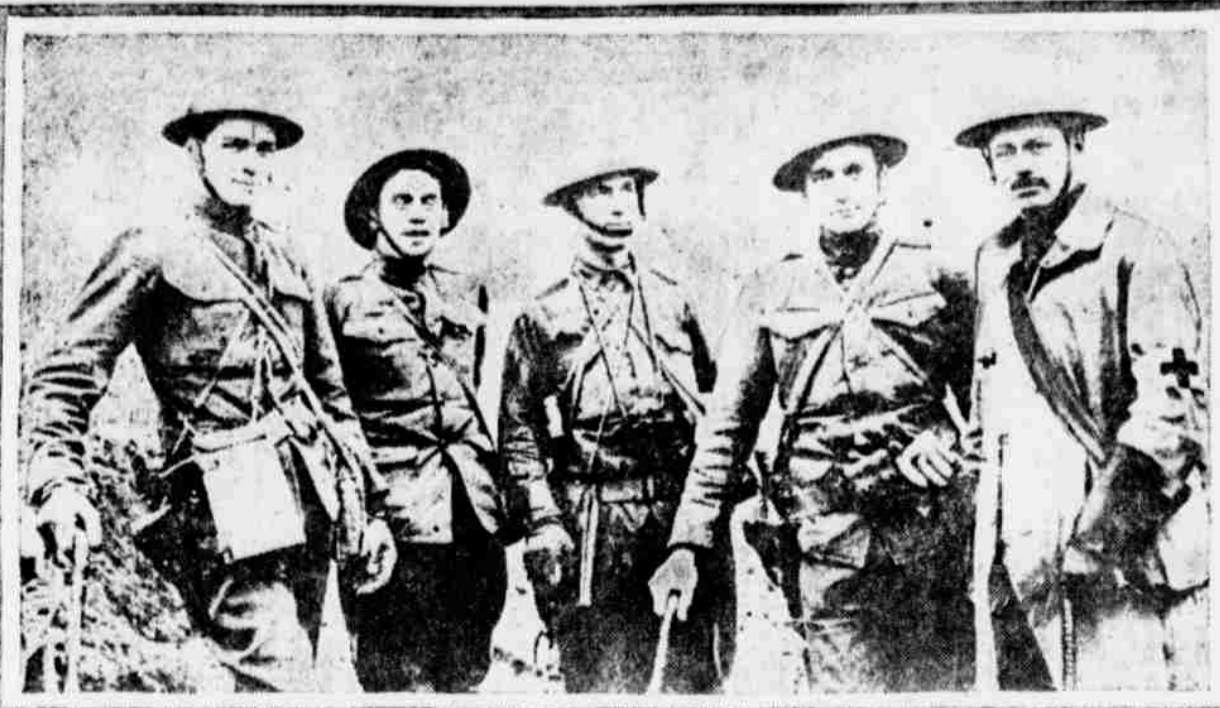


We remarked to the young lady across the way that after a young woman's surface from her room in his bed, he had a hold-up.

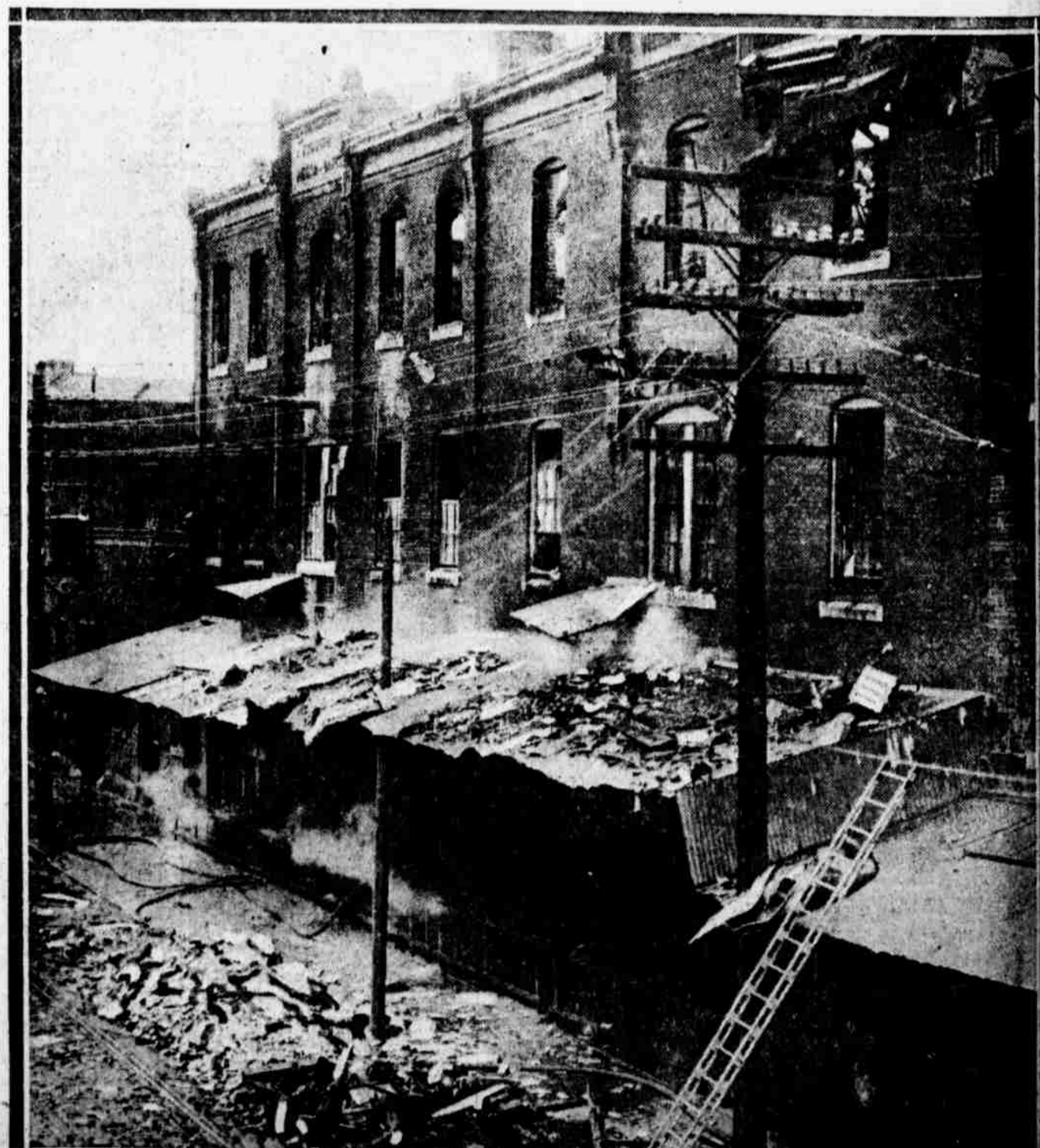
A Sign Marks the Spot Where the First American Officer—Lieutenant De Vere H. Harden, of the Signal Corps—Was Wounded in France.
