SEES SIGNS OF GERMAN CHANCELLOR'S FAILURE

The Tageblatt Warns of Internal Dissension-Admits Danger of Majority Break

AMSTERDAM, Nov. 3. Although the majority of papers anticommunist to Count von Hertling, the paper 'Tageblatt' has modified their attitude in the last twenty-four hours, the Tageblatt still insists there are many outward signs of internal dissension.

"His fundamental ideas on a parliamentary system remain unaltered," says the Tageblatt. It adds that the Conservatives' attitude of reserve regarding von Hertling's foreign policy is a sign that there will be a split on other issues.

The Tageblatt admits there is danger of the present majority party breaking up in the Reichstag, when the center and right surely follow the 'Centrist Chancellor' in the party interest.

PROPOSE STEAMSHIP LINE BETWEEN U. S. AND RUSSIA

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3. -Scandinavian shipping interests have proposed a new steamship line operating between the United States and Russia, reports to the Department of Commerce.

Because of the greatly stimulated trade between the country and Russia, the Scandinavian shipping men see an opportunity to furnish shipping facilities to aid in the development of a new trade route through the north of Europe and into the port of Archangel. The Norwegian government is planning to limit to 10 per cent profits on shipping from the United States.

BRIZZLING RAIN GREETS SAMMERS IN TRENCHES

Second Batch of Americans on Firing Line Up Against Bad Weather

AMERICAN HEADQUARTERS IN FRANCE, Nov. 3. The second batch of Americans to go into the trenches are running into the same kind of wet weather that greeted the first contingent. A cold, drizzling rain began falling at noon yesterday and continued into the night. The section where the Americans are stationed has been converted into a slippery bog.

Low-hanging clouds and a heavy mist have caused much of the damage caused by the weather on both sides. At the same time this same condition has permitted working parties to repair the damage caused by previous artillery fire without much danger. The weather has been such that the fliers have not been active.

The reports to headquarters indicate that there has been no departure from the normal activities in the trenches. General Pershing returned at noon yesterday from a tour of the front. Other officers had returned earlier in the day. A party of the returned American officers went through the billets and questioned closely the Americans who had served their first time in the trenches.
