JAPANESE-GERMAN PACT CALLED ABSURD

Viscount Ishii, New Ambassador, Declares Nipponese Are All for Allies
A Pacific Post, April 16.—Viscount Ishii, successor to Count Satō as Japanese ambassador to the United States, has arrived here on route to Washington. Discussing the suggested Japanese activities in Siberia, Ambassador Ishii said that if the Imperial Japanese Government deemed it necessary to undertake the sending of a military expedition into Siberia, such intention would be for the benefit of the Entente Allies and not for Japan.

In the Loggi basin one of our patrols attacked a machine-gun emplacement, destroying its garrison and capturing the gun. One of our reconnoitering parties took a few prisoners in the Orto Valley. On the Asiago plateau we repulsed enemy patrols with grenades. North of Cortellazzo we dispersed strong hostile detachments.
