The death of a British merchant steamer when the British ship, the *Moldavia*, was torpedoed in the English Channel Thursday morning was due to the fact that the crew did not obey the rules which require all passenger ships to keep their lights on during the danger zone, according to the British naval authorities.

This was revealed in an official report on the disaster.
