Washington, May 23. Further restrictions on the amount of wheat flour placed in bread loaves are in prospect. Theodore Whitmarsh, of the Federal food administration, in speaking here before a meeting of bakers, said that only third of the normal supply of wheat is available this year to last to August I, and that the bread dealers must adopt more stringent measures to make the

supply last.


