

PAN-GERMAN WAR UPON SOCIALISTS

Mailed Fist, Having Crushed Labor Outbreak, Finds New Foe

MASSES STILL BITTER

ZURICH, Feb. 6. "Of 300,000 workers striking in Berlin on Friday 130,000 have resumed work," Wolf's Agency declared today.

AMSTERDAM, Feb. 6. The Pan-Germans (nationalists) have openly declared war on the Socialists in Germany, according to a copy of the Vorwarts received today from Berlin.

A virtual military dictatorship exists in Germany, but chiefly in Berlin, where the Socialist-labor movement was attempted during the recent agitation.

The Pan-German press is jubilant over the "victory" of the militarists and of the collapse of the Socialists.

At the same time the militarists and the newspapers are striving to belittle the influence of the Socialist bloc in the Reichstag before that body convenes later this month.

The Vorwarts senses this current of bitterness. In its comment upon the important council now being held in Berlin the result of which might interest the Reichstag, it says:

"But, of course, the Reichstag has gone to bed and pulled the covers over its head, so it can see nothing and hear nothing. We may rest assured it will do nothing to inconvenience diplomacy."

The Bavarian Ministry of War, in order to punish the strike in the country, has ordered all factories engaged on war work to operate seven days a week.

The general strike of workers of the Central Powers showed the world they did not want a peace of unexcuses, Wilhelm Dittmann, Socialist member of the German Reichstag, declared during his court-martial Monday. It was learned here today.

"The strike broke out because a prolonged state of siege makes life unbearable," asserted Dittmann, "and on account of the agitation by the Pathfinders and Pan-Germans."

"The strike had a demonstrative value, in showing the world we workers only want a peace with no annexations."

The transit committee of the Civic Club has denounced the transit conditions as chaotic and will recommend that the club join in any protest or other movement that offers hope of curing the situation.

In the meantime cars continue to run off schedule, to skirt past intersections when they are only half filled, to stop when they are jammed to capacity.

Apparently seeing the handwriting on the wall—the public determined to stand conditions no longer—Thomas E. Mitten, the \$100,000 a year "efficiency" president, called a conference of his operating heads.

The transit committee of the Civic Club has joined in the city-wide protest against the collapsing trolley system.

At a meeting of the committee in the club's quarters at 1230 Spruce street the women individually denounced the transit situation as deplorable, miserable, intolerable and chaotic.

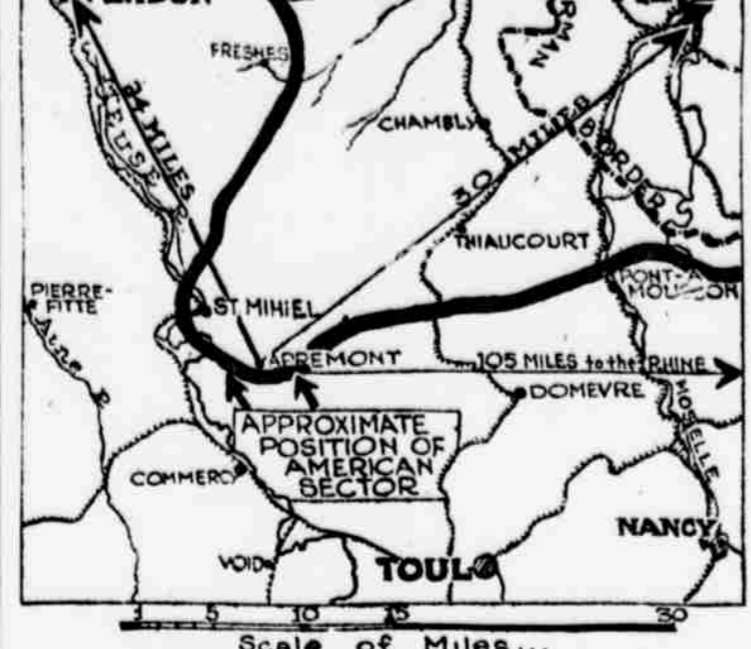
