According to the management of 12 teel works, one of the workers was scharged Tuesday after losing half his time. Part of the time was lost account of fliness and the other part. is allegred, in order to prevent men from turning out 100 per cent of mod-uct. A few of the workers walked out wednesday, but the full force valued around the discharged man resterday, in-sisting that he be keet on the payroll and weaker full may for the firm inword and receive full pay for the time missed. About two months ago the entire force was out for several days. A sat-hafactory agreement was reached at that time after Major Tulley was detailed an investigation. The strikers have charged that Superintendent Curley did not reserve the paytakees of the entires not respect the provisions of the agree-ment. These provisions, it is nearted, imply an increase of wages and double pay for Sunday work.


