McAdoo Names Men to Divert Traffic to Southern Ports

FUEL CRISIS GROWS Further Shutdown Periods Expected This Month as Tie-Up Increases

A traffic investigation committee to divert freight from congested gateways was appointed today by Director General McAdoo.

The national railroad faces its greatest crisis of the winter in the East today. Renewed heavy snows and bitter cold sweeping through districts already staggering under coal and food lack has paralyzed the great transportation system to the danger point.

It has resulted in continuing the workless Monday order, which it had been hoped could be revoked this week. It has opened up the possibility of further shutdown holidays with February 9-12 and 22-25 the four-day periods for closing under consideration.

TRAINS STILL SUFFER WITH 'ENGINE TROUBLE'

Conditions Little Improved and Many Passenger Schedules Are Consolidated

'Engine trouble'—details not specified, but supposed to convey the idea of general disability due to the cold wave of yesterday—is given as the reason for continued delays in schedules on the railroads out of Philadelphia, and conditions, so far as passenger traffic is concerned, are only slightly improved today.

The 7 o'clock, 8 o'clock and 9 o'clock trains for New York on the Pennsylvania Railroad this morning were consolidated, one train leaving at 9:45 o'clock taking the passengers for all three.
