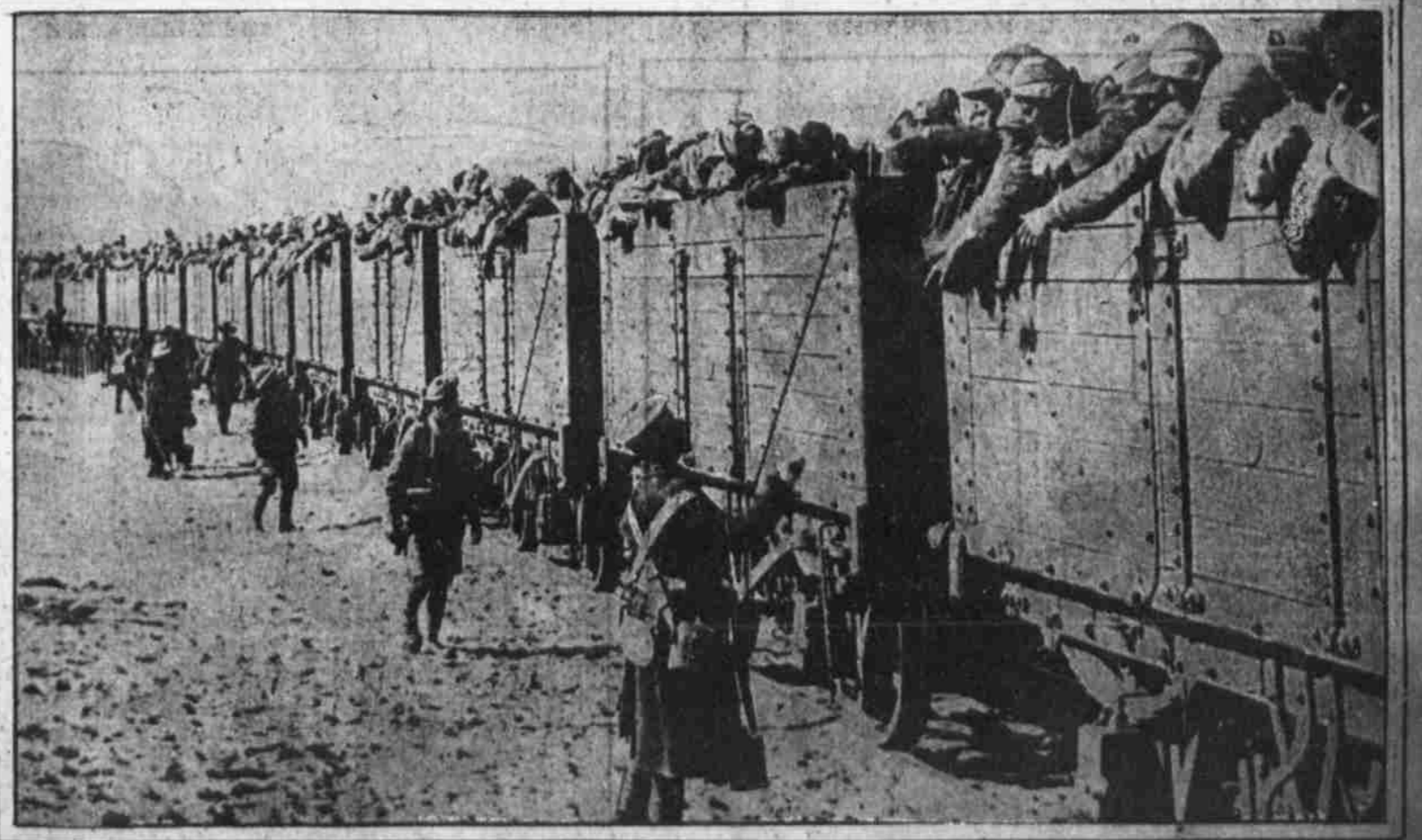
