NEARLY 6000 WOMEN IN RAILROAD JOBS HERE WILSON LEADERS PLAN WORK FOR CONGRESS

FINANCIAL AID FOR RAILROADS DEMANDED FROM GOVERNMENT

Strikes Not Worrying Owners of Railroad Securities So Much as Demands for Higher Wages

It was a matter of some comment in the financial district that the railroad securities did not show any marked response to the announcement from Washington of the understanding reached between the President and the Brotherhoods that there would be no strikes called during the war.

More New Financing by Local Concerns

The declaring of an extra dividend of 2 1/2 per cent by the action of the directors of the Lackawanna Steel Company, and of the General Chemical Company of a dividend of 7 per cent on the common stock and a special dividend of 2 1/2 per cent in cash have given rise to an opinion which is quite freely expressed among the financial houses that a great many large industrial concerns will distribute at least a part of the large surpluses which they have accumulated from war business before the close of the year in order to avoid any increased taxes which Congress may impose on business during the next twelve months.
