#### KANE IS SKEPTICAL OF FLASK SALE BAN

Federal District Attorney Fears Liquor Dealers' Action Won't End Bootlegging

DRY ZONE YET POSSIBLE

Gratified at Attitude of Saloonmen, but Warns of Possible Further Embarge

Following the decision of the Retail Liquor Dealers' Association to eliminate so sale of whisky in pints and baifpints over the burs, United States District Attorney Kane today expressed himself as skeptical of the efficacy of this method of attack upon "bootleg-

this method of attack upon "bootleg-fing" to men in uniform.

While the District Attorney expresses
himself as being pleased with the de-cision and attitude of the liquor men,
he issued a warning today that there
was no agreement between himself and
the dealers and that the establishment
of a dry zone in this city is still a posshilly.

And Mr. Kane adds that he had requested the liquor men to prohibit the sale of either beer or liquor in any shape for consumption outside the place where

It is sold.

"I have not as yet made any decision about the dry zone." he said today.

"Still, the possibility of establishing a dry zone cannot be made public at this time, for the reason that my actions will be governed by local conditions in

the immediate future. If they warrant a dry zone it will be established.

"While I am gratified and happy ever the dicision of the liquor men, I had asked that no beer or liquor in any form be sold for outside consumption. P-must warn that I have no agreement with the liquor men and that my hands are free in the matter to do as I see fit and as seems best.

"If violations of the order prohibiting the sale of liquor to men in uniform conthe sale of liquor to men in uniform con-tinue, there shall continue the arrests as they have been made in the past. 
