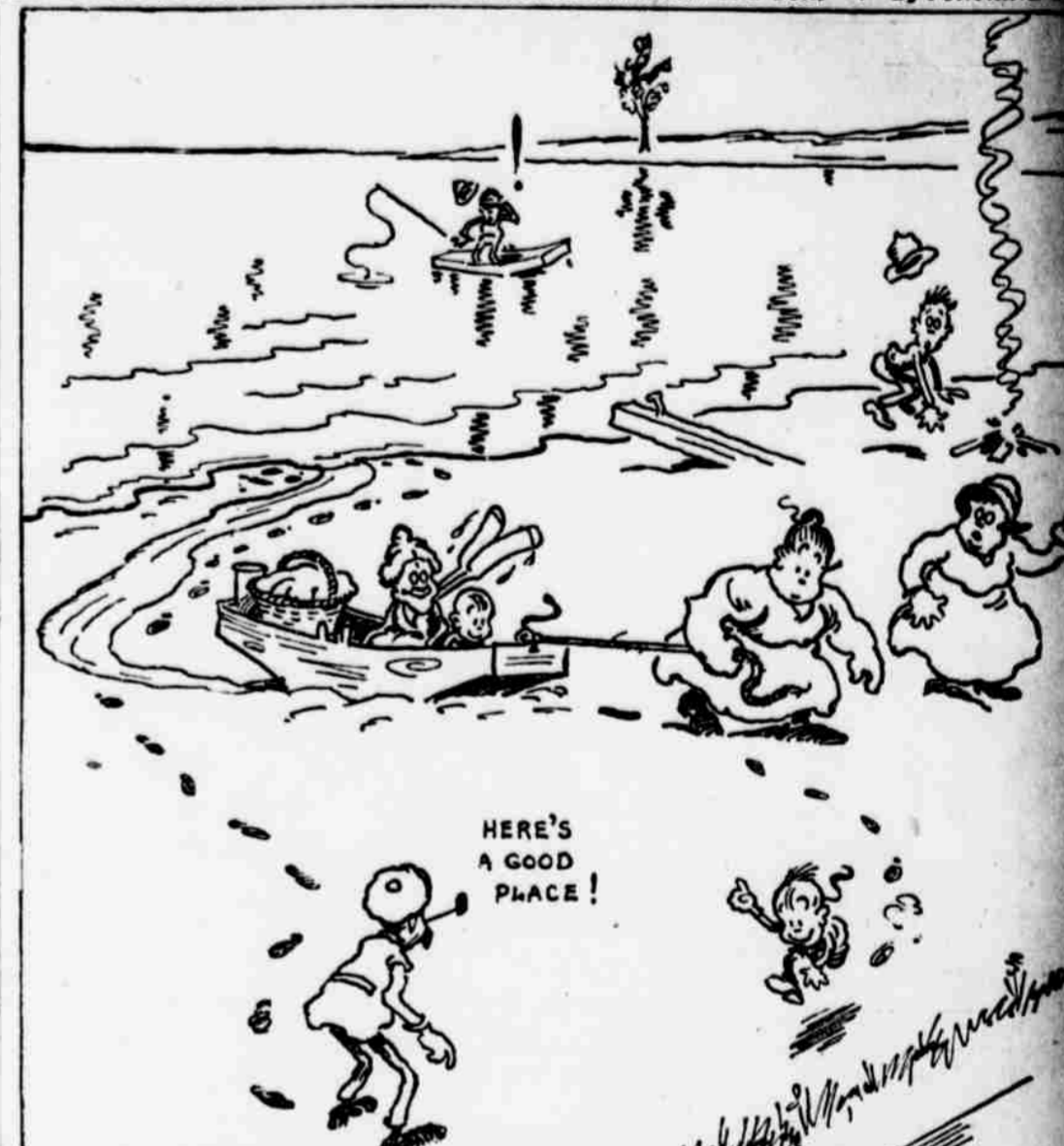
BROAD AN' CHESTNUT

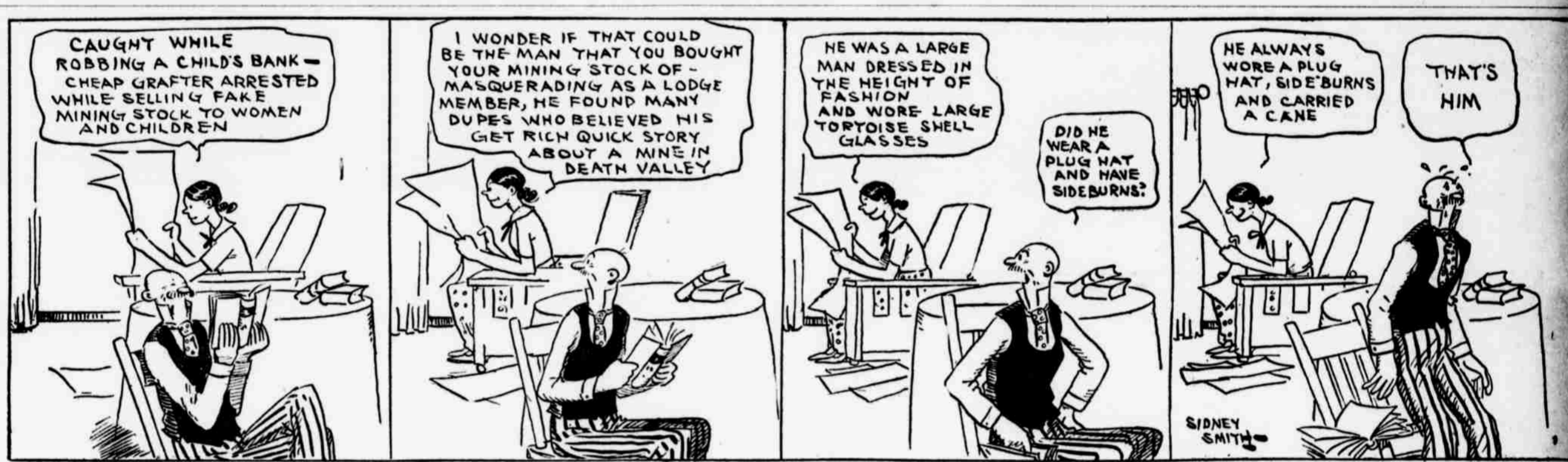

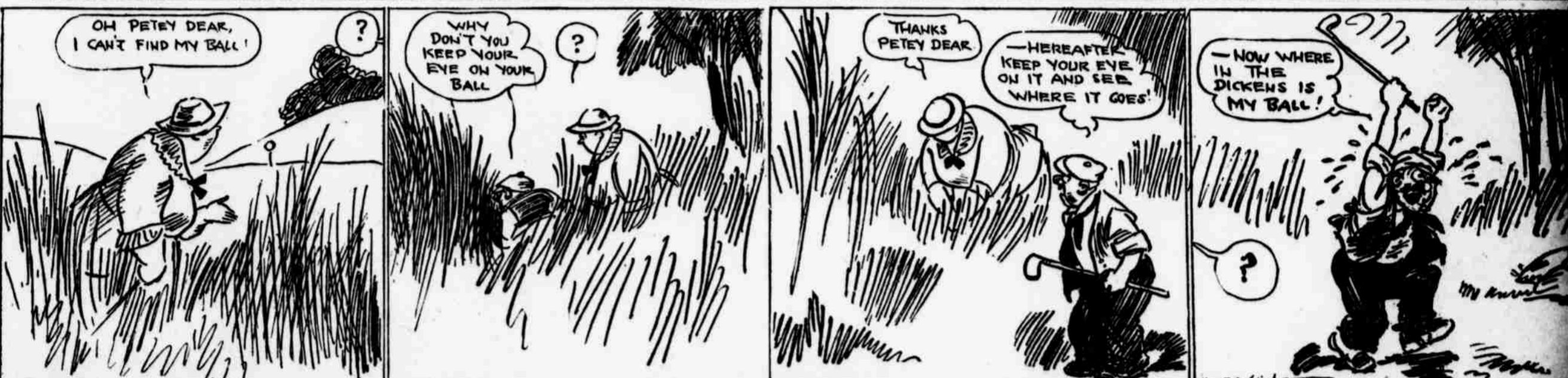


Boy kid we miss you
