Had they said openly that whatever money remaining after the cost of the dinner had been used was to be retained by them, how many people would have subscribed?"

Mr. Goodwin repeated that any one who wanted his money back before the dinner was supposed to be held. He asserted that the promoters had scrupulously avoided saying that the dinner was for the benefit of the Magistrate and Constables' Association. "We had to give it some sort of a name, didn't we?" he asked. "And as it was to be in honor of Magistrate Melville we called it 'The Magistrate's Dinner.' We couldn't have called it 'The Dogcatchers' Dinner,' could we?"
