PERSHING'S TRENCH SHOTGUN NEW ARM FOR AMERICANS 'OVER THERE'

Will Spray Boches With Buckshot as They Approach U. S. Lines—Has a Neat, Serviceable Bayonet, Too—Many Being Shipped to A. E. F.

See York, April 24

John Mahabattat yesterday came a specimen of a new military arm, latest product of the gunmaking ingenuity of Winchester, which was designed and constructed as the result of the practical idea that if a pellet of 60 buckshot fired from a saved-off shotgun will go through a trench in the soil it will penetrate even the skull of a German soldier.

The new trench gun was first suggested by a general officer with the American expeditionary forces in France—General Pershing himself, it is said—and was perfected by the Winchester Repeating Arms Company engineers, working in conjunction with experts of the Ordnance Department at Washington.

Whether or not General Pershing was the first to suggest the idea of using a modified and new design of trench shotgun on the boches, there is no doubt at all that the new Winchester "trench gun" as it is called, is a popular success with the Black Jack Pershing that he is sending for all of the new trench guns that the Winchester firm can turn out in a hurry.

The new trench gun is, essentially speaking, a comparatively short automatic shotgun of the "pump" variety, capable of sending fifty-four pellets of lead or iron buckshot, each about the size of a .25-caliber bullet, all over the anatomy of an enemy of the Kaiser's six times as fast as could be done by any other repeating rifle.
