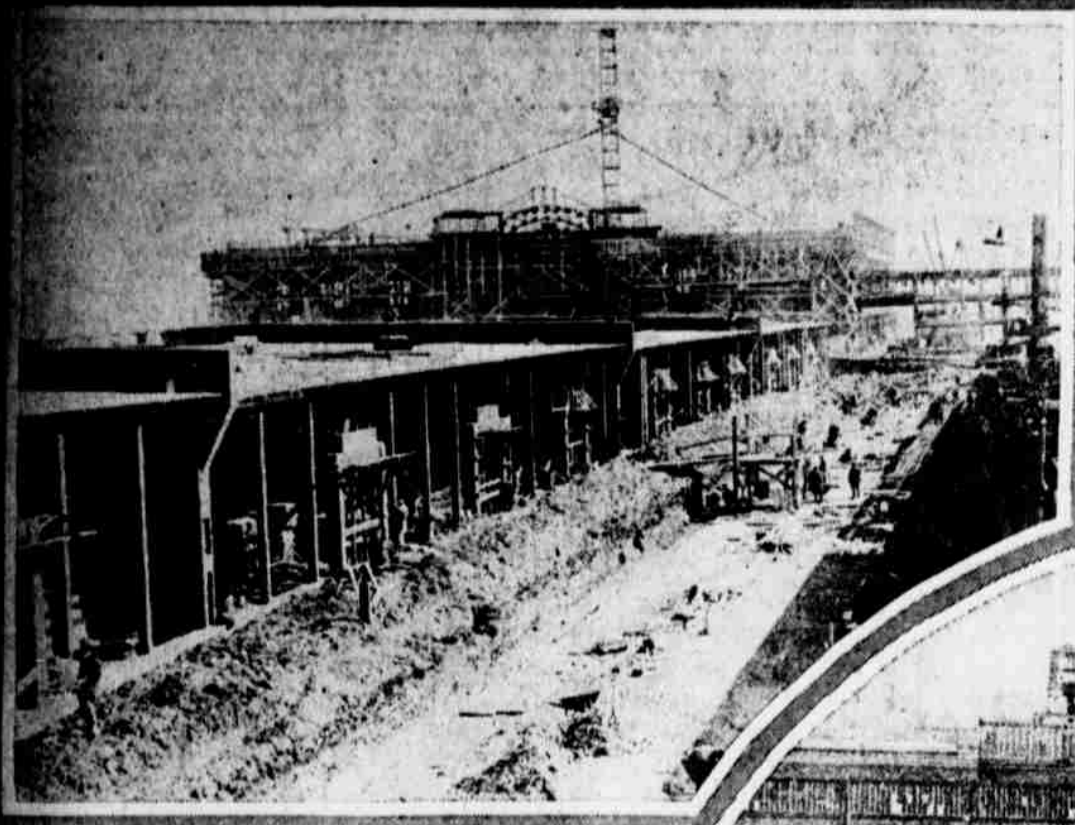


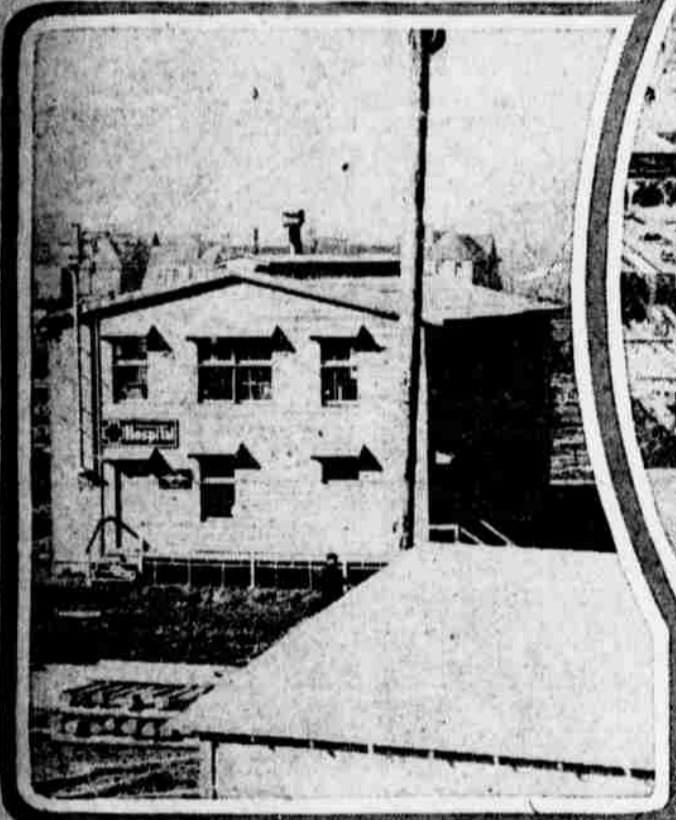
Immense War Projects Engage Energy of Uncle Sam In Philadelphia



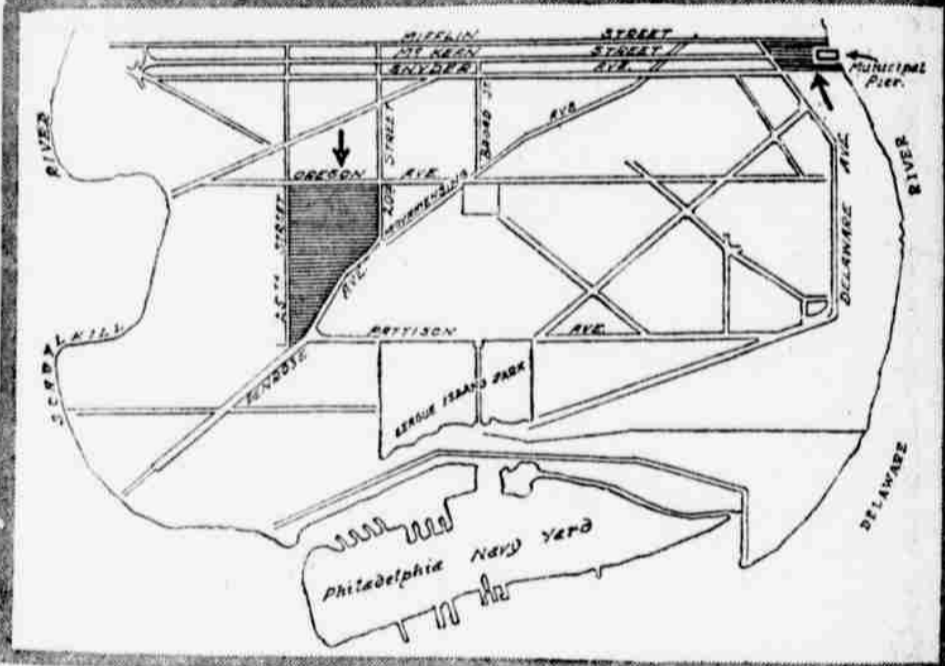
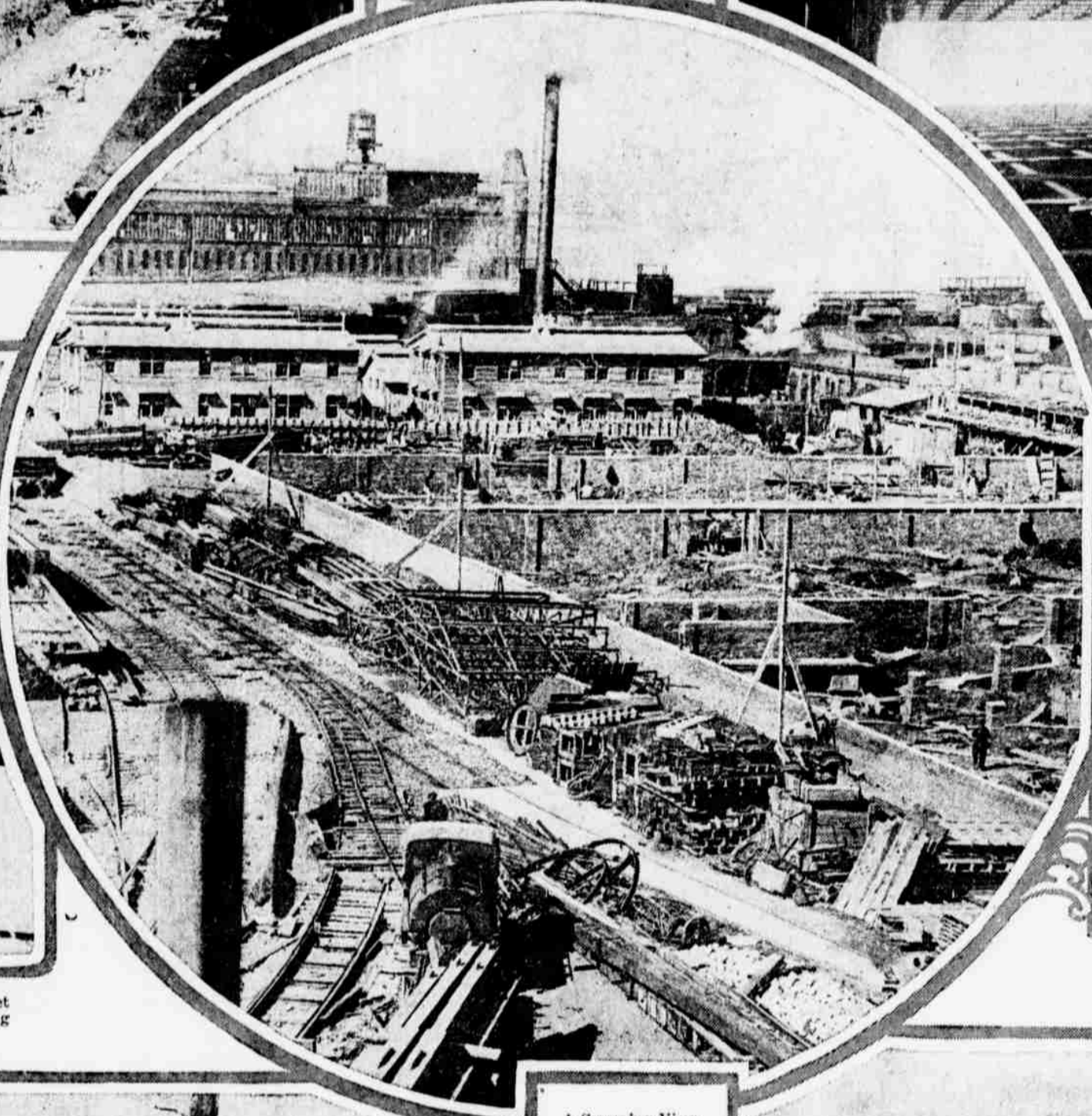
At the Foot of McKean Street, in the Shadow of the Municipal Pier, a Great Shipping Terminal for Overseas Supplies Is in Course of Construction.



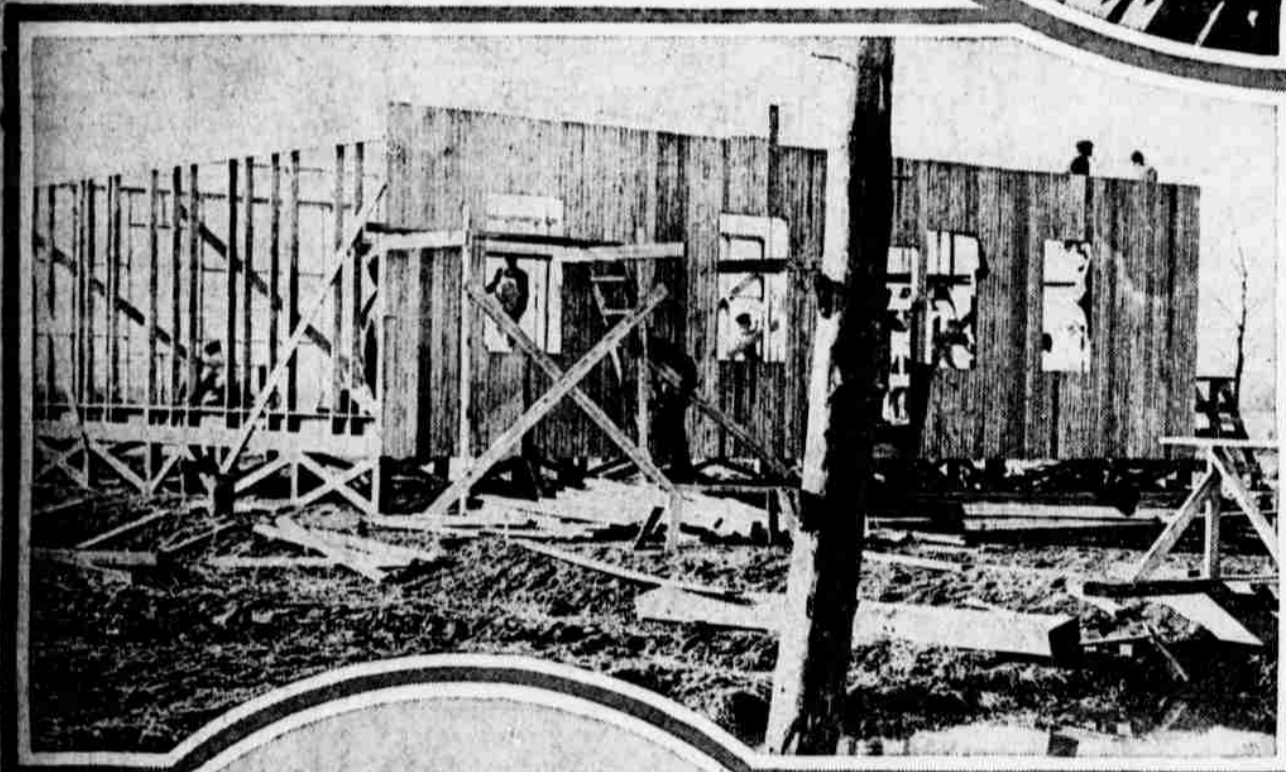

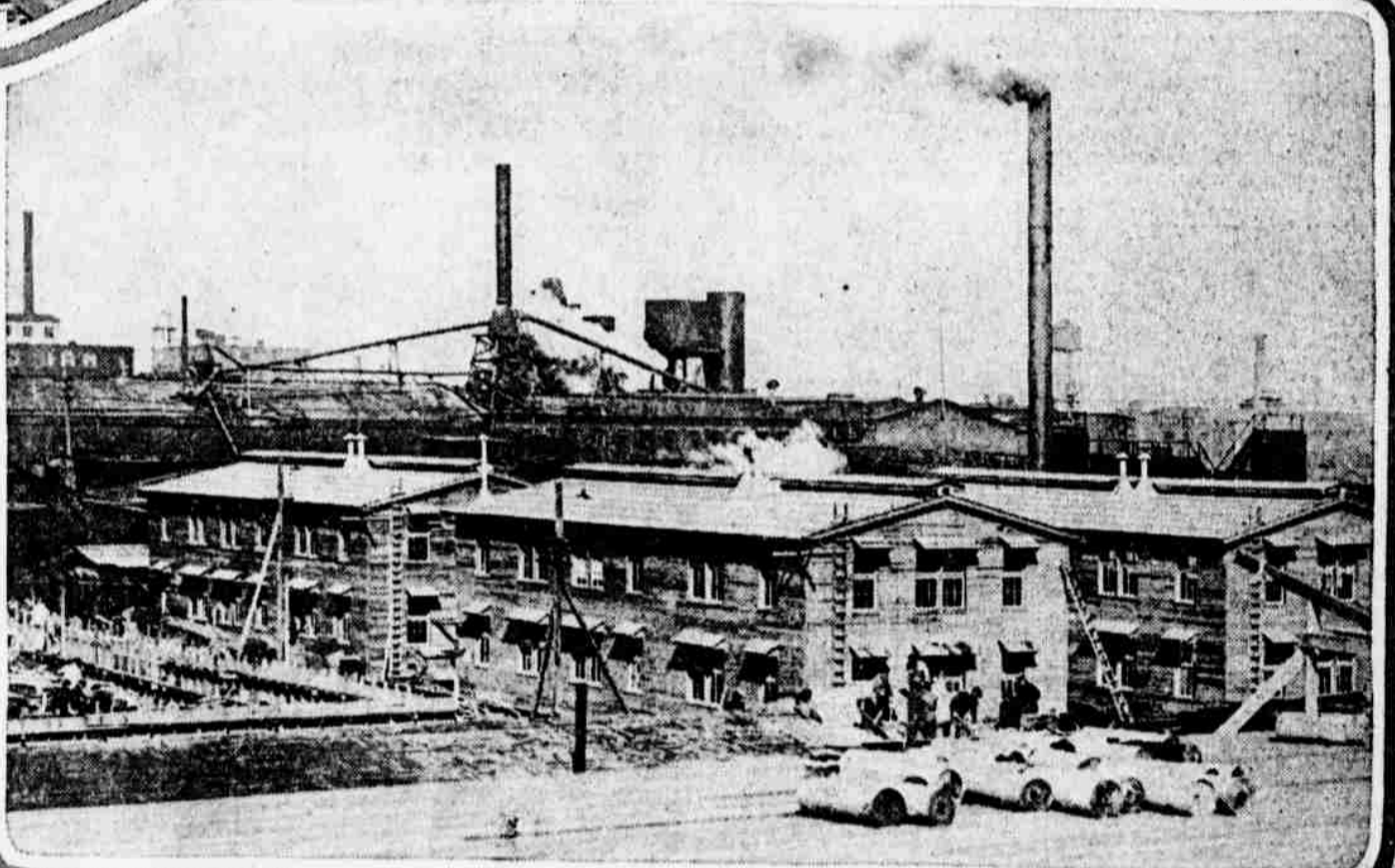
South of Oregon Avenue and West of Twentieth Street a Second Supply Depot Is Arising. The First Building to Go Up Was the Hospital, Shown Above.

Proof of the Material Progress Already Made on the United States Government's Great Overseas Shipping Terminal Is the Above Photograph. From Twentieth Street to Twenty-fifth Street and From the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad to Penrose Avenue Immense Storehouses, Such as Above, Are Arising. Within Ninety Days the Depot Will Be Completed at an Expenditure of \$4,000,000 and the Labor of 3000 Workers.
