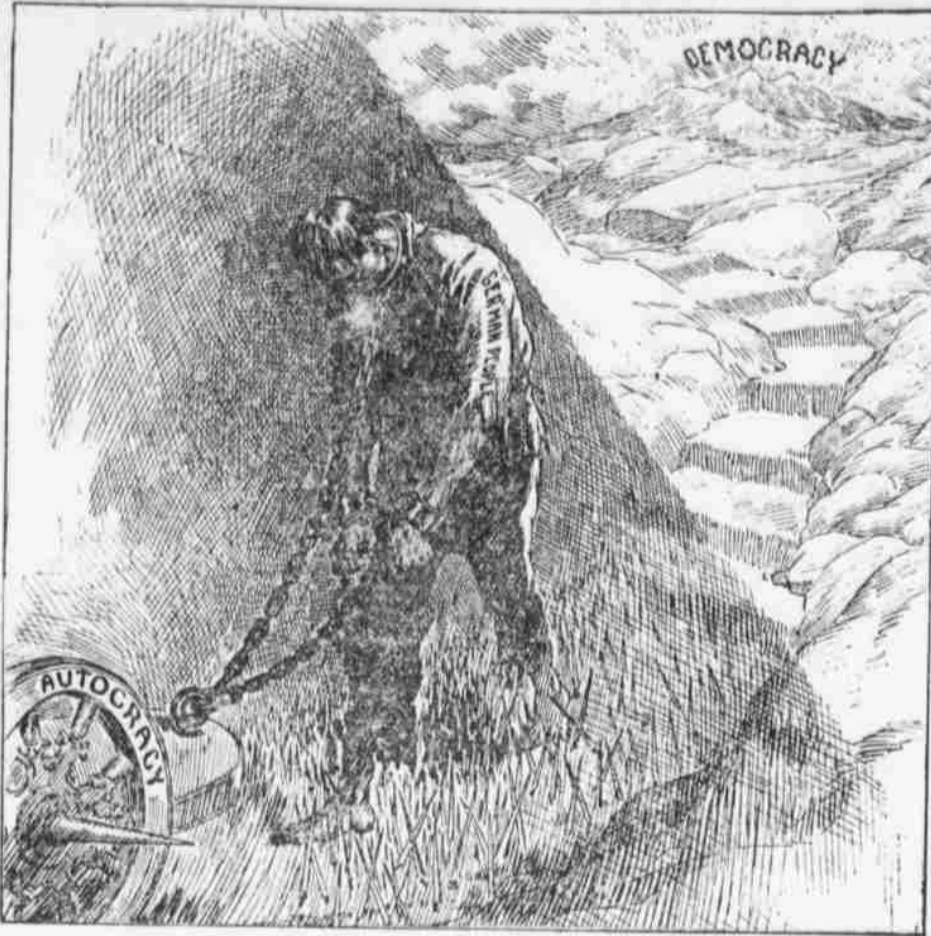

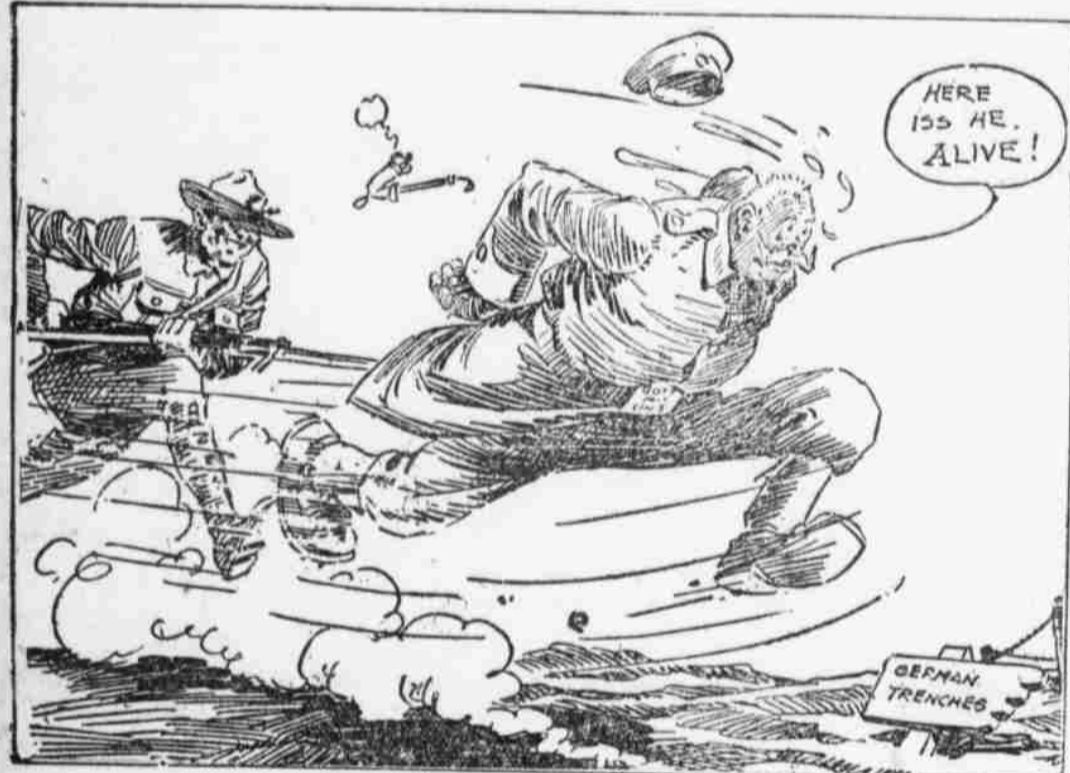

"Dear me!" said a hearer, in sympathetic tones, "and what were you in bed?"



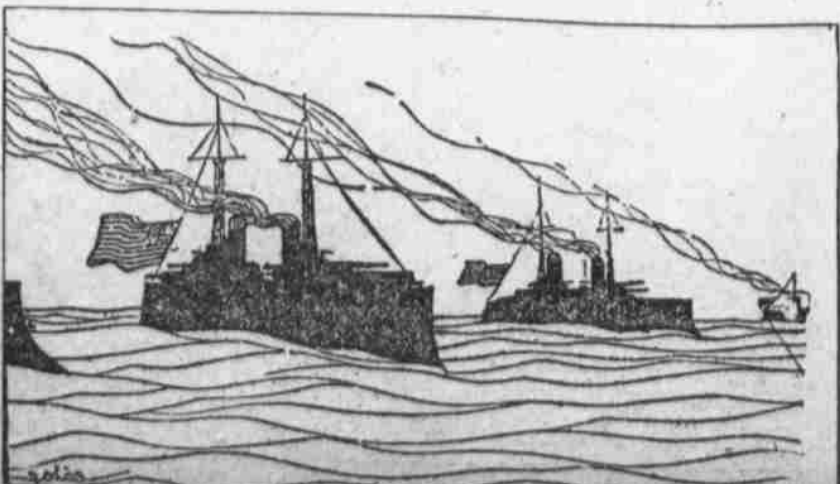
