DECISION OF U. S. COURT

WASHINGTON, Oct. 2. WASHINGTON, Oct. 2. To Walter Mitchell, a negro living at Arpublic, Kanawha County, W. Va., be-conts the distinction of making the first test of the "bone dry" law of March 3. 1917, which prohibits the try mortation of intoxicants into any State or Territory the intoxicants into any State or Territory the laws of which prohibit the manufacture or sale therein of liquors for beverage pur-poses. Mitchell was acquitted by the United States District Court, and the De-partment of Justice has just instructed the United States District Attorney not to at-tempt an appeal of the case to the Supreme Court.

Mitchell bought a quart of whisky at Catbetteburg. Ky., and, taking a car on the Ohio Valley electric line, transported it to Kenova, W. Va., intending to carry it to his home in Republic. He knew that the law of West Virginia permitted him to do but he did not know about the "bonedry" law recently enacted by Congress for the purpose of preventing persons living in dry States from importing liquor for their own personal use.

At Kenova Mitchell was arrested by the At Renova Altenell was arrested by the authorities and indicted in the southern dis-trict of West Virginia. The case was heard bu an agreed statement of facts and there was no trial by jury. The District Judge acquitted Mitchell and held that while the bringing of the liquor into the State on his person was transportation of liquor, there was no phase of commerce connected with it and, therefore, there was no "transportation in interstate commerce" within the meaning of the "bone-dry" law.

The District Attorney proposed an imme-diate appeal of the case, in order that the United States Supreme Court might pass upon the constitutionality of the law, but the Department of Justice called a halt and directed him to drop the appeal. The de-partment took the ground that the Supreme Court was without jurisdiction, in that an appeal in such a case, it being a criminal case decided against the Government, would amount to placing the defendant in jeopardy twice, contrary to the Constitution.

Widespread interest attaches to the case, Widespread interest attaches to the case, which would indicate a disposition upon the part of the Federal Courts to construe as legal the importation personally into a dry State of liquor intended for the per-roral use of the man who brings it in. If this view is sustained, any person living in a dry State may go into a wet State and bring back with him as much liquor for his own use as the laws of his own State will permit. In West Virginia and Virginia and Virginia each person is permitted one quart of "hard" liquor a month. Other dry States have different laws.
