Routes for Pleasure Travel Must Give Way to Pressing Needs PLANS BEING PREPARED

TRENTON, Jan. 11.—Designation of the first route to be constructed in the State highway system has been deferred by the State Highway Commission because of the absence of a quorum. It was announced, however, that after conferences with Governor Edger the commission has decided to undertake first the construction of trunk roads most used for commercial purposes and those of the greatest military importance. This means that the popular routes for pleasure travel must give way to the more pressing needs for adequate transportation facilities.

Post Wheeler Is Improving

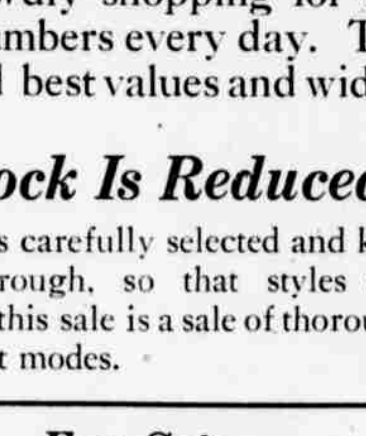
Post Wheeler, former charge d'affaires of the American embassy at Tokyo, who has been in the Japanese Hospital for the last week, is reported to be improving today.
