Washington, March 18. Society generally, with the diplomatic and Administration circles in particular, is much interested in the supposed intention of Miss Margaret Wilson to continue her particular war work in France.

PLAN TO PLANT WHEAT ON JERSEY ESTATES

Propose to Plant Spring Crop as Aid to Nation's Needs

Trenton, March 18. While New Jersey is not primarily a wheat-producing State and virtually all of the wheat grown here has been of the winter varieties, it has developed in the present war emergency that spring wheat may have an important place on many Jersey farms, according to an announcement today from the State Agricultural College.

It also was said that this would be especially true of the large tracts in the northern half of the State, which are not ordinarily planted for crops, and that owners of many extensive estates are willing to turn over a good portion of their property for wheat so they might add something to the total output, with no compensation to themselves.

The college also suggests the growing of spring barley in the northern counties, where it is said that thorough and early preparation can be given and a maximum acreage of corn has already been given attention in the plan.
