Trenten, May 18.—An increase from five to six cents on each fare, and the withdrawal of commutation tickets at twelve for a dollar, was allowed the New Jersey and Pennsylvania Traction Company on its lines in four fare zones between this city and Princeton, by the State Board of Public Utility Commissioners, today. The increase was opposed by municipalities through which the company operates, while protests were filed by patrons of the lines.

The board says that the increase is for the purpose of meeting a deficiency in operating revenue and bond interest, and not for the purpose of declaring dividends, and that the addition of one cent to each fare price and the withdrawal of the tickets will not the company a net revenue of six per cent on the physical value of the property determined by the board in reports previously submitted.
