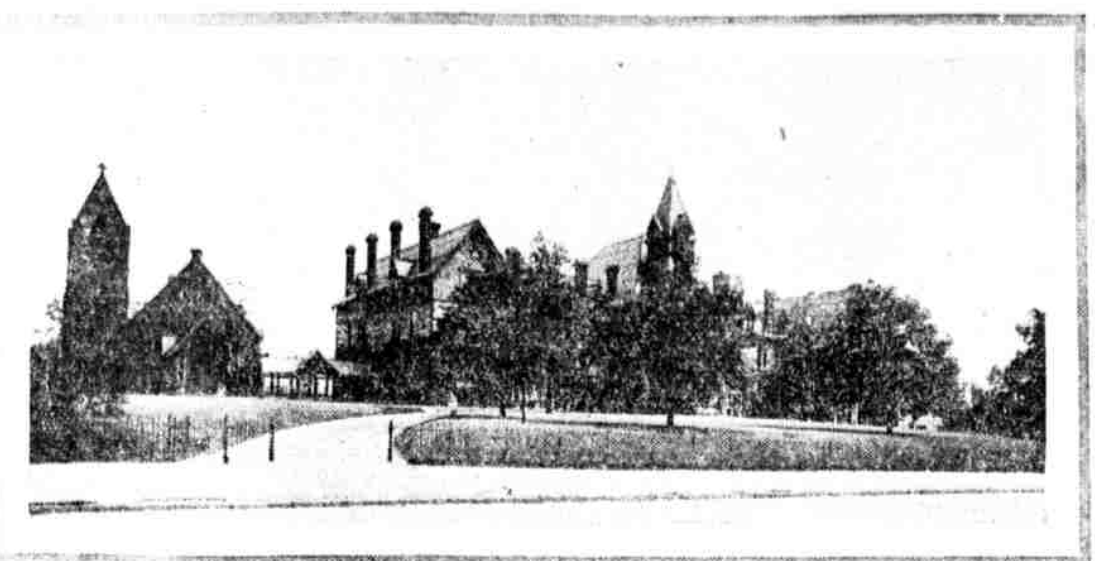

WILSON AND LEADERS TO DISCUSS TAX BILL

Washington, May 22.—Congress today called upon President Wilson to call the conference over whether it should stay in session indefinitely and pass a revenue bill.
