

IRISH QUIT WORK IN DRAFT PROTEST

One-Day Strike Voted by Trade Unions to Resist Conscription

MILITARY TAKE CONTROL

London, April 23.—The principal Irish railways, the post office and the telephones exchanges have been placed under military control, according to the correspondent at Cork of the Daily Chronicle. It is added that the police on Saturday removed all arms and ammunition from gunsmiths in Dublin, where it is reported that similar action will be taken throughout Ireland.

Belfast, April 23.—Various trade unions have determined to abstain from all work today as a protest against enrollment and an evidence of their purpose to resist it.

Public housekeepers were told by police and militiamen that there would be no deliveries today. Tramway and railway workers' organizations have decided to stop work, as well as engineers, carpenters, tailors, drapers, bakers, blacksmiths, etc. Railways' men's organizations said to number many members, including station masters and clerks, have come to the same conclusion.

As far as trade union labor is able to do, its influence over its members, who are on a general holiday. No attempt to stop tramways and trams has ever completely succeeded in Belfast, but this is the first time any man has been able to hold such a strike and pass approval. The strike is not a strike in any ordinary sense, but a demonstration with a political object.

The Dublin corporation yesterday exercised approval of the decision of its members to abstain from all work in the city if lights by municipal electric power in the idle day may mean that there will be no electric lights until midnight tonight. The fact that the strike will continue is expected to mar the Pan-American races, the great trials of which are to be held on the 24th.

The covenant to resist the imposition of conscription by all possible means has been administered by priests and subscribed by hundreds of thousands of men. From every Catholic church in America, the subject of discipline and the action of the bishops and their leaders was explained; leaders seem to have occurred, either in the pledge-taking meetings or at numerous political gatherings at which conscription was denounced in strong language.

LIBERTY LOAN STARTS ON THE SECOND HALF

Actual Subscriptions Total \$56,709,900, With Two Districts "Over the Top"

Washington, April 23.—Actual subscriptions to the Third Liberty Loan went well over the half mark when it was announced at the Treasury Department today that \$40,000,000 had been subscribed in the First Federal Reserve districts.

Treasury officials are now busy to learn whether the Minneapolis-St. Louis district was the first to meet its quota. Both have gone over the mark, the former having exceeded it. It was interesting to say whether the honor of being the first over.

The nation's notice began to beat fast in the big loan drive when it was learned that thousands of the enlisted men of the navy will celebrate Friday of Liberty Day, when the great levies will be made to recruit in garrison and commissary posts. The day will be held at the same hour by American land and sea. At the same time Secretary Daniels' radio was talking to every destroyer and battleship and naval base. Secretary McAdoo telegraphed to the Governors of all states that Liberty Day be set aside as a State holiday as well as a national one.

Reports are arriving from the large cities showing that the great throngs are turning up to the Liberty Loan and encyclopedic demonstrations in New York, Chicago and San Francisco are telling of the golden flood of subscriptions being from "creeds."

It is reported that a huge total in individual subscriptions, and beside demands for honors in the race for first Federal Reserve district to go over the wire, the report reads today a record total of 371,479 individual subscribers, and work has continued unabated energy. St. Louis' quota of \$10,000,000 and the unbroken record of the city has been exceeded, and Indianapolis also has wired that its quota of \$10,000,000 has been subscribed in a sum of \$15,000,000. Kansas City has come third place and subscribed \$1,497 of its quota.

Roma, 23 aprile.

Il sindaco di Torino che ieri l'aveva trattenuito in quella città Mr. H. P. Davison, chairman del Consiglio di guerra della Croce Rossa Americana, oggi, dopo aver inspezionato le stazioni della Croce Rossa Americana ed Italiana, fu ospite del Sindaco che diede in suo onore una collazione alla quale intervennero tutti gli ufficiali della Croce Rossa Americana e il rappresentante politico e militare e le autorità cittadine.

Il sindaco di Torino pronunciò un patriottico discorso durante il quale inneggiò all'amicizia dell'Italia per l'America ed ebbe parole entusiastiche per l'opera che il popolo americano, a mezzo della sua Croce Rossa, compie a proposito delle truppe italiane.

Più tardi, il sindaco di Parigi, Mr. Davison disse che il popolo americano avrebbe fatto soddisfattissimo di sapere che in tutta Italia, tanto tra la popolazione civile, quanto fra i militari, esiste un vero sentimento di fratellanza verso gli Stati Uniti. «L'effetto di questo fraterno sentimento tra i due popoli egli stesso contribuirà a far ragionevole la futura politica ed il benessere del mondo».

Mr. Davison ed il seguito partì direttamente per la via del Centro, poiché la frontiera svizzera è chiusa.

AMERICA LAUNCHES EIGHT SHIPS IN WEEK

Time for Production of Steel
Vessels Reduced to Fifty-five Days

Washington, April 23.

Showing a marked acceleration over the previous week, launching of ships from Government-operated yards for the week ending today aggregated 62,800 tons. This figure includes six steel and two wooden ships. Two ships were placed in service.

Steel ship launchings included: West Mount, West Tampa, Wauwatosa and West Chief, of 8,800 tons each; White Pine, 2,500 tons, and the Plainfield, 2,500 tons. The wooden ships launched were: Calala, 1,000 tons, and Dumaru, 2,500 tons.

The two ships placed in service were cargo carriers of 8,800 tons and 2,500 tons, respectively. The latter is a lake type steamship.

CHAMBERLAIN DROPS COURT-MARTIAL BILL

President's Opposition to Mil-
itary Punishment of Spies
Fatal to Measure

Washington, April 24.

The Chamberlain bill to make the

United States a part of the military
and empowering the military auth-
orities to惩治 spies and disloyalists
is dead.

In response to the instant demands

for an effective, prompt and
decisive legislation, Congress increased

its efficiency in the Department of Justice as a result of bills pending or just passed. These bills include the sabotage bill, the woman spy bill and the new espionage bill. The espionage and woman spy bills were both sent to the President, while the new espionage bill remains to be finally acted upon this week.

Differences between the Senate and

House have been smoothed out on the

espionage bill and although most Sena-

tors are not yet fully pleased with

the Government's failure to check espionage and treason effectively, would not

pass the bill.

Senator Chamberlain let it be known

that he would not attempt to push the

bill in the face of the President's op-

position. Consideration of the bill by

the Military Affairs Committee was

sidetracked and the hearings were indefinitely postponed.

It certain have no desire to push

the bill if the Administration does not

want it, said Senator Chamberlain.

His object in offering it was solely to

provide a more effective means of

stamping out espionage and treason,

and if the Administration does not re-

quest the bill.

Chamberlain broke diplomatic relations

with Germany on April 15, 1917, and the position now taken is apparently intended

to constitute a declaration of war against

Germany and Austria-Hungary, with

whom the United States is now at war.
