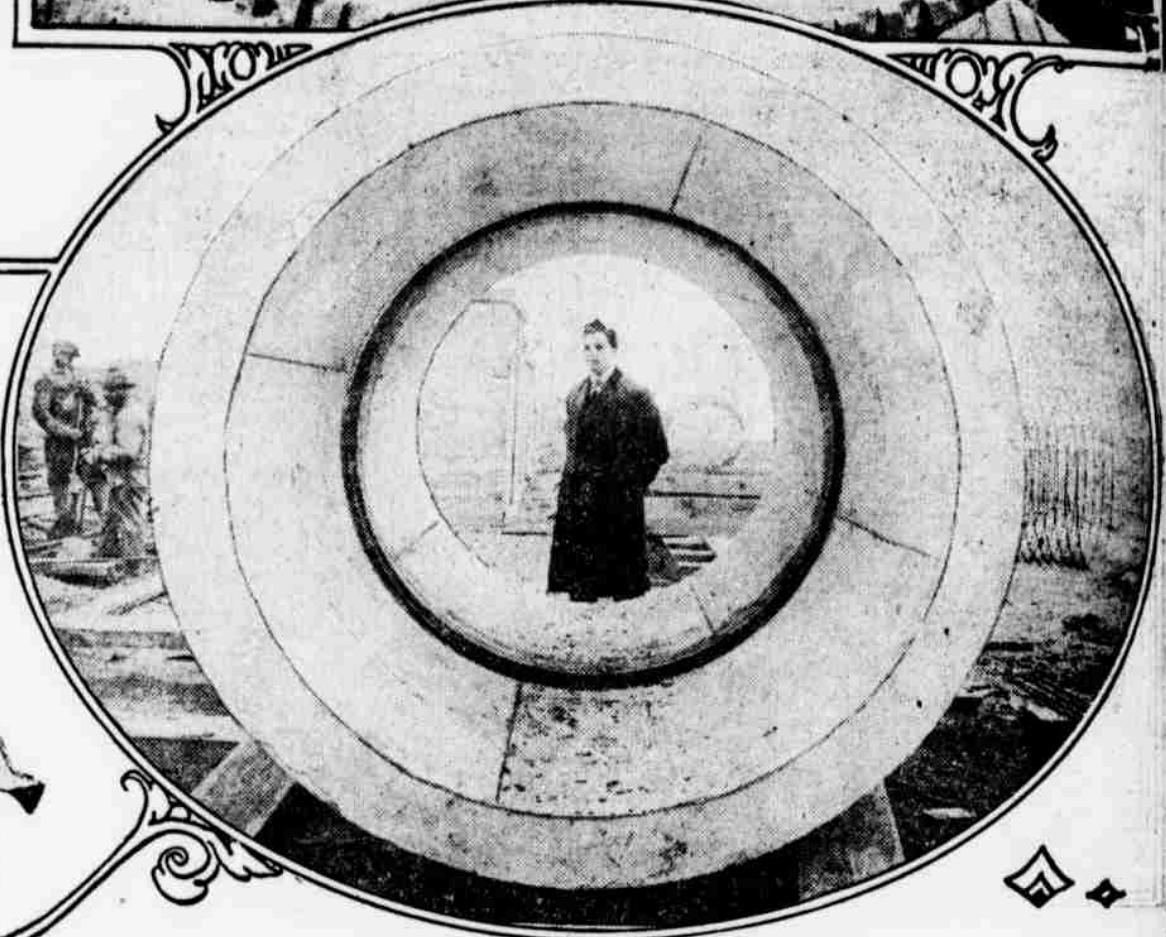
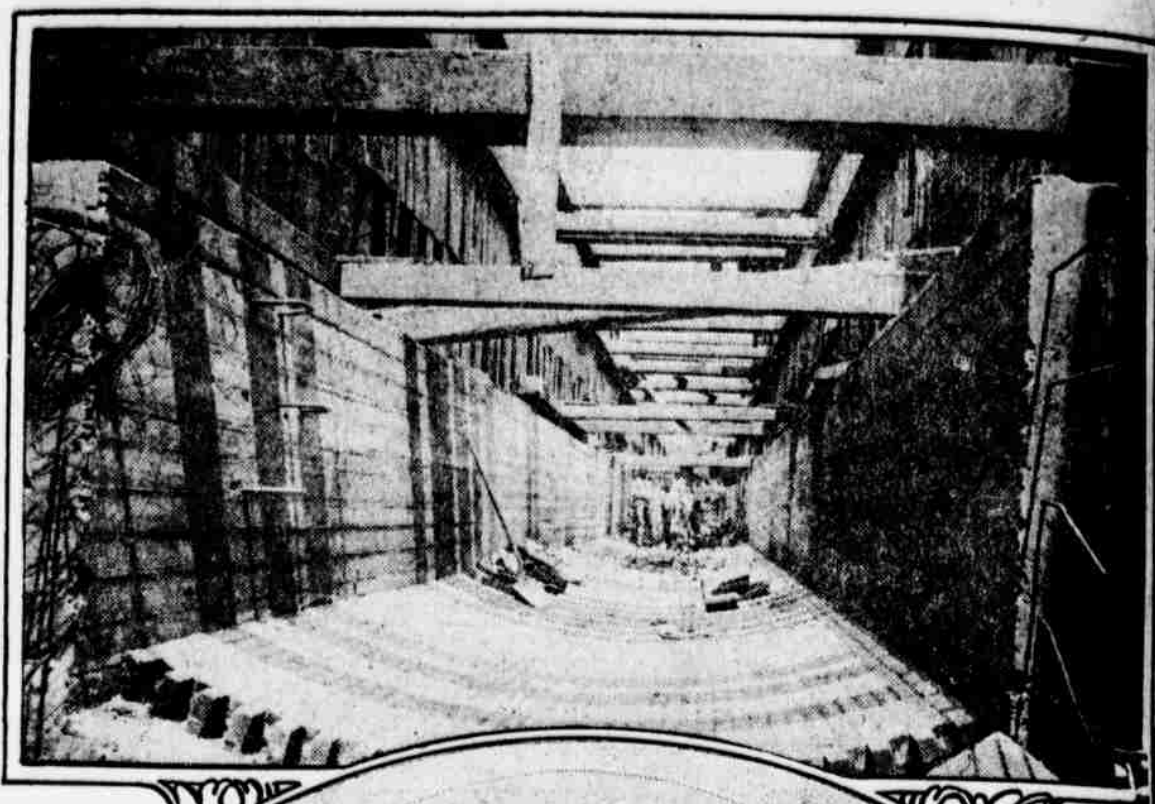

When a shack at Camp Dix was found to have been built two miles from where it was intended, fifty young huskies made the necessary transferral.



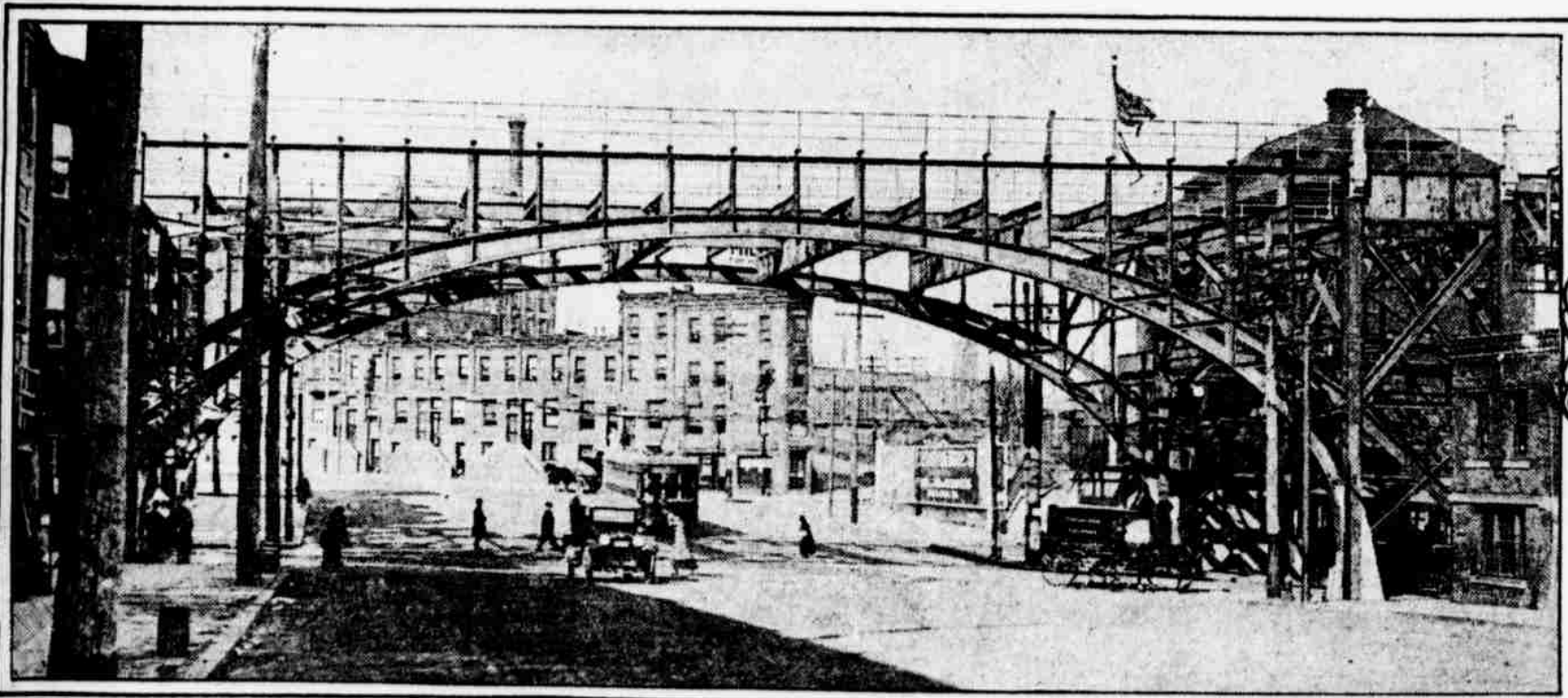
