

GOSSIP OF THE STREET MARKET HELD STRONG ENOUGH TO WITHSTAND EVEN A DEFEAT

Brokers Doubt if German Victory Would Produce Serious Breach in Prices, but Allied Success Would Bring Big Rise

SO LONG as the war dominates the business of the world as it does it must necessarily dominate the stock market, in the opinion most frequently expressed in the financial districts these days.

When business gets brisk again in the stock market the heaviest buying will be in rails, according to the views of a well-known broker. Nearly every railroad in the country, he said, is guaranteed larger earnings under Government control than it was able to make in 1917.
