THE first drive for the War Chest, as the Philadelphia golfers are concerned, will be on Memorial Day. Nearly 200 Philadelphia golfers are now in some branch of the service, and very many of those are in France. In view of this it is particularly appropriate that the day be set aside for War Chest activities. It might be said right here that in all the efforts fostered by the Golf Association of Philadelphia all the money collected from entrance fees and other sources will go into the War Chest. These War Chest tournaments for the Red Cross, smoke fund or other war charities, as in this and neighboring counties, the War Chest has been organized and all the different war charities will benefit through a central organization.

Every man playing that day will be asked to make a contribution to the War Chest. The method will be up to each club. It may be a cent a stroke, a dollar for each entry or any other way each club may select. The money collected will be sent to Mr. Warner, who is also treasurer of the Golf Association. The latter body has reached an agreement with the War Chest officials, whose official title is the war welfare council, whereby such money is invested in war stamps, which will be held until maturity.
