

SLAVS' WARSHIPS SUNK TO FOIL FOE

Vessels Facing Capture by Teutons in Finland Blown Up

INVASION BY 10,000

Finn Officers, Openly Pro-German, Insult Americans and British in Public

London, April 5.—Russian naval commanders have blown up their warships, including four submarines, in the harbor of Hangö, Finland, to balk their capture by the Germans, Petrograd dispatches say.

Thirty German transports have disembarked troops at Hangö, which is on the southern coast of Finland, south-east of Helsinki.

The Bolshevik commissary for Finnish affairs reports that M. d'Almeida, the Belgian minister to Russia, has been wounded by Government troops while attempting to pass into the rebel lines.

The German force landed at Hangö comprises 40,000 men under General Sannitz, according to a Copenhagen dispatch.

The artillery equipment of the force is 360 guns, with 2000 machine guns.

The Finnish White Guards are reported to have captured the eastern part of Tammerfors, notwithstanding a desperate resistance, and captured a thousand prisoners and a quantity of locomotives, weapons and provisions.

The reports from Swedish correspondents contain stories of terrible atrocities committed by Bolshevik guards. The bodies of scores of White Guards have been found mutilated in indescribable fashion.

The Bolsheviks also accuse the White Guards of atrocities. Correspondents with General Mannerheim's army admit that the Bolshevik leaders are regarded as murderers and are shot when captured. It is frequently the case, they are found in possession of ammunition bullets, they are used in executing them.

The American and British army officers who recently visited General Mannerheim, the Finnish White Guard leader, upon orders from their Stockholm legation, were treated and threatened with personal violence by Finnish officers in a hotel restaurant in Vaasa, according to a report from the war correspondent in Finland of a Swedish newspaper.

The correspondent, who occupied an adjoining table, says that the two British officers, wearing the army uniforms of their rank, entered the restaurant at a time when it was crowded with Finnish officers, mainly from the eastern front, who had served in Germany. The visitors had scarcely had time to order their meal before a Finnish officer approached the table and told them their presence was not desired. He withdrew, however, when he was shown a pass from General Mannerheim.

Later another Finn asked the orchestra to play "Die Wacht am Rhein." Everybody arose, the American and the Englishman, plainly desiring to avoid threatened violence, also rising. A Finnish officer, continuing the conversation, answered to the table and said:

"It is our principle not to sit in the same room with Englishmen."

The American replied that he was an American, not an Englishman, but the Finn responded:

"It's all the same; you have just ten minutes to get out of the house."

The visitors, who had finished their meal, left the room accompanied by insults from the Finnish officers.

M. Sarlo, the White Government's Foreign Minister and a noted pro-German, sat at a nearby table. The correspondent says, and made no effort to protect them, although they were traveling on a special diplomatic pass from his own Government.

American and Swedish, who have recently been in Finland, declare the incident given is typical of the existing feeling among the great majority of the Finns with whom they came in contact. German doctrines are being spread among the White army forces, especially by Finnish soldiers who have returned from Germany and have been appointed commissioned or noncommissioned officers in General Mannerheim's army.

GERMAN ARMIES NOW IMPERIL BOLSHIEVKA

London, April 5.—The capture by the Germans of Pultava, seventy miles southwest of Kiev, has made the position of the Bolshevik detachments opposing them more serious.

The Germans are conducting an offensive against Kiev, from Pultava and Voronezh, employing large detachments which already have occupied Kharkov, forty miles from Kiev.

The correspondent also says the Germans have seized at Pultava 50,000 tons of grain which they are exporting to Germany.

MACKENSEN SPEEDS WITH AUSTRO-GERMAN FORCES FROM RUMANIA TO ITALIAN FRONT

New Drive Impends, Rome Official Dispatches to Washington Indicate

Offensive Before the End of Picardy Battle, Forecast of Col. Repington

Washington, April 5. Transfer of all the Austro-German forces formerly in Rumania under General Mackensen to the Italian front is reported in official dispatches from Rome. It is declared that a drive still impends in Italy and that the enemy evidently is only awaiting favorable weather conditions.

Italian military critics are of the opinion that the Austro-German drive will be against the mountain line. Aviators report that large bodies have been transferred from the Piave line to the mountain zone by the Austrians.

New Fortifications. It is reported that lately the Austrians have undertaken the construction of new fortifications along the Livenza and the Tagliamento Rivers, adopting a new system consisting of points of support with several batteries, machine guns and the civilian population of the invaded Italian provinces have been compelled to work on these fortifications.

Military critics in Italy believe that reason for delay in the Austro-German drive is that the Austrians are loath to begin until the issue of the German in France is certain.
