More than 33,000 fans turned out for the third game of the series. The Giant victory brought back their confidence in McGraw's team.

Before Benton's wonderful pitching the White Sox were helpless, but even so, Benton must share the glory with Dave Robertson, for Davy made it possible for him to win and looms up as a strong candidate for the title of world's series star.

During the afternoon Robertson made three hits, and in the Sox half of the fourth he pulled off a wonderful catch, taking Gandil's fly off the right-field wall.

It was a sensational catch and the best bit of individual baseball in the game. Eddie Cicotte, hero pitcher of the first game in Chicago, was again out of luck.

John Collins was the first to face Rube Benton's southpaw slants. The first pitch was low and he let it pass for a ball.
