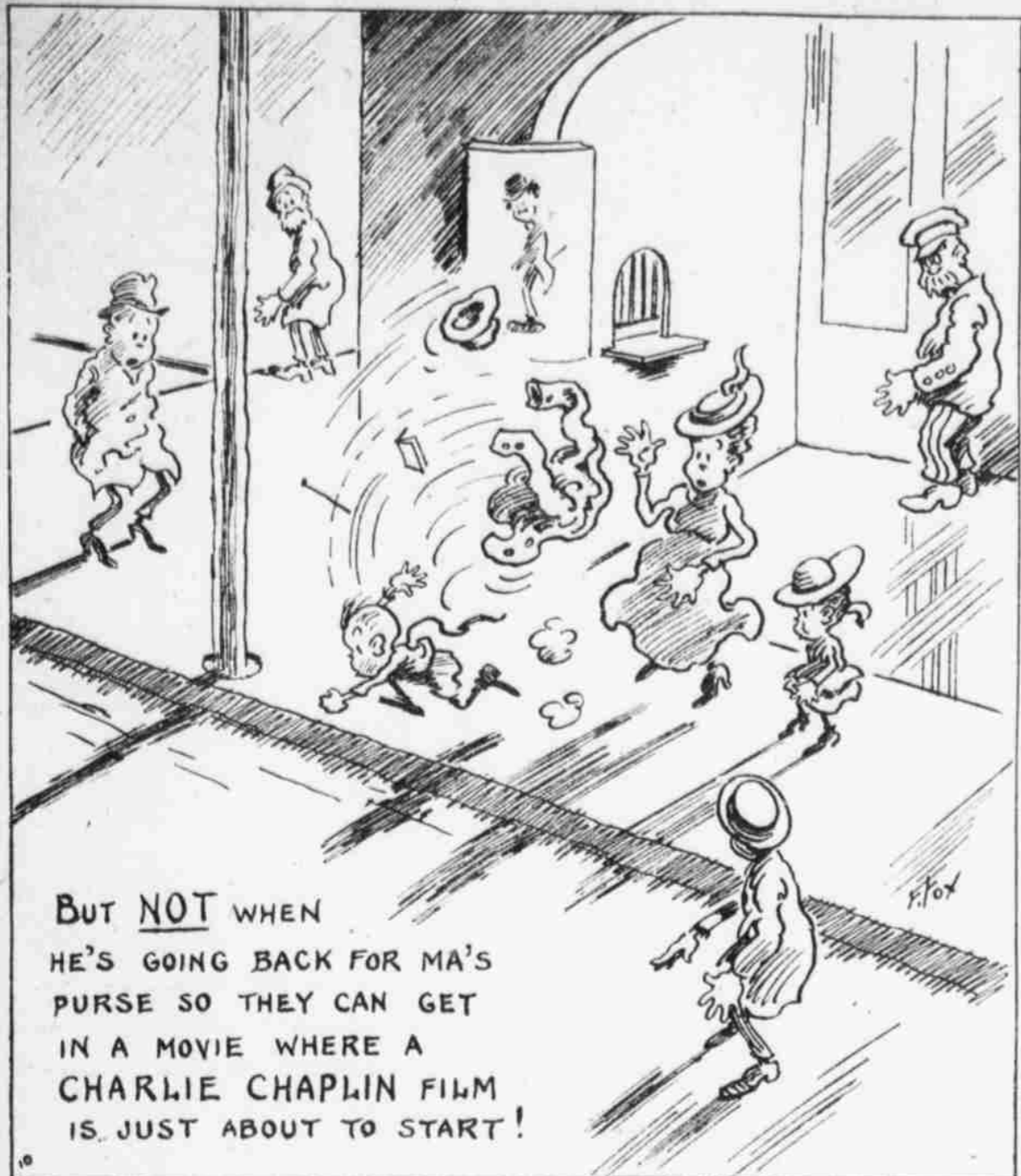




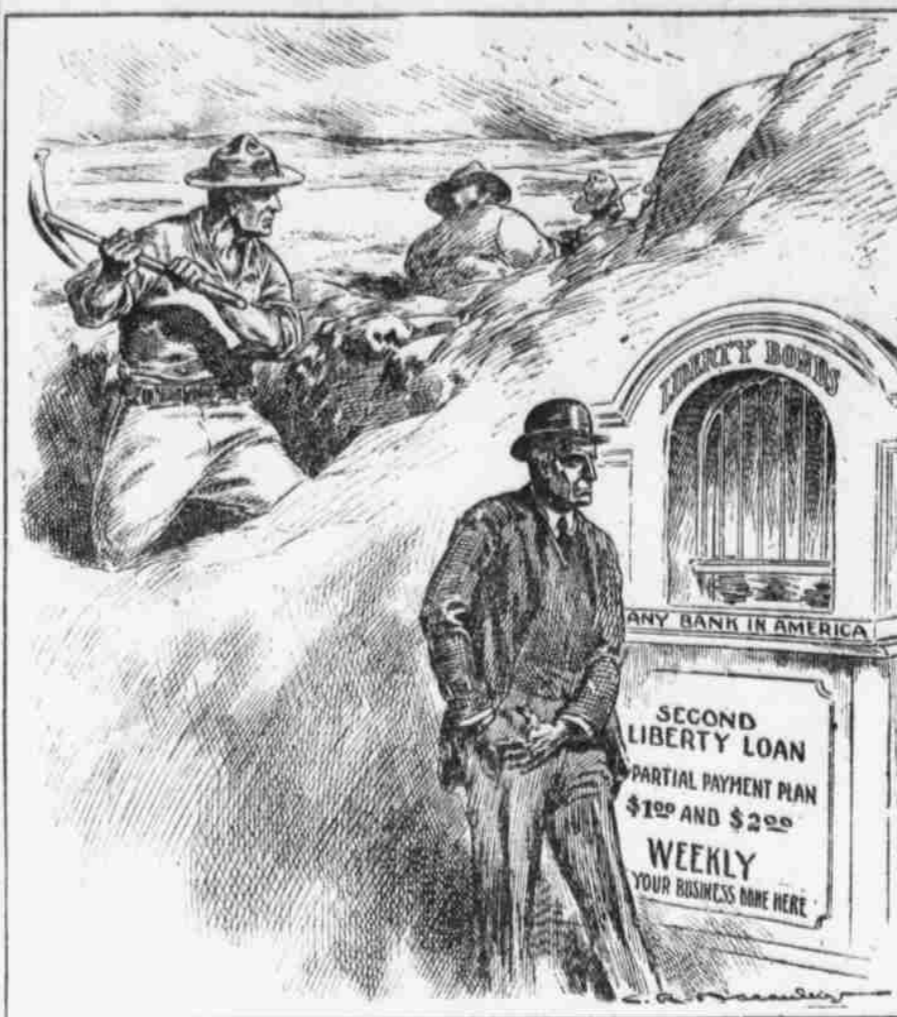

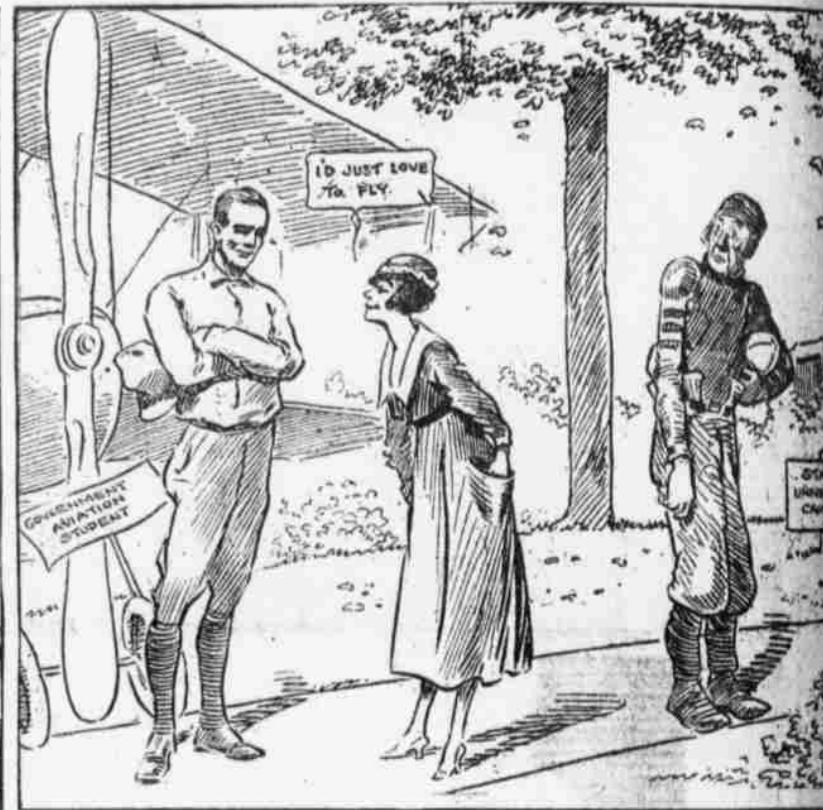
Superfluous
