

COUNTY SCHOOL HEADS CHOSEN BY DIRECTORS

Hot Fight in Wilkes-Barre, Where Frank P. Hopper Is Re-elected HAS SERVED 19 YEARS

Present Officials Largely Victorious in Contests for Superintendencies

Wilkes-Barre, Pa., April 9. Frank P. Hopper, who has been superintendent of schools in Luzerne County for nineteen years, has been re-elected for another term of four years.

April 10.—Mervin J. Wetzman, for a number of years assistant county superintendent of schools, was elected county superintendent to succeed Alvin Rupp, who retired after twenty-five years' service.

April 10.—In a close contest in the annual convention of the Cumberland County School Directors' Association, Prof. J. Kelso Green was again elected as head of the Cumberland County Schools, defeating T. Ralph Jacoby, superintendent of the Mechanicsburg schools, who was an applicant for the post.

West Chester, Pa., April 10.—At the convention of the directors of the public schools of Chester County, Prof. Thomas A. Beck, of this place, was re-elected county superintendent, defeating George W. Moore, of Erieville, former superintendent, by a vote of 141 to 121.

Reading, Pa., April 10.—County Schools Superintendent Ell M. Rapp was elected for four years, after serving thirty-two years continuously, receiving 215 votes to 50 for Warren M. Holder of Bethel, Rapp's only rival.

Chambersburg, Pa., April 10.—Louis Edgar Smith, of Greencastle, was re-elected county superintendent of Franklin County for the fourth term at a salary of \$2500 and was given a clerk. There were three other candidates.

Dauphin, Pa., April 10.—On the tenth ballot Montour County directors elected Fred W. Diehl, a member of the Quakertown High School faculty, as superintendent of schools of Montour County.

Only Thorough Prohibitionists to Get Help at Polls

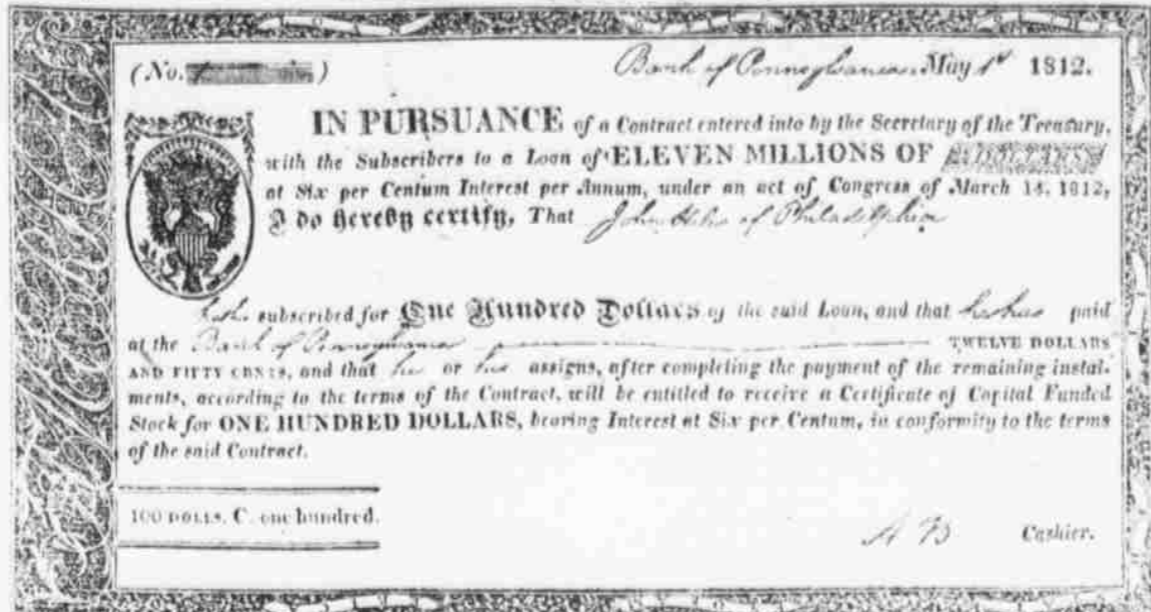
Harrisburg, April 10.—The Carlisle Presbytery has passed resolutions that would not endorse any candidates for State office but actively in favor of national prohibition.
