NEW YEAR'S TIP FROM A "HITCHY-KOO" GIRL

Dele Winthrop Boldly Lifts Veil of Glamour From So-Called Good Fellowship

"There is nothing in being called a 'good fellow'."

This is the statement of Miss Adele Winthrop, who contributes a goodly share of the entertainment in "Hitchy-Koo" with her partner, Florence Ames.

"Good fellowship is the most overrated of virtues," she maintains; "the easiest of achievement, the cheapest of possession; that is, unless one is running a cafe or a hotel. In that case, professional good fellowship is really a matter of business. It helps sell stock across the counter."

"What becomes of the good fellow? To be sure, the sturdiest sororities of the world are not lovable, nor do they accomplish much among their fellow men, while the good fellows do cheer many a lonely hour for those down on their luck."

"It takes a brave man, sometimes, to dodge the honors that would come to him if he wished to cater to the good-fellow worshiping crowd."

The last thing the good fellows find out is that the crowd of admirers that follow in his wake have no real respect for him.

"As for women who start in with the idea of good fellowship as a star to guide them through the paths of professional life, there is only one word to say—that word is 'DON'T'."

Miss Winthrop was encouraged to give vent to her feelings about the "good fellowship" in the dressing room of the chorus girls with "Hitchy-Koo" during a discussion of resolutions for the New Year. It was a lively discussion, and immediately brought intensity into the conversation while Raymond Hitchcock was out on the stage.

VIVID WAR STORIES BY CAPTAIN FALLON

Daring British Officer to Describe European Drama at Academy on Thursday

The general public will have an opportunity at the Academy of Music, Thursday evening, January 3, to hear Captain David Fallon, M. C., tell the thrilling story of his experiences with the British and Australian forces at Gallipoli and in the trenches of Belgium and northern France.

Captain Fallon is not a novice in the war game. He has served under the British colors for thirteen years, and during that time has seen service in China, India, South Africa, the Dardanelles and on the western European front. He can exhibit the scars of fifteen wounds. The bomb that ended his active career, as a soldier was, strangely enough, thrown by himself. It had been hurled at him by a German, and in attempting to throw it back at the enemy before it exploded he was caught in the fireback and terribly maimed. For three days and nights he lay in a shell hole in No Man's Land. The story of Captain Fallon's efforts to prolong his life until rescue reached him is one of the most thrilling personal incidents of the war. For this exploit he was given the Military Cross by King George.

Captain Fallon calls his graphic talk "Fighting Through Hell." Pictures taken on the fighting front serve to illustrate many of the incidents of the story.
