

MAJOR EDMUNDS EAGER TO SERVE GOVERNMENT

Discharge From Army Puts No Damper on Enthusiasm of Former Commissioner

Former United States Commissioner Charles W. Edmunds, who with eight other army officers, has been honorably discharged from the service for physical disability, said today that he was ready to give his services to the Government in any branch he may designate.

Mr. Edmunds was a major in the 165th Engineer Corps of Pennsylvania, which is now stationed at Camp Hancock. The eight other officers included with Mr. Edmunds were commissioned from the National Guard of Pennsylvania.

"I am so glad that I can't go to the other side after my discharge," said Mr. Edmunds, today, at his home, 808 North Broad street, "but I am ready to give my service in any branch that the Government may designate."
