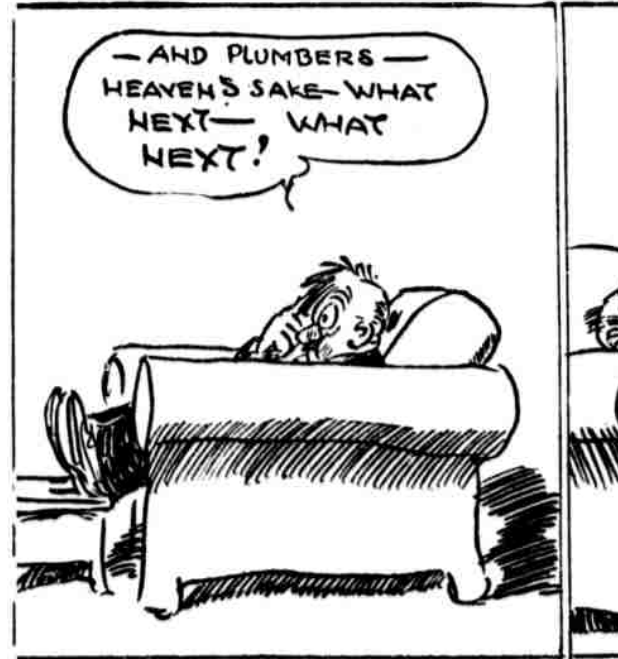


The young lady across the way says the crimes committed by the Germans in this war are no new thing for them, and it will be remembered that they were so bad once before that it went down into history as the Crimean War.
