

COLLEGE SPORTS TO BE DISCUSSED

Graduate Managers to Talk Over Important Matters at Conference

PENN FAVORS BASEBALL

NEW YORK, Dec. 27. College sports their continuance, improvement, or perhaps radical alteration for economic purposes during the war will be the big topic tomorrow among the college men who will gather for the annual conference of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, the scene being the Hotel Astor.

The first shot in the big conclave will be fired tonight, when the Graduate Managers' Association will meet at the Hotel Marlborough and discuss some vital recommendations to the big session tomorrow. It is proposed to recommend a curtailment of the football schedule of 1918, especially the pre-season games.

Many Representatives Expected All classes of collegians interested in amateur sports are expected to be on hand at tomorrow's session, and informally will represent the Intercollegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America, the Intercollegiate Basketball Association, the Graduate Managers' Assn., the Athletic Research Society and the Directors of Physical Culture.

Colony Pierce will also voice the views of Secretary of War Baker and Secretary Daniels, of the Navy, and as they too have put themselves on record as favoring athletic sport as a medium of training it is hard to see where the sports of the colleges are to come in for an adverse knock.

There was a report last night that if the N. C. A. A. delegates today and tomorrow are able to show the reason why Yale, Harvard and Princeton will buckle on the harness again and pressure teams for the intercollegiate.

Next in importance to the address of Colonel Pierce will be that of Dr. Harry I. Williams, a Yale graduate and now secretary manager of the University of Minnesota. He is a member of the football rules committee, and if his policy of the last season should preclude the keynote of his address he will urge a return of football activity during the season of 1918.
