The summer anthracite coal prices that will become effective Monday, under orders of the fuel administration, are: Pea coal, \$7.50 to \$8.25 a ton. Nut coal, \$8.85 to \$9.75 a ton. Egg coal, \$8.50 to \$9.30 a ton.

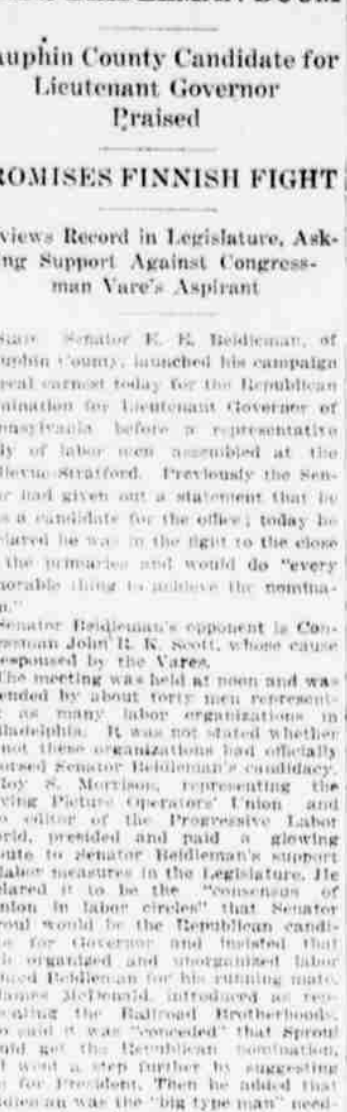

TO CONTINUE MONDAY

Price-Fixing Measure and Compulsory Food Saving Bill Discarded

Washington, March 29.—A one-day armistice was in effect in the Senate today after a week of the bitter fighting over the price-fixing bill.

Two Administration bills, described two months ago as "imperatively necessary to the successful prosecution of the war," were in the danger today.

When the compulsory food conservation bill was introduced, Food Administrator Hoover hurried to the Capitol and asserted that delay in enacting it into law would seriously endanger the success of his food program.
