HONOR FOR PHILADELPHIAN

CLEVELAND, O., Jan. 11.—Formal charges of murder were lodged today against Elmer Hupp, wealthy oil promoter, who late last night shot and killed Charles L. Joyce, also wealthy. Hupp returned unexpectedly from a business trip to Chicago and found Joyce in his home at Lakewood, a fashionable Cleveland suburb. Joyce lived at Bratenhall, a district known as "The Millionaire Colony," which, although within the city limits, is a separate municipality. He was connected with a New York clothing firm.
